

## BEING A PART OF YOUR VILLAGE CHURCH

I continue to rejoice in the health of our Village Church. So many people are involved, we are blessed with many resources. But wouldn't it be great to have more?

The following table shows at least three ways for you to be involved in our Church, with the current numbers of people:-

*Join the Church Electoral Roll	Numbers now 208 people
*Volunteer	Well over 100 people
*Come to worship	158 adults & children attend services in Westcott at least monthly

All of this support means we can be involved in many ways in the village and beyond, making a difference (such support is also a key determinant of Westcott having a full-time vicar – i.e. we are not combined with another parish).

How about it, then? How about getting involved in one, two or even better all three of these ways:

\*Church Electoral Roll. Beina on the Roll means we can know and support you better e.g. I pray extensively for the people of Westcott, but regularly, by name, those on the Roll. To join, you have to be baptised ('christened'), and live in Westcott or come to services regularly in Westcott. This year we have to start the Roll all over again (the Church of England requires this every six years). Please, then, complete and return an 'Electoral Roll' form - copies are available in Holy Trinity and St Johns, or can be obtained from Sarah, Administrator sarah@holvtrinitvwestcott.ora.uk.

\*Volunteer. There are so many ways to be involved in our Church, so many skills are needed. Please see the list of opportunities that follows this article for more information.

We all benefit from the work of our volunteers – directly and indirectly by helping to build a better community.

\*Worship. Over a month, we provide a whole range of worship, from traditional prayer book ('BCP') to contemporary (e.g. 'Encounter'). Everyone who wants to should be able to find a service that "fits". If

#### EARTH HOUR

On Saturday, 30th March at 8.30pm some of the world's biggest landmarks – including Buckingham Palace,



the Eiffel Tower and Sydney Opera House - will turn off their lights to mark Earth Hour.

Earth Hour is an annual event, created by the World Wildlife Fund, and is marked by hundreds of millions

of people around the world to show their commitment to protecting the planet.

The idea is to switch off for an hour – switch off your lights, the television/radio, and

from other distractions, and be part of the change you want to see in the world.

#### **WWF's EARTH HOUR**

'We are the first generation to know we are destroying the world. And we could be the last that can do anything about it. We have the solutions, we just need our voices to be heard'.

Climate change is causing one in six species to be at risk of extinction. Our food is responsible for the loss of almost 60% of global biodiversity. Loss of habitats and increased use of pesticides and fertilizers are contributing to species extinction. A huge reported decline in the number of insects threatens

food supply (they pollinate 35% of plant crops) and health (they help to clear rotten wood and carcasses).

#### **ECO TIPS**

**Keep your garden pesticide free.** The widespread use of pesticides has an adverse effect on wildlife and biodiversity. There are alternative ways to keep unwanted visitors under control – use companion planting or encourage natural predators. Search 'organic pest control' on the RSPB website www. rspb.org.uk

**Choose palm oil free products.** Palm oil production destroys rainforests and biodiversity, as vast areas of land are cleared for planting. Orangutans are now at serious risk of extinction as 80% of their habitat has been destroyed in 20 years. Palm



oil is found in around half of supermarket products, due to its useful properties and cheap cost. www.ethicalconsumer.org/palm-oil-free-list

Plant for wildlife in your garden or in a container. Plants like lavender, honeysuckle and verbena attract bees and other pollinators. For other simple ways to help wildlife visit www.surreywildlifetrust. ora/actions.

#### Slow Cooked Pomegranate Ox Cheeks

2 ox cheeks, cut in half

100g plain flour

Freshly ground salt and pepper

1 onion

1 carrot

1 stick of celery

2 bay leaves

1 knob of butter

1 large glass of red wine

1.5 cups pomegranate juice

1 tbsp pomegranate molasses

Large glug of extra virgin olive oil

#### Method (Serves 2)

- Pat the ox cheeks dry with kitchen paper, then season with freshly ground salt and black pepper.
- Toss the cheeks in plain flour, then lightly sear in a pan with a glug of oil, on both sides until nicely browned, then remove from the pan.
- 3. Finely dice the onion, carrot and celery and sauté in a knob of butter on a medium heat for 6-7 minutes.
- 4. Place the onion, carrot and celery mixture and with the bay leaves into a slow cooker on a medium heat setting, followed by the ox cheeks, pomegranate juice, molasses and red wine.
- 5. Cook for six hours. (If cooking in an oven, cook at 150 degrees C for 4-5 hours)
- When ready, remove the ox cheeks from the slow cooker/oven, and loosely cover with foil to keep warm.
- Discard the bay leaves and transfer the liquid into a saucepan, bring to the boil and allow to reduce until it is syrupy. Stir regularly.
- Serve the ox cheeks with butternut squash mash and the reduced sauce drizzled on top, finished with some fresh pomegranate seeds.

#### WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP



#### The Royal Observatory at Abinger.

On Tuesday 8th January Ian Rogers gave us an insight into how the Observatory came to be established in Abinger in 1924, and how it operated there until 1957 when it split up, with the Greenwich Time Service moving to Herstmonceaux in Sussex and the Magnetic Measurements Section moving to Hartland in Devon.

It consisted of a number of small buildings located on a piece of land a short distance North West of Leith Hill Tower, selected because of its average safe distance of about 3 miles from any electrified railway lines. It had been originally established in Greenwich in 1817 by the Royal Astronomer to assist the Royal Navy for their navigational measurements, but by 1920 the advent of electrified railways using DC current in the Greenwich area (the first in England) caused interference in the magnetic measurements and it was necessary to find an alternative location where this would not be a problem. A wooded site of some 8 acres adjoining Sheephouse Lane on the South Fast corner was selected on land belonging to the Evelyn Estate. By coincidence John Evelyn had been a friend of John Flamsteed, the first Royal Astronomer, when they both lived in Greenwich in the early 1700's.

Numbered boundary stones marked with the Admiralty 'anchor' icon were set up at each corner of the property and can still be found today beside the paths leading to Leith Hill Tower. Buildings in the centre of the site



completed in August 1924 were specially designed for the temperature control required for the magnetic measurements and the magnetograph recording instruments. These buildings were placed 370 ft from the generator power plant building to avoid magnetic interference.

There were continuing problems with Lady Lugard, the owner of the neighbouring property (Little Parkhurst) and wife of Lord Lugard (Governor of Hong Kong 1907-12 and of Nigeria 1914-19) who complained of the generator noise and vibration. But during exhaustive 'listening tests by a panel' she claimed to be able to hear the generators even when they were not running! Initially there were some seven staff to maintain the site and operate the instruments - who lived on site or lodged in Holmbury St Mary, but by 1948 the staff numbers had risen

to over 20 and they stayed at a big house called Feldemore, which burnt down in 1990 but is now Belmont School.

The pendulum clocks of the Time Department in this establishment provided British radio time signals up until 1949 when quartz clocks were introduced, after many years of testing.

These signals were transmitted to London and Greenwich and provided the familiar BBC 'pips'. The 'Time' transmitted from Greenwich is vital for a ship's navigation to find their longitude at noon when the sun reaches its zenith, and navigators used their quadrants; and later on, sextants; to measure the angle between the horizon and the sun to determine their position in latitude and longitude - every hour of difference between the ship's clock from GMT represents 15 degrees of longitude. Nowadays this method has

been replaced by 'SatNav' but it was an invaluable technique for mariners when it was introduced in the late 18th century with the invention of a seagoing chronometer (by John Harrison). This department also monitors the time signals from America, Russia and France for comparison.

magnetic purpose of the observatory was to measure and record changes in the earth's magnetic field in order to know the variation between True North and Magnetic North. The magnetic north tends to drift westwards, caused by physical changes within the earth and sun activity. Every mariners' ocean chart has a compass rose on it which shows the number of degrees of magnetic variation from True North at a certain date, and the annual publication of the navigators' Nautical Almanac provides an updated measurement.

Ian Rogers lives in one of the houses in the vicinity of the old Observatory of Abinger and has taken an interest in its heritage during the years from 1924 when it was built. The brick buildings and the house of the Station Supervisor have all been sold years ago.

Our next meeting will be on Tuesday 12th March at the usual time. The lecture will be 'Broadmoor & Lonesome Valley' given by Robin Daly.




please remember to take a look and follow us on-line to get the latest village news straight in to your newsfeed.

#### Logmore Lane verge by Holy Trinity

You will not have failed to notice the work which has been done on the bank below the church to clear the mat of brambles, ferns, saplings and birch trees which have invaded what once – in the early 1900's – was open common, and which allowed a great view of the church. We are grateful to the Evelyn Estate for the work they have done and which the Church and the Village Association have now agreed to maintain.

However, you will also notice that there is a bit more work which needs

to be done in order to be able to maintain the land easily. More work is planned which Hugh Broom has generously offered to lead, but this will involve digging out the old tree stumps, raking up as much of the bracken and brambles as we can, contouring the land a little more, and reseeding with meadow grass. This means that the bank will probably look a bit battered first before, hopefully as spring arrives, it becomes green and inviting as it once was over 100 years ago.

stage of consultation around 24th June; this will last for 6 weeks.

The WVA has made an early request for Guy Davies to attend an open meeting during July or August which will need to be organised in addition to the scheduled open meetings we have announced. We will keep you informed of progress and any information which is being released by the Planning team. These Mole Valley RA meetings are very interesting to attend because throughout the District we are all facing the same issues, and trying to make difficult and often conflicted decisions, about the future of house building, the lack of new infrastructure, and how this is paid for.

There are no simple answers and, as I have said before, not everyone will like the outcome – but discussing things openly and constructively helps.



#### THE PEACE GARDEN PROJECT @ ST JOHN'S

The Vision of The Peace Garden Project @ St John's was launched in November 2018 at a small Remembrance Service. It has been set up to commemorate and celebrate two major events:-

- 100 years since end of 1st World War
- 60 Years that the Surrey Hills has been an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty

Over the next 3-5 years, the trees, hedging and vegetation will be trimmed, ground will be tended and together with some additional planting, will be upgraded to make it easier to manage as well as safer and more welcoming for visitors. Some seating and improved access is being planned to make this space a place of peace and reflection for our village community and be more interesting and sustainable for wildlife. (We have already installed a number of well stocked bird feeders!)

Thanks to two grants received end 2018\* visitors will notice that initial tree surgery and debris clearance took place thanks to Damien Kidd's team of two village residents from The Tree Associates who braved the December cold just before Christmas.



Plans are already underway to install some bespoke seating by Landbarn Carpenters for the late Spring/early Summer after which we hope to have an 'open day' later in the year. To supplement the funding received, which is a great start but will not cover all we would like to do, we are looking to invite any village

groups to be involved or support in some way and are delighted that the St John's Monday Café have already started a fund!

There are a number of historic graves with locally recognisable names (including a Mr Balchin) located here which would be fascinating to learn more about, not least the Commonwealth War Grave of F.C Barnes whose post war career was in gardening we recently discovered – very appropriate!

There is plenty of scope for experienced gardeners to get involved or for village groups to 'adopt' one of the zones, and more will be shared in the coming months via the village magazine or approaching individual village groups. We will be holding a number of working party days between April and October 2019 so if you are interested, please do contact Judith Packer or Tony Astor in the first instance – contact details on the back of the magazine.

fix your computer. Fraudsters make these phone calls to try to steal from you and damage your computer with malware. Treat all unsolicited phone calls with scepticism and don't give out any personal information.

Computer firms tend not to send unsolicited out communication about security updates, although they do send security software updates to subscribers of the security communications program. If in doubt, don't open the email.

Microsoft does not request credit card information to validate copies of Windows. Microsoft does validate requests to download software from its website via its 'Genuine Advantage Program', but never asks for any personally identifying information, including credit card details. The 'Microsoft Lottery' does not exist -so it's not true if you're told you've won.



- High blood pressure one in four adults have high blood pressure. Reducing your blood pressure can reduce your risk of heart attack or stroke by 20%.
- Poor diet having more than five portions of fruit and vegetables a day can lower your risk of heart attack or stroke by 20%.

#### Windsor Castle 22nd January

A beautiful morning with glorious blue skies saw us on our way to Windsor where we met with our expert guide Barbara. After a coffee stop we watched the Changing of the Guard and then headed for the castle. Windsor castle was built by the Normans in the 11th century and is the longest occupied palace in the world.

After going through strict security we took our very informative walk in the castle grounds. There are two building complexes separated by the Round Tower, which is built on an artificial mound and now houses all the castle archives, and was built by Henry II.

The upper ward houses the private apartments for the monarch and state visitors. The state apartments include:

1. St. Georges chapel - gothic architecture containing the royal mausoleum of Henry VIII and Jane Seymour and others.

2. Grand reception room

- 3. Royal library
- 4. Albert memorial built by Henry VII as a royal Mausoleum

A catastrophic fire in 1992 destroyed the north east corner of this magnificent building but fortunately most paintings, furniture, and treasures were saved. Restoration was completed in 1997 to be as authentic as possible and it is beautifully done.

There was just so much to see and we were provided with audio guides which were very helpful, as there are so many interesting tombs, vaults and chapels. An extra available to see at the time was the display of the wedding dress of the Duchess of Sussex - what a beautiful gown! As we left the chapel we could view the Albert memorial built by Henry VII as a royal Mausoleum.

We rejoined the coach and enjoyed a fascinating drive around the park with lovely views of the castle from the Long Walk. The mausoleum of Victoria and Albert is in this park. From here we drove to the Windsor farm shop and café where some had tea and some bought lovely foodie gifts!

By this time the beautiful blue skies and sunny day had disappeared and it was snowing, so we happily rejoined our warm coach and headed home after a most enjoyable day.

## DORKING MUSEUM



Dorking Museum would like to thank one recent (anonymous) visitor who left this comment: "This museum, with its fascinating subject-matter and very high standard of display, is one of the best museums I have ever visited. It reveals very successfully the heart and character of Dorking and its place in history."

Perhaps one of the many fascinating items they saw on display was a crossshaped framework on which are

suspended three brightly painted footballs. This recalls the famous Shrove Tuesday football matches which became a fixture of Dorking's year in the 19th century. Festivities began

with a procession through the town led by a 'grotesquely dressed' band and fronted by a man carrying this standard, which carries the inscription, "Kick away both Whig and Tory, Wind and water Dorking's glory". The original football standard displayed (with replica footballs) is probably the only remaining standard in Surrey.



The football game kicked off at 2pm at the gates of St Martin's and continued through the streets of Dorking until 6pm, when festivities continued in 'The Sun' and other public houses. Large numbers participated in the game and thousands more watched – shopkeepers barricaded their premises to limit damage. After complaints from traders, the game was banned by the County Council in 1897, although it continued for a few more years, finally being declared extinct in 1907.

Maybe not football this Shrove Tuesday but this is a good time of year to consider one of the **Museum's programme of Guided Walks and Tours.**

views and exclusive entry to the grade II\* listed Hope family mausoleum.

All walks are open for group bookings at a time to suit you, and there are regular Open Days for individual bookings. In March, these will include:

**Sunday 10th March**, Deepdene Trail Walk, 2pm from the Trail entrance.

**Saturday 16th March**, Hidden Dorking Historic walk, 3pm from the Museum;

**Saturday 23rd March**, Town Centre pub walk, 11am from outside the Surrey Yeoman on the High Street.

March also sees the Spring re-opening of our very popular tours of the famous South Street Caves. Take a trip under the streets of Dorking to explore the famous 17th century caves. Discover how they were created, how they evolved over the centuries and check out the 'mystery chamber'. The first Open Day is on March 30th, with tours at 10am, 11am, 1pm, 2pm.

Our current exhibition, 'Lord Ashcombe's Minerals – the gentlemen collectors and the advance of science', showcases the history of and examples from Lord Ashcombe's stunning mineral collection. These were amassed in the



19th century by George Cubitt, the first Lord Ashcombe, and displayed at his Denbies home. The collection was donated to Dorking Museum in 1948 by the 3rd Baron Ashcombe.

Although Ashcombe's fossil collection is a regular visitor favourite at the Museum, his mineral collection has not been on regular display, so the exhibition provides a rare opportunity to view. The large collection of quartz crystals – some of the pieces up to 20kg in weight – were collected from around the UK and overseas.

Although Cubitt displayed these

dazzling minerals in glass-fronted cases at Denbies for the enjoyment of his family, friends and visitors, they also had real value for historical and research purposes. The exhibition tells how Lord Ashcombe's collection and those of other gentlemen collectors played an important role in an age of amateur science, in the development of the study of geology and palaeontology and the scientific understanding of the earth's history.

# THE PAST IS A FOREIGN COUNTRY; THEY DO THINGS DIFFERENTLY THERE

The 'past' might simply refer to days gone by, but on this occasion it relates to a specific date; the night of 24/25 February 1944. People living in Westcott at the time will remember it because a Dornier 217 Bomber (pictured), with a crew of four and a bomb load that included three 500kg bombs (thousand pounders)



and four smaller incendiary bombs, was shot down and crashed in a Parsonage Lane garden. The story was recounted in the Local History Group's Annual Report 2001, revealing what happened to the plane, its crew and bombload; and the Group's HQ in the Reading Room contains some of the many souvenirs that local people collected from the site.



it - they keep coming back' said Kelly.

'Where do your residents come from are they all from the village?' I asked. 'No, not really', said Lesley, 'we have some coming from the village of course, because it means they stay among their friends, and from Dorking, but sometimes they may have come from further away, but their families live nearby, so it's easy for them to visit and we are often full of family visitors.'

'And what about independence - for example can people bring their cars, if they come to live here?'

Kelly responded that each resident is different-they have a guest who arrived bed-ridden and is now walking about and almost ready to go home. They also have someone due to arrive in a couple of weeks who is bringing her car with her. She lives alone and just wants to have with some company in her



life. 'People come here for all sorts of reasons, and sometimes thev don't come alone. We have had couples living here very happily who simply found for caring

themselves too much to manage by themselves.'

'So what would you say makes Bramley House different from other residential homes?' I queried. Lesley said, 'We are so small, it's all very personal here. For example, with meals, we know what people really enjoy, and we can literally cater for individual tastes.

It's quite social if people want to be social, but if they want to spend time on their own, they can, we've plenty of room. It's their home and we want them to love being here.'



'We Kelly says, have great а connection with Westcott church. and Alan, Winnie, Margaret and Geoff are regular visitors; the children from the school came and sang to us at the December village coffee morning, and we'd like to connect more with them. 

#### **Badger in the Wood**

The wooded parts of the downs are a haven for badgers and we have a number of setts on our property. Setts are the underground homes where badgers live. The larger setts can extend from 20 to 100 metres or more, with some of the largest having more than 50 entrances!

Such elaborate setts can take many years to create and are passed down through generations – some setts can be more than 100 years old. These are the family homes, used, maintained and enlarged at will by generations of the same social group.



Badger cubs will only be around 2-3 weeks old, but later on in May cubs will be starting to emerge cautiously from their underground homes. From being pink, blind and helpless at birth

with thin coats of silver hair and faint black stripes on the face, they grow to be active, playful little badgers by the time they emerge so the layout and scents of their home become firmly fixed in their senses.

A badger's sense of smell is a particularly important sense as it plays a vital role in communication. Badgers have several scent glands which produce a variety of odours, used for distributing information like warning signals and mating status.

Scents produced are also used to tighten bonds between social groups, with studies suggesting that clan members have similar scents. Badgers also deposit scents in their faeces and will typically defecate in shallow dug pits known as latrines, which are found on territorial boundaries.

Badgers distribute their scent information through techniques known as squat marking (dipping their rear and lifting their tails) and allo-marking (marking each other).

#### Other Badger Facts

Badgers are protected in Britain by the Protection of Badgers Act 1992. The purpose of this Act is to protect the animals from deliberate cruelty and from the incidental effects of

lawful activities which could cause them harm.

Badgers are closely related to otters, stoats, weasels, polecats and pine martens; they are all in the Mustelid family.

An adult can grow up to 36" long and usually weighs from 22 to 27 lbs.

Badger prints are broader than they are long, with five toes and five long, non-retractable powerful claws that they use for digging.

Badgers are omnivorous and will eat a wide variety of foods, although their main diet consists of earthworms, up to 200 per day.

Badgers are less active during winter months but they do not hibernate.

The mating process involves "delayed

implantation". Although females are able to mate any time after the cubs are born the fertilised egg does not implant in the uterus until December.

Badgers have been living side by side with hedgehogs for centuries but will occasionally prey on them if their main food sources of worms and grubs are not abundant. Hedgehogs are currently undergoing a sharp decline in rural habitats and unfairly, badgers are often blamed. A recent report on hedgehog declines, owed the reduction of rural hedgehogs to mainly habitat loss, through the intensification of agriculture and fewer hedgerows.

#### Spring is a Marching

I just love this time of year. After a long winter, spring is finally on its way. Warmth can be felt in the sun and life is returning to the hillside.

I cycle to work regularly, using the Sustrans route 22 from Dorking to Westcott. It's so nice to be able to ride through the countryside and not on the traffic laden main roads. When daylight fills my commute and the dawn chorus is ramping up in volume, I relish in the knowledge that spring is coming.

On my way through the farm near Milton Court, it's a joy to see the first

lambs merrily bouncing and bleating away. Hibernating butterflies such as the beautiful butter-yellow Brimstone have woken up and can be seen basking in the warm sun. Snowdrops brighten up our woods with their delicate nodding white flowers, soon to be followed by the explosion of blue from our iconic woodland flower, the bluebell.

March is the turning point between winter and spring; the sap will be rising and the first of the buds will be bursting, flowers will be shining and frogs will be spawning.

Coming soon! Lady's Smock

Durina the sprina, water meadows and swampy or damp places are bathed in the lilac shade of lady's smock (or cuckoo flower). I get great joy in seeing these delightful little appearing plants around the pond at Landbarn Farm. At night and during damp weather the flowers hang down to prevent rain water from diluting their rich nectar supplies.

The plant is propagated by seed dispersal; an eruption caused by the splitting of its ripe pods scatters seeds several feet away from the roots of the parental plant.

The common name 'Lady's-smock' arises from the cupped shape of the flowers. However, 'smock' was once a slang term for a woman and the name may have alluded to certain springtime activities in the meadows!
