WAITING FOR THE RESURRECTION...

...IT'S HERE NOW

Oh how we miss them ... those we have loved who are no more, those we have shared our lives with, now gone. This year it is Godfrey, Godfrey Parry-Jones, "GPJ", our friend and church minister, who died

just two weeks short of his 62nd birthday after seven years of disabling illness. Last year it was my Dad. 19th February 2018 he died. A great, long life – 97 years, still playing golf until he was 90.


Death seems so random. Only the grief is constant. Sometimes the pain can threaten to overwhelm us; I think especially of the staggeringly numerous people in our village who have suffered the death of a child, albeit children that have reached adulthood. Grief comes in waves of

intensity, sometimes in gut-wrenching, uncontrollable sobbing, sometimes in an unconscious niggling, on-going irritability. Different force but the same root anguish – simply, we miss them.

Of course they live on – in the influence they have had. So much of who I am (and my brother and sister) has been shaped by my Dad, and so through the generations – he was delighted to see the arrival of his great-grandchildren, both in his last year. But this is not enough. I miss my

Dad, I miss Godfrey, as we miss all who we have loved, and death seems so final. I need the comfort, hope, that there is Resurrection to come.

I don't need to know exactly what the "next life" will be like, it's simply enough to believe it will be glorious - "no eye has seen, no ear has heard, and no human mind has conceived, the thinas God has prepared for those who love him" (1 Cor 2:9). Some scoff, claiming "life after death" is a fabrication, formed to make us feel better. Well, let them believe... let them believe that my Dad, Godfrey and all those we have loved, are just mere molecules that are lost into the dust of the universe... that is their faith. My faith tells me that these people are far too precious for that to be the case. My faith tells me that our preciousness is rooted



in our Creator, who "so loved us He gave His only Son that that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16). My faith tells me that there will be a Day of Resurrection, where "God will wipe every tear from our eyes and there will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain" (Rev 21:4)... and all things will be complete with my Dad, with Godfrey, with all whom we love. Yes, this is faith... waiting for the Resurrection, Faith in Christ, Faith that the events of the first Faster are true. It is faith in historical things... but it is also faith formed in experience; the experience of praying with my Dad as he was dying, the experience of him coming to faith in Christ c. 18 months before he died. It is the faith that shone throughout Godfrey

even in his years of severe disability. In the experience of God now, come multiple "mini-resurrections", foretelling of the full, glorious Resurrection to come.

In his recent new found faith, my Dad sang hymns at home, including "Thine be the glory". In facing grief, in holding to the hope of Resurrection, in the "mini-resurrections" that come in the daily experience of the presence of God, these are apt words to finish....

Thine be the glory!
risen, conquering Son:
Endless is the victory thou o'er death
hast won.

A very Happy Easter to you all



WESTCOTT WOMEN'S GROUP



I wonder how many readers of the Westcott mag know who or what a High Sheriff is? Isn't he that guy in a black velvet coat with lace cuffs, wears a sword and carries a folded tricolor hat? Actually it's a chapeau-bras, or arm hat, and yes, he is, although a female High Sheriff can wear a long velvet dark coloured dress, also with long sleeves and lace cuffs, and she wears exotic ostrich feather plumage. Oh, she doesn't carry a sword, that's carried on a cushion by her pageboy.



More respect please, the High Sheriffs hold the highest offices in the country next to the Queen, and the post is at least 1000 years old. In Saxon times, he was responsible for collecting the taxes, (this could bankrupt the High Sheriff of a poor county as he would still be expected to produce the revenues that the more affluent counties could) nowadays the role is more of that of a mediator; one who supports those people working in upholding law and order, from judges, and police down to probation officers and prison wardens.

He meets with thousands of volunteers

working for various charities, and his prime focus this year has been on the permanent exclusion of pupils from school, whether they have been at primary, secondary or even nursery school, getting to the reasons of why there has been exclusion, and seeking the help needed to prevent this happening.

That is just a scratching of the fascinating and amusing talk from Jim Glover about his year as High Sheriff of Surrey, and he hopes to continue his work in school exclusion when he "retires"! Thank you Jim for coming to talk to us, 36 of our members and friends came away from last evening's meeting a lot more informed than when we went.

Next month, on April 3rd, our local and very popular Jazz musician, Ralph Sutton is coming to entertain us with his anecdotes, and hopefully some accompanying music! You do not have to be a member to come to our meetings, all are welcome.

Slow Cooked Pomegranate Ox Cheeks

2 ox cheeks, cut in half

100g plain flour

Freshly ground salt and pepper

1 onion

1 carrot

1 stick of celery

2 bay leaves

1 knob of butter

1 large glass of red wine

1.5 cups pomegranate juice

1 tbsp pomegranate molasses

Large glug of extra virgin olive oil

Method (Serves 2)

- Pat the ox cheeks dry with kitchen paper, then season with freshly ground salt and black pepper.
- Toss the cheeks in plain flour, then lightly sear in a pan with a glug of oil, on both sides until nicely browned, then remove from the pan.
- 3. Finely dice the onion, carrot and celery and sauté in a knob of butter on a medium heat for 6-7 minutes.
- 4. Place the onion, carrot and celery mixture and with the bay leaves into a slow cooker on a medium heat setting, followed by the ox cheeks, pomegranate juice, molasses and red wine.
- 5. Cook for six hours. (If cooking in an oven, cook at 150 degrees C for 4-5 hours)
- When ready, remove the ox cheeks from the slow cooker/oven, and loosely cover with foil to keep warm.
- Discard the bay leaves and transfer the liquid into a saucepan, bring to the boil and allow to reduce until it is syrupy. Stir regularly.
- Serve the ox cheeks with butternut squash mash and the reduced sauce drizzled on top, finished with some fresh pomegranate seeds.

WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP



Personalities in Westcott History: Daniel Malthus of 'The Rookery'.

The Rookery Estate has a long history starting in the 17thC when it belonged to the Comber family. They sold it to Abraham Tucker of Betchworth Castle, who in 1759 sold it to Daniel Malthus who named it 'The Rookery' and developed it from its former use as a fishing and game lodge. The Pipp Brook flows through the estate and provides the water for the mill pond. It is said that the trout ova were specially imported from Lake Geneva and it also has roach, tench and perch popular with the angling fraternity. The original Estate was known as Chertgate and comprised some 650 acres including all the land westward of Loamore Lane and Westcott Street up to the edge of the Parish.

Daniel Malthus (1730 – 1800) was a man of considerable inherited wealth and had been to Queens College, Oxford. He pursued literary and scientific interests and was a friend of Jean-Jacques Rousseau, the French author. He married Harriet Graham, the daughter of Daniel Graham, apothecary to George II and III. She appears as a young girl in Hogarth's painting The Graham Children in the National Gallery, London. They had six children - 2 sons, Sydenham born in Albury and Thomas Robert born in Westcott - and 4 daughters: Henrietta, Charlotte, Elizabeth Maria and Anne Catherine.

Thomas Robert Malthus His son (1766 - 1834) went to Jesus College, Cambridge where he studied political economics for an MA which he achieved in 1791 and was elected a In 1798 he Fellow two years later. published a controversial pamphlet on the 'Principal of Population' which received much public criticism, mainly from the editor of The Scotsman newspaper, John Ramsey McCulloch who accused him of criticising fellow economists. In this pamphlet he

asserted that "there was a propensity to utilize abundance (of harvests) for population growth rather than for maintaining a higher standard of living". He published six editions of it between 1798 and 1826 updating his material and responding to his critics, but his idea was never accepted.





WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP (cont.)



He took holy orders in 1791 aged 25 and became a Curate at Okewood Chapel in Surrey but continued to publish his pamphlets on socio/economic subjects. In 1805 he became Professor of History & Economics at the East India College, Hertfordshire where officers of the East India Company were trained in administration and languages for service in India and the Far East. He was known by the students as 'Pop' from his infamous pamphlet. The college closed in 1858 and later became the school Haileybury & United Service College as nowadays.

In March 1804 Thomas Robert married Harriet Eckershall. They had two daughters, Emily and Lucille and a son named Henry who became Vicar of Effingham in 1835 moving to Donington in 1837. In December 1834 Thomas Malthus died in Bath aged 67 of heart problems while staying with his in-laws.

The Rookery was sold in 1768 to Richard Fuller (1713-1782) whose family and heirs continued to live there for 126 years until 1894.

There is no lecture meeting in April but there will be the Good Friday Walk as usual.



WVA Open Meeting

In the coming year there are some very important matters, which the WVA wants to involve all residents in. These are best dealt with at the WVA Open meetings – they are your opportunity to shape the future of the village.

Around 50 people attended the last Open Meeting on 21st February – which was perhaps less than we were hoping for, given the importance of the subjects on the agenda. You can read more on this in the minutes of the Open Meeting which you will find on the WVA website. The next Open Meeting is planned for Thursday 9th May and will again be in Holy Trinity Church starting at 7.30pm – so please put this in the diary now and make every effort to attend and have your say.



WVA Draft New Constitution

There were some very useful comments and suggestions on the draft Constitution, which were taken into consideration in the final version of the document.

Consultation ended on 16th March



and the document is now in the final stages of approval by the WVA committee before being sent to the Charity Commission for their comments and approval. Once we have this, we will be arranging an Extraordinary General Meeting to put the new constitution to a village vote.

Your Village Association needs you

There are still two vacant seats on the WVA committee and interestingly we have had a number of people approach us about joining the committee – more in fact than there are places to fill. Rather than make appointments, as we did in the past, we would like to hold elections to the committee so that existing members and prospective new appointments all subject themselves to election.

based facilities including café, support services like CAB, Help the Aged etc, a Youth Club, and community internet facilities for those who do not have these at home, as well as an event hire venue.

- Six residential units each with two dedicated parking spaces.
- 16 further parking spaces for the use of the Surgery and Community centre

The Hut Development

There has been a lot happening behind the scenes and it would be fair to say that the scheme, first proposed in early October 2017, has been complicated, fraught with difficulties and changed building configurations. As a result it has taken a long time, despite the strenuous best efforts of the Hut Trustees.

The latest iteration of the plan is to provide on the current Hut site:

- A stand-alone doctor's surgery and dispensing chemist facility of 278sqm servicing up to 4,000 patients

 a stipulation by NHS England to future proof the facility which includes the current Riverbank Surgery patient list.
- A community centre of 160sqm providing a range of community-



Once detailed plan drawings have been finalised then the Hut Trustees will hold an AGM (open to every resident in the village) to give the authority to proceed, apply for all the necessary approvals including seeking planning permission, and then move hopefully to start works by the Autumn.

At the AGM the Hut Trustees will be looking for new members to join the committee and help develop the services at the new community

The free "In Case of Emergency document" enables you to have all the key information for your household in one place. Remember to keep it somewhere easily accessible - both on your smartphone and a hard copy.



Alongside all this, family members or carers, on behalf of older, disabled or vulnerable people, can sign up for the Priority Services Register.

This provides a direct way for people to communicate with utility suppliers in the event of an emergency – making sure vulnerable people don't go cold or without food for example.

Dog Attacks and Sheep Worrying

I'm conscious that last month I included an item on dog-on-dog attacks where advice may be sought

from Mole Valley's animal warden on 01306 885001, or by emailing env. health@molevalley.gov.uk.

At the end of February (a long time after the last article was written), we had reports of an attack by a dog on a sheep. Thankfully, the sheep in question was ok after some care and attention.

In Westcott, we are very fortunate to have as few dog-on-sheep incidents as we do and the vast majority of dog owners are very good with regards to this. Farmers both elsewhere in Mole Valley and further afield have suffered a lot with many sheep killed by rogue dogs. Let's please try to keep it that way.



More concerning is the amount of dog mess around and the number of dogs not on a lead. I have been asked by a couple of different residents to ask dog owners to redouble efforts to be responsible for their own and their dog's action. It really is appreciated.

Keeping your dog on a lead, even when there aren't sheep or other animals in the field in question gets them used to it and means that if farm animals are present on another day the dog isn't expecting something different. Finally, of course, in addition to the stress and distress caused to the animals, usually the farmer will expect the dog owner to pay for any vet bills etc that might be incurred.

Begging

Dorking neighbourhood policing team have noticed an increase in begging in the town. There is evidence to suggest that many of those begging in the town may not be homeless or in need and the begging could link to criminal gang related activity. Surrey police advise us to give to a homeless charity if you do wish to help support those who are genuinely homeless. Please call 101 if you witness any begging in Dorking or Leatherhead or our villages.



We'll have plenty of teddy related activities and competitions and traditional English fair stalls such as a coconut shy, tombola and jolly jam jars. However, just to keep you on your





A beautiful sunny day boded well for our trip to Canterbury. We met our guides at Christ Church Gate where we divided into small groups of seven for the tour of the cathedral. The first point of interest was in the magnificent medieval glass of the Great West Window with Adam delving after his banishment. The glass was all stored in the crypt during the war and was magnificently preserved.



Next the Great Cloister with a beautiful fan vaulted ceiling around the peaceful and quiet green space, followed by the Chapter House with a magnificent ceiling of Irish Bog Oak.

Down into St Gabriel's Chapel in the Crypt containing the oldest Christian murals in the country. The Chapel was walled in to provide support for the tower above, but the wall was demolished in 1950 to reveal these beautiful 12thC paintings in a remarkable state of preservation.

Then to the magnificent Gothic Quire. Its French architect, William of Sens, fell from scaffolding when inspecting the blue central roof boss. Health and Safety were not so rigorous in the twelfth century, but it was finished by his young assistant who was known as William the Englishman.

Thomas Becket's tomb was destroyed on the orders of King Henry VIII in 1538 as 'he had been a traitor to his king and defied his honour'. The site of the tomb is marked by a candle in the Trinity Chapel.

After lunch we reassembled in the Stonenmasons' Workshop where we were shown around by the highly skilled and enthusiastic craftsmen, then with high viz jackets and hard hats we ascended the outside of the building in a scary wire cage up to the height of the fan vaulting of the main nave. What a view over the Quire and the beautiful eastern windows.



To sum up the day, we ended up with an idea of what is being done to restore this beautiful building with such enthusiasm. We all had a most interesting and enjoyable day, thanks to the U3A's Days Out Committee.



science, in the development of the study of geology and palaeontology and the scientific understanding of the earth's history.



All change on the Downs

We have now stopped winter work to allow birds to get on with nesting; they certainly have been getting busy, setting up territories and pairing up.

The main focus for April is getting the hillside ready for cattle coming onto site in May. My volunteers and I will be busy checking the miles and miles of fencing we have and making sure all the gates work properly.



We will have a lot of work to do as there will be a number of fallen trees from storms and gates to repair as a result of illegal off-roaders. It's a hard task, in places it's so steep it's difficult to even walk up let alone carry a chainsaw and fencing equipment – my volunteers are tough!

Once cattle are on we will be busy with presentation work, with new notice boards to install, potholes to

repair and steps to check and mend – a Ranger's role is varied!

April also sees the start of wildlife surveys such as butterfly transects. Each week, for 26 weeks starting in April, volunteers and staff walk a set route counting what butterflies they see. It is a really important task as the data gathered enables us to see what effect our management has on the hill. Butterflies are an indicator species – if they are doing well, then it means other insects and plants are doing well too.

Butterflies

Butterflies emerging are mainly the ones that over-winter as adults, typically Brimstone, Peacock, Small Tortoiseshell and Red Admiral. The Red Admiral was in the past a migratory butterfly not surviving the winter but a recent increase in numbers indicates that they are now over-wintering in the south of England.

One tough little butterfly that emerges early is the Grizzled Skipper, though small and moth like it is indeed an attractive little butterfly. Unlike the butterflies that over-winter as adults, this butterfly over-winters as a chrysalis. It's best seen on a hot spring day, when males basking in the sun wait for rival males to

enter their domain. The aerial dog fights that follow are remarkable for their ferocity! The males circle and dive and soar, each trying to outmanoeuvre the other and few butterflies can match these spectacular aeronautics.

Dancing Adders

In April, the male adder actively seeks out a potential mate. This mate searching activity can be frantic, with male adders patrolling at speed, searching for pheromone trails. When they find a female the male flicks his tongue along her back and sides, both snakes vibrate their tails and the male moves along her back and follows her movements. After mating the male will sometimes remain coiled around the female.

Males are very territorial and if another male tries to move in there may be a 'dance of the adders'. Obviously, they're not really dancing; it's more a duel, a way of establishing who's superior without being injured. The snakes never attempt to bite each other.

The two snakes raise half their bodies off the ground in an attempt to push their rival down. This may be done belly to belly or back to back or they may become entwined together. The pair topple to the ground and then rise again several times. They continue wrestling coiled around each other and moving from side to side. Should you be lucky enough to witness this graceful spectacle, it is an event you will never forget. I've only ever seen it once in the 10 years I've been at Landbarn but it was indeed unforgettable.

The winner of the fight is almost always the larger and stronger snake. Sometimes the winning male will stay with the female for several days and mate with her several times.

Dogs and Adders

Dogs are occasionally bitten by adders; although the bites are painful they are very rarely fatal.

Adders are quite timid in nature and will not usually bite unless they feel threatened or cornered. They prefer to move on if given the chance to

do so. Due to their inquisitive nature, dogs can sometimes disturb adders whilst exploring undergrowth making them susceptible to being bitten.



Adders

Our advice is to keep to paths, have your dog under close control, avoid scrub edges and long grass between March and October.

If your pet is bitten by an adder (or you suspect that it may have been), you should keep your dog calm and seek prompt veterinary attention. Most adder bites result in pain and

inflammation around the muzzle, where bites usually occur. Vets in our area where adders occur, are generally experienced in treating pets that have received bites.
