Slow Cooked Pomegranate Ox Cheeks

2 ox cheeks, cut in half 100g plain flour Freshly ground salt and pepper 1 onion 1 carrot 1 stick of celery 2 bay leaves 1 knob of butter 1 large glass of red wine 1.5 cups pomegranate juice 1 tbsp pomegranate molasses Large glug of extra virgin olive oil

Method (Serves 2)

- Pat the ox cheeks dry with kitchen paper, then season with freshly ground salt and black pepper.
- 2. Toss the cheeks in plain flour, then lightly sear in a pan with a glug of oil, on both sides until nicely browned, then remove from the pan.
- 3. Finely dice the onion, carrot and celery and sauté in a knob of butter on a medium heat for 6-7 minutes.
- 4. Place the onion, carrot and celery mixture and with the bay leaves into a slow cooker on a medium heat setting, followed by the ox cheeks, pomegranate juice, molasses and red wine.
- 5. Cook for six hours. (If cooking in an oven, cook at 150 degrees C for 4-5 hours).
- 6. When ready, remove the ox cheeks from the slow cooker/oven, and loosely cover with foil to keep warm.
- 7. Discard the bay leaves and transfer the liquid into a saucepan, bring to the boil and allow to reduce until it is syrupy. Stir regularly.
- Serve the ox cheeks with butternut squash mash and the reduced sauce drizzled on top, finished with some fresh pomegranate seeds.

Joint Statement from The Trustees of The Hut Westcott & The Westcott Reading Room dated 22 July 2019

The Trustees of the Hut and the Reading Room have signed an agreement to jointly explore the possibilities of building a new Village Hall and a Doctors Surgery on the Hut site at Furlong Road.

The trustees see an opportunity, through a joint approach to the development of both sites on which they are respectively located, to explore whether by the partial realisation of the value of their respective sites and other funding options it might be possible to deliver a new medical facility and modern community meeting space with good parking on the site currently occupied by The Hut.

A joint working party has been set up including Trustees from both charities and an independent chairman - Bernd Ratzke - who is a commercial lawyer and lives in Westcott. The working party is liaising closely with Dorking Medical Practice.

The first action of the joint working party will be to commission an initial study, by a firm of independent planning consultants, to investigate whether the new buildings will meet the requirements of the village and conform with planning regulations.

It is the hope of the Trustees that we are able to ultimately provide a state of the art surgery and a modern village hall at the heart of the community in Westcott.

WESTCOTT VILLAGE ASSOCIATION NEWS



As a welcome change to the Chairman's contribution, this month Edwina Gordon, the WVA

Membership Secretary, shares her views on what is the Westcott Village Association?

I first moved to Westcott in 1986 with two young children, working full time, a house that needed updating, and not much spare time. When someone knocked on the door asking for a small subscription for the Village Association I paid up and to be honest didn't really think about it.

Maybe you feel the same. But now my children have their own children, and one lives on another continent, I have the time and the passion to give back to Westcott what has made it a very special place to live in, and bring up my family.

We don't have a Parish Council, (voted on by residents way back in the 1970's) but we do have a committed group of volunteers, led by our very active chairman, Tim Way. The Octagonal Bench surrounding the large Yew tree at St John's Graveyard was celebrated in style at a formal opening on 1st July at 11:30am having already been put to the test (within 48 hours of it being installed) on Saturday 29th June for Tom Guilder's leaving afternoon tea!



The hugely talented and dedicated National Trust volunteer team of Landbarn Carpenters explained the work they generally undertake and how they enjoyed this bespoke challenge! The local and sustainable oak wood from Bookham Common, which was a by product of their conservation work, has been carved with 'Westcott Peace Garden 2019' & two butterflies by lain Crafer. He has used a 'type font' as near as possible



to that used by the Commonwealth War Graves (to reflect the celebration of peace following the end of WWI) and the butterflies remind us of the 'Adonis Blue' – his favorite which have a local habitat (reflecting the Surrey Hills 60 years AONB).

Judith Packer explained that it was Hazel Watson's Members' Community Funding which was the catalyst for the project and Hazel shared a few words of how delighted she was that this bench had become a new meeting place and rest area for people whether they are local or visitors. Did you know that Westcott's Cradhurst Recreation Ground is protected for future generations through the Fields in Trust scheme?



Fields in Trust legally protect parks and green spaces in perpetuity by working with

landowners across the UK. Because once they are gone, they are gone forever.



Green spaces are good, do good and need to be protected for good. They are not pleasant nice-to-haves to be taken for granted - they are the green hearts of our communities.

Parks and green spaces are proven to help people stay physically and mentally well; places where we can all move, breathe, run and play. They are an important tool to drive social cohesion, combat loneliness and build community spirit.



Fields in Trust works in partnership with landowners including local authorities, voluntary organisations and private landowners to protect land through a Deed of Dedication - a binding legal commitment with the landowner, in the case of Cradhurst that is Mole Valley District Council – which allows it to be protected in perpetuity for current and future generations to enjoy.

Now, Fields in Trust have looked across the country to map out how accessible Green Spaces are to individuals. They have produced a







Are you the working parent of a three or four-year-old?



The new school year is upon us and the high cost of childcare for preschoolers can be off-putting, but did you know you can offset the cost of extended hours childcare by applying for a funded place? All 3-4 year olds in England can get 570 free hours per year. It's usually taken as 15 hours a week for 38 weeks of the year, but you can choose to take fewer hours over more weeks, for example.

If you are the working parent of a three or four old year child, and you earn less than $\pounds100,000$ a year, then you could be eligible to go up to 30 hours funded childcare.

Using your power as a citizen

Government action is crucial in tackling climate change. With many political issues vying for politicians' attention, it



is important to contact our elected representatives to let them know that we are concerned about climate change and call on them to take urgent action, in line with the scale of threat that we are facing.

One of the most effective things to do is to visit your MP, ideally with a few other constituents. Hope For the Future (www.hftf.org.uk) offers support to anyone interested in engaging with their MP on climate change.



Signing petitions and email campaigns is a quick and easy way to register your concern, h o w e v e r,

personal letters, demonstrating that climate change is an important issue for their constituents, can be more impactful. Arguably MPs may feel that climate change is not a pressing concern for their constituents – unless we write to them and make clear that it is!

Things to include:

Say why you are writing – perhaps concern for your children's future, recent news about the impacts of climate change (heatwaves, habitat loss...)

Explain why you think more urgent action is needed (eg the government's advisors, the Committee on Climate Change, recent report says government policies are off track to meet legal emission reduction commitments, continued subsidising of fossil fuels inconsistent with action to reduce emissions)

Outline a benefit (cleaner air, falling cost of renewable energy, positive health impacts...)

"I have always known Dorking. However, it's not until today that I have become aware of much of its history. This museum, with its fascinating subject-matter and very high standard of display, is one of the best museums I have ever visited. It reveals very successfully the heart and character of Dorking and its place in history." So wrote one of our recent visitors. Why not give us a visit and find out more about Dorking and the surrounding villages?

This month there is a last chance to see '**The Days of King Dor - a touring exhibition from Leasingstede Museum**': This unique and rather unusual exhibition has brought many a smile and quizzical expression to visitors' faces and remains open until September 21st. It is the creation of artist Jane Williams and is a display of artefacts from Dorking's past, but not a past that any local historians would recognise.

On **Sunday 15th September, 2pm**, there is a choice of two guided walks. 

This month volunteer Jacques has kindly taken the time to write about his experiences volunteering with us.

Being a Volunteer Ranger

We've had the privilege of living in the beautiful Surrey Hills for over thirty vears. Left to Nature, trees and shrubs would overwhelm grasses, and the area would revert to woodland, so species whose lives depend upon open chalk grassland could not survive here. Butterflies such as Chalk Hill Blue and Adonis Blue and plants such as Pyramidal and Bee orchids would disappear. Should landowners maintain the rolling grasslands or to leave Nature to take its course? The NT has decided to maintain, and that's where Volunteer Rangers come in.

When I retired, I encountered a group of people who were repairing the steep steps to Ranmore Common from the Carriage Road. Identifiable by NT branded clothing in subdued country-friendly colours, they were friendly and approachable, so I asked about volunteering. After meeting the Lead Ranger, in May two years ago I was welcomed into the team by the Area Ranger, Amanda Barnicoat and her dozen Volunteers. Numbers vary from week to week because the sort of people who are going to volunteer their time and energy to the NT are exactly the sort of bright,

energetic people who will have many other things going on in their busy lives.

There are two volunteer groups at Landbarn, Volunteer Rangers and Volunteer Carpenters. Carpenters fashion signs, benches, bird boxes, and anything else wooden, much of it from oak which is harvested from Bookham Commons then matured in a large barn at Landbarn Farm, while Rangers' work keeps the Downs beautiful and accessible.



Volunteer Rangers come from all backgrounds, men and women, mostly retired, and from a rainbow of previous occupations. A young archaeology student also joins us during her vacations. We're all cando, mucking-in people. Some like to take charge, while others are happy

just to pootle. Some are garrulous, others taciturn. We all enjoy hard work, and take interest in our surroundings: a shout of 'Kestrel' or 'Raven' as we're working on the Downs will have everybody look skywards.

Japanese have tea-drinking The rituals. Well, so do we. Shortly before eleven, when we're working outside, inaenious devices called 'Kellv Kettles' are fired up, resulting after a short while and a great deal of puffing and clouds of woodsmoke, in boiling water for hot drinks. They are drunk accompanied by a slice of a cake which is brought every week by a different volunteer. The ceremony of the Firing of the Kelly Kettles is traditionally carried out by the group's shortest member.

Wooden gates consist of a gatepost at one end with hinges to hold the gate up, and a slam-post with a latch at the other end. These posts need replacement when they rot or are broken. New posts are taken from the oak stockpile, are about six feet in length and six to eight inches square, and two people are needed to lift them into the vehicle used to reach the site. Then the hard work starts. It can take over four hours' strenuous effort to extract an old post, more than compensated for later on by seeing the gate working properly again. Working with tools in confined



places with others requires teamwork and a robust sense of humour.

Other physically demanding work involves replacing posts supporting barbed wire fencing. Six-foot lengths of chestnut are split down the middle and one end sharpened to a point. These are hammered into the ground using a 'Post Rammer', which weighs about 45 pounds, and is lifted then dropped until the post has been driven in to the required depth. After a session replacing twenty posts, you certainly know you've have hard exercise. Amanda once suggested

that she might start charging us a gym fee for the privilege of volunteering. Just the once.

It's not all hard physical work. The metal fence which borders Netley Park is a third of a mile long, so is taking hundreds of man-hours to paint. When a good number of volunteers turns up, the dullness of the work is counterbalanced by its conviviality.

Ranmore Common and Denbies Hillside is in an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) and is part of the Hackhurst and White Downs Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI), so is much favoured by walkers, runners, cyclists, horse riders, entomologists, picnickers, and fly-tippers. One of our jobs is to remove and dispose of fly-tip, which usually consists of a pick-up's cargo of builders' and gardeners' waste.

Other tasks involve strimming and brush-cutting verges and fields to help constrain Nature's enthusiasm for life as necessary, for example to make verges safe or to remove plants such as Blackthorn which are threatening to overwhelm other plants such as Horseshoe Vetch which are essential to the life cycle of the Adonis Blue butterfly with its complex and fascinating lifestyle. We are also fillers of car park potholes, and makers of such varied artefacts as giant sized birds' nests and woodfired pizza ovens.

We make verges safe by strimming them, and remove plants such as Blackthorn from fields before they overwhelm other plants such as Horseshoe Vetch, which is essential to the complex and fascinating life cycle of the Adonis Blue butterfly.



Some of my colleagues have been volunteering for over ten years, so I'm a newcomer, as they remind me occasionally. The people and the work make it enjoyable and rewarding and I'm looking forward to the next eight.

Thanks for a lovely article Jacques. I hope it will be an inspiration for more people to volunteer with the National Trust and the many other charities that rely on people giving their time, skills and knowledge.

Established originally in 2015, the Westcott 100 Club was relaunched at WESTfest this year with a smaller ticket price and bigger prize values. Think of it a bit like Westcott's very own mini "National Lottery" – raising money for local causes and giving members the chance to win prizes four times a year. Want to know more? Then read on...

What is it?

The Westcott 100 Club is a "Small Society Lottery" registered and monitored by Mole Valley DC (no. 048965). The scheme's aim is to raise funds for village clubs, events and activities. 40% of the scheme's subscriptions are paid out to the members each year in prizes, with the remaining 60% being available for clubs, events and activities in Westcott.

How does it work?

The scheme is open to anyone over the age of 18. Members pay an annual subscription of £25 per "ticket" by Standing Order. Members can hold up to 20 tickets at any one time. Draws are held quarterly in or around March, June, September and December, with an additional annual prize in December. There are two prizes at each quarterly draw and one, larger, prize for the annual draw. Prize values depend on the number of tickets at the time of the draw – for example, with 100 tickets, the quarterly prizes are £125 and £62.50 with an annual prize of £250. The more members, the bigger the prizes and the more money for local causes!

How do I join?

For more information, please email us at <u>westcott.100.club@gmail.com</u> and we'll send you a full copy of the scheme rules, and let you know how to sign up. If you have internet banking, it can all be done online in a few minutes (and you don't need to tell us your bank details – unless you win a prize!).


