



Slow Cooked Pomegranate Ox Cheeks

2 ox cheeks, cut in half

100g plain flour

Freshly ground salt and pepper

1 onion

1 carrot

1 stick of celery

2 bay leaves

1 knob of butter

1 large glass of red wine

1.5 cups pomegranate juice

1 tbsp pomegranate molasses

Large glug of extra virgin olive oil

Method (Serves 2)

- Pat the ox cheeks dry with kitchen paper, then season with freshly ground salt and black pepper.
- Toss the cheeks in plain flour, then lightly sear in a pan with a glug of oil, on both sides until nicely browned, then remove from the pan.
- 3. Finely dice the onion, carrot and celery and sauté in a knob of butter on a medium heat for 6-7 minutes.
- 4. Place the onion, carrot and celery mixture and with the bay leaves into a slow cooker on a medium heat setting, followed by the ox cheeks, pomegranate juice, molasses and red wine.
- 5. Cook for six hours. (If cooking in an oven, cook at 150 degrees C for 4-5 hours)
- When ready, remove the ox cheeks from the slow cooker/oven, and loosely cover with foil to keep warm.
- Discard the bay leaves and transfer the liquid into a saucepan, bring to the boil and allow to reduce until it is syrupy. Stir regularly.
- Serve the ox cheeks with butternut squash mash and the reduced sauce drizzled on top, finished with some fresh pomegranate seeds.

Crossness

We were very lucky with the weather on the morning of 10th October when the long-awaited visit to Crossness set off. We were headed for the Thames Marshes, on the outh side of the river near Erith – the point east of London where the true river meets the river estuary.

Our sympathies were with our excellent driver Matt who, having reached the South Bank had to steer his large coach-load through a major traffic snarl-up. The activities of the environmentalists "Extinction Rebellion" had caused this, and environmental matters turned out to be the theme for our day.

Most of us were looking forward to seeing the enormous cast iron remains of Sir Joseph Bazalgette's (1819-91) sewage

pumping station.

We'd seen pictures and knew it to be enormous, a flamboyant example of Victorian pomp; grandiose and extravagant, a culmination of the power of the Age of Steam. We would see the pumps preserved and re-painted by the current volunteer restorers exactly matching the original vibrant reds, greens and blues, a showy and amazing extravaganza of Victorian self-confidence.

Amazingly the trip turned out to be so much more. It took us right through the city's sanitation from medieval times to the present day.

We began with a quick walk around some lanes in the old city area where sanitation before the nineteenth century consisted simply of cess pits from which 'night soil men' carted away solid material to be spread on the surrounding market garden areas, while all liquid flowed by natural drainage down the middle of streets into streams, then tributaries, and so to the Thames. This meant that the roads were effectively the sewers.

One lane we walked along had "urine deflectors" installed along a wall to stop pedestrians peeing on the walls of that property. "Move

along to the next lane!" they seemed to say.

Okay for several centuries but the increasing popularity of flush toilets which had been a highlight of the Great Exhibition of 1851 had had the unfortunate result of overloading the old system, culminating just seven years later in The Great Stink.



The increased quantity of water they generated was too much for the ancient cess pits, their use had to be prohibited and some rudimentary drains were constructed. But in hot weather the smell was intolerable even out of the City away at Westminster, and since at that time people believed that disease was carried by a "miasma" along with foul air Parliament at last took action.

The necessary money was allocated and Bazalgette, as Chief Engineer of London's new Metropolitan Board of Works, designed a completely new drainage system which culminated in very large pipework much of

it hidden under enormous new earthworks on both sides of the river - the Victoria, Albert and Chelsea embankments.

We took a boat from Westminster Pier and could picture the width of the river before these works were undertaken. It was high tide and in the watery October sun the unusual views, from the river, of many generations of city buildings were magnificent. There was little to be seen of the Thames Tideway development, due to open next year, which will at last supersede the Victorian system, but we knew it was in progress and later were shown some information about it.

In the old drainage system, gravity carried all the sewage far away eastward but that brought it so low that it was now below river level. It then had to be raised in order for the twice-daily tides to swirl it a way to sea. Hence the need

downstream for a Pumping Station. Since all his other pipework was underground Bazalgette sure the Board of Works had something magnificent to show above ground, so he made this building huge and imposing. It stood in what was otherwise an empty landscape making it a landmark for approaching shipping. Thus became known as the Cathedral of Sewage.

The building and engineering remains have been saved for us to enjoy and are now solely dependent upon volunteer efforts for their restoration and maintenance. The pumps are run occasionally on Open Days but we chose to go at a quieter time when we could have the expert attention of the guides, and also the advantage of particularly efficient organisation through 'City and Village Tours' for all the London-

based part of the trip.

The U3A team of course supervised everything perfectly and they are to be congratulated and thanked for a particularly good "day out".

So nowadays? The current processing plant can be seen below a simple steel roofline. It all conforms to modern standards. After a spell in settlement tanks solid material is incinerated through a sand bed at a very high temp and the ash used in the manufacture of commercially viable building blocks, while the liquid part is treated aerobically to remove all bacterial activity and released into the Thames - the quality of which it actually helps to improve.



This month's article has a bit of a safety theme to it after residents raised issues at the AGM in October.

Emergency Services – access in rural villages

Assistant Group Commander Ian Ray has addressed the specific concern about access for emergency services by assuring residents that the fire service will get to emergency calls whatever the circumstances, moving obstructions - if necessary by force, - but not before attempting to do so with the owners' permission.

The fire service has checked all the roads in Westcott, and, with the exception of Parsonage Lane, has confirmed that their regular Fire Engines can access all roads. Where there are width restrictions (as in the case of Parsonage Lane) smaller tenders are used; Assistant Commander Ray is more than happy to come and talk at an open meeting about this if you as residents would like this to happen.

Speeding and Noise

After the AGM, Nick Lund (WVA Highways lead) and I set up a small working group to address this issue. This followed my attendance at a number of Surrey County Highways Working Group meetings, which have failed to find any practical solutions in the last 18 months. Our first meeting was held on 11th November where we looked at various pieces of information - and started to identify practical and realistic changes which could be made to address a problem which is shared by all villages along the A25.

Here are three interesting facts which have come from two speed surveys carried out at either end of the village between 8th and 15th June 2018.

• 87% of vehicles I eaving Westcott at the brow of the hill opposite Westcott House heading into Dorking were



travelling in excess of the 30mph limit

• 50% of those vehicles were travelling in excess of 36mph and 15% in excess





coming down with something, even if it's just a cough or a cold, don't wait until it gets worse. At the first signs of illness, go and see a pharmacist – the sooner you act on advice the better.

- Call 111 for help rather than heading to A&E, please try calling 111 the NHS non-emergency number if you urgently need medical help or advice but it's not a life-threatening situation. They can also help you get a GP appointment at a time to suit you. Much better than waiting a few hours in an Emergency Department.
- Stay warm keep your home warm, at a minimum of 18°C, as breathing in cold air can increase the risk of chest infections. The Healthy Surrey website has details of organisations who can help with the cost of heating. You can wrap up too, remembering that several thin layers of clothes is more effective at keeping you warm.
- Take care of yourself, and each other wear shoes with a good grip, to prevent falls and trips; and pop in to see your neighbours, particularly if they're vulnerable, as they might need your help.

Taking these steps will help protect you from becoming ill, or help you to recover without adding to pressures on GP surgeries and hospitals over the winter months. For more information on saying safe, warm and well over the winter, visit www.healthysurrey. org.uk



completing the scheme, and are enjoying a number of life-changing health benefits.

The scheme allows health professionals to refer patients to a low-cost supervised exercise programme that includes a series of personalised gym sessions, swimming sessions, or a combination of both. Patients can choose when to exercise at a time that suits them at Dorking Sports Centre.



To be eligible, individuals must suffer from at least one of:

- Type 1 or Type 2 diabetes
- Hypertension (<180/100mmHg)
- Hyperlipaemia (>5mmol/I)
- Body Mass Index>30 (BMI<25 if another risk factor is present)
- Chronic respiratory disease
- neurological conditions such as Multiple Sclerosis
- Asthma/COPD
- Peripheral vascular disease
- Stable angina
- Diagnosed coronary heart disease
- Osteoporosis
- Long standing back pain
- Arthritis
- Physical disabilities where

independent physical activity is suitable

 People with mental health conditions e.g. depression and anxiety

You can apply to take part in the scheme by requesting the course from your GP, physiotherapist, mental health practitioner, district nurse or occupational therapist.

Since January this year, there have been more than 300 referrals to the scheme with the most common reasons for referral being joint replacement rehabilitation, followed by obesity and then mental health conditions.

Patients will receive 20 supervised sessions to be completed within a 12 week period. The first, middle and final sessions will be on a one-to-one basis with the Referral Instructor. The scheme costs £45 up front to give the maximum discount equating to only £2.25 per session. To encourage continued use after the course, discounts for membership are available.





Winter on the Hill

The Downs in Winter seem bleak and the glory of the flowery, butterfly filled summer seem like a distant memory. But without Winter how could we ever appreciate that first taste of warmth in the Spring sun?

Winter does provide us with some spectacular feasts for the eyes, from beautiful clear frosty mornings, bright scarlet Rose Hips to huge clumps of Mistletoe hanging in naked trees.

Rose Hips

In early Winter the fruits of our native Dog Rose are commonly to be seen spilling their rich scarlet colour upon barren hedgerows. Hips are an important food source for many birds during the winter, especially when the ground is too frozen to hunt worms or snails, and when there are few insects about.

They are eaten by fruit-eating birds such as Thrushes, Blackbirds, Redwing, Fieldfare and Waxwings, which then disperse the seeds in their droppings. Some birds, particularly finches, also eat the seeds.

Humans like them too! Rose Hips

are a valuable source of vitamin C. containing as much αs 20 times more vitamin Cthan oranges. They are also an excellent antioxidant. Rose hip has long been used as an ingredient for herbal tea and enjoyed in syrups, iellies, and even wine.

Mistletoe

High above, in branches of oak, hawthorn, poplar and apple trees, mistletoe may be found. It never grows on the ground and is semi-parasitic. Like many plants, it produces its own food using photosynthesis, but it also extracts minerals and water from a host tree. Delightfully, mistletoe is commonly spread by birds.

The seeds inside are coated in a sticky substance which sticks to the beaks of birds feeding on the fruit. They either wipe the substance off on a branch or eat it and excrete it on trees in their droppings. The gluey pulp around the seed hardens and fastens the seed in place. As the new mistletoe plant grows, the roots penetrate the bark and start to take water and nutrients from the tree.

In the UK, the tradition of kissing underneath the mistletoe dates back to the 1700s but the Victorians continued the tradition of kissing under the mistletoe as it was thought to symbolise fertility and romance.

The scientific name of this white berry can translate as "white goo". Local names include Churchman's Greeting, Kiss-and-go, Masslin, Misle and Mislin-Bush.

The ancient Greeks used mistletoe for medicine as a pain reliever and for conditions such as ulcers.

It contains a poisonous protein called phoratoxin, which if consumed can cause drowsiness, blurred vision, diarrhoea, vomiting and seizures. It is also poisonous to animals so make sure your pets don't consume it. Despite this, mistletoe is a good food source for wildlife, with birds eating the berries and bees, butterflies and other insects consuming the nectar.

Our current exhibition, 'You, Me and Those Who Came Before', presented in conjunction with art psychotherapist Sophia Cowx, explores Dorking's response to past refugee crises, covering more than two eventful centuries, right up to the support offered to refugees in this decade. Sophia offers an artistic exploration of the emergence of the poppy symbol 100 years ago as a creative response to the trauma of the First World War, and examines the poppy's connections with healing over the centuries.



Age of the dinosaurs: The Museum's 'prehistoric' section, with its dinosaur fossils, has always been a particular visitor favourite and has now been supplemented with a new animated display that demonstrates how a pliosaur would have propelled itself through the water in the Cretaceous period between 100 million and 65 million years ago when these were early residents of the Dorking area! 'Ava' the pliosaur is shown courtesy of the "Prince of Paleo-fiction", Max Hawthorne.







Tips for a 'green' Christmas

There were plenty of ideas shared at November's Eco Café for reducing, reusing, repurposing and recycling at Christmas:



Christmas cards Avoid glittery cards which cannot be recycled and look for cards made from recycled paper. Reduce the number you send by creating a communal Christmas card displayed in your workplace/meeting place for everyone to share their Christmas messages.

Gift wrap Plain brown paper can be decorated using prints or reuse newspaper/old magazines decorated with fabric ribbon. Furoshiki is a traditional Japanese way of wrapping presents in fabric (look on Youtube for guidance).

Decorations Simple paper chains made from scrap paper; pine cones; dried orange slices; greenery gathered from outdoors; baubles made from decorated walnuts!

Crackers Make crackers from reused gift wrap or reusable crackers that come apart at the middle (you can buy cracker snaps).

Christmas trees Choose a locally grown tree. Living trees should be displayed in a cool room and should not be kept inside for more than 12 days. These can be grown on in pots, moving to a bigger pot annually, until they reach the maximum size that can comfortably be moved.

Food Home-cooked treats cut down on packaging, for Christmas leftover recipes try BBC Good Food website; if making pavlova, ensure egg yolks are not wasted by making a trifle too! Jo and Lauren kindly shared advice on how to make bees wax wraps, to use for covering leftovers or to wrap edible Christmas gifts in! Although simple to make, it can be hot and messy work – if you visited the Westcott Christmas Craft Fair you may have been lucky enough to buy one ready-made from their stall!

The Climate & Ecological Crisis - Local issues

The recent government announcement of a 'moratorium' on fracking is a great victory for those who have undertaken years of campaigning and frontline resistance from communities in places such as Preston New Road in Lancashire. However, this does not directly affect plans for drilling for oil at Horse Hill, Horley near Gatwick.

The process likely to be used to extract the oil in Surrey is 'acidisation' - a 'stimulation technique' which uses high concentrations of chemicals to dissolve channels



through limestone or sandstone, to release the oil trapped in rock pores. Quite aside from concerns surrounding the incidence of earthquakes, the risks of contamination of surface and ground water from hazardous chemicals, and the industrialisation of the area, the simple fact is that to tackle the climate crisis fossil fuels need to be kept in the ground.

Despite having declared a Climate Emergency on 9th July this year, in September councillors, on Surrey County Councils planning committee, voted to allow a further four oil production wells and 20 years of oil production at Horse Hill.

In October, groups including the Weald Action Group and Extinction Rebellion groups from Dorking, Guildford and all over Surrey, came together as the Horse Hill Rebel Alliance to hold a peaceful protest at Horse Hill. The event included speeches from local councillors and Dr Emily Grossman, one of 1,500 scientists who have signed a declaration supporting civil disobedience protests that urge government action on the climate crisis.



Dr Grossman said: "The overwhelming scientific consensus is that we urgently need to move away from the use of fossil fuels and rapidly bring down greenhouse emissions if we are to avoid the most catastrophic impacts of climate change. Allowing 20 years' worth of oil extraction here in Surrey flies in the face of both local and national climate targets, and will cause not only a direct threat to our financial stability but also criminal damage towards our planet."


