The most important thing you can do with your life

- Grow your relationship with

Unless you are a fundamentalist atheist – your life is built on the belief that all existence is

random and essentially meaningless – you must be open to the possibility that there is a "higher power", a "life force" behind our being. My guess is most people have this sense that "there must be something" to explain the utterly extraordinary fact of life.

If such a "higher power"/"life force" is the reason for our lives, it would surely be good to know more about it, to be open to having more of it in your life. Christians believe this "it" is actually personal – the "higher power" has character and seeks relationship, so we call the "life force", "He" and "God".

It is my experience, as for Christians all through history and throughout the world, that we can grow in relationship with this ground of our being, with God, by simply dedicating time each day. Just 10 set minutes a day will grow your relationship with God, leading to your growth as a person. You will see developing in your life love, strength, wisdom. The "fruits of the Holy Spirit" will grow in you - love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control (Galatians 5). You will find in God that His grace is sufficient for all your need. You will experience a fullness of life that the material world on its own cannot give. In God you will know that the powers of sin, death and the devil have been vanquished. We have eternal life. You will know deep within yourself sure hope in all circumstances.

In the God of Christian faith, we receive all the benefits that Jesus Christ has won for us, and we become more like Him.

There are only two things that matter in life, are the purpose of our lives - to love God with all that we are, and to love our neighbour as ourselves. The first, growing our relationship with God, empowers the second.

There cannot be anything more important than growing in relationship with the reason for your existence, with God. It is impossible to find fulfilment if you neglect the source behind your being, God. All you need to grow your relationship with God is to ensure you give 10 set minutes a day. What do you do with this time? Essentially you pray, and you listen, with reading the Bible. I will give more detail next month. If, though, you would like to know more now, please do not hesitate to contact me. There are many things a Church, a vicar does but the most vital is to help one and other do the most important thing you can do with your life – grow your relationship with God.

Welcome to Reception Children

In September, Surrey Hills All Saints welcomed the reception children to the Abinger Common site. This is such a significant milestone for both the children and parents. The children settled quickly and have enjoyed sharing tales of their day's adventures of bubble making, building, keeping babies (dolls) content in the home corner, trike rides and the most important part of the day of course, lunch! 

This month I have only one important issue to draw your attention to but I accept that this is not new news!

Speeding and Noise Campaign



On 4th September the WVA was represented at a Joint Action Group meeting chaired by Hazel Watson

which brought together representatives from villages along the A24 and A25 who are seriously impacted by the problem of anti-social motorbike riders and the noise they create. As I have said before, we are not alone in suffering this problem, and it was heartening to see that the Police and DVSA (formerly known as the DVLA) are taking the matter very seriously.

During the whole of August, police presence in Westcott, especially at weekends, did have an impact on curbing the noise pollution and as a result a significant number of bikers were dealt with under Section 59 of the Police Reform Act including fines and confiscation of vehicles. In addition to

village presence, Ryka's at the Burford Bridge and the Newlands Corner car park were targeted by a co-ordinated Police campaign. Unfortunately, this had been set up with a specific budget allocation for the month of August only, and frustratingly meant that as we entered September the problems returned. The police are also frustrated and are working with us and other Parish Councils and Residents' Associations to find longer term solutions which include:

- Encouraging any resident to report anti-social motorbike noise by calling 101 to report the problem as it happens.
- Encouraging residents to video record speeding and excessively noisy vehicles on their mobile phones; the WVA will be setting up a process for you to send these to us as evidence of the problem. Until we have done this please send any recordings to contact@westcottvillage.com
- Encouraging residents to report antisocial behaviour by reporting it online at https://bit.ly/3bzkHxb (this will take you to the Mole Valley website). This is not an overly effective site for reporting anti-social noise problems, but it does at least log every incident to which the council and police are obliged to respond. We need to build up a weight of evidence and formally reporting incidents is vital in getting the attention of the various authorities.

 Providing Community Speed Watch teams with noise monitoring equipment (to use alongside speed monitoring devices) in the next couple of months.



These are all very helpful measures and we are pushing hard to get our C o m m u n i t y Speed Watch team up

and running by training volunteers. Unfortunately, Covid-19 anxiety is preventing the police and Highways making this happen but we will provide an update as soon as one is available. I am very pleased to report that we have seen a good response to our request for volunteers but if you haven't yet done so and would like to be involved in the Speed Watch programme, please email us at contact@westcottvillage.

Nick Lund has also been very active on the speeding issues and we have now been told that there is money available from County and District Council pots to make some practical changes through the village to address speeding vehicles. These are being finalised and we hope they will be put into effect soon.

However, our continued frustration with this whole campaign is that what

we really need is a way of "designing out crime" – making physical changes to our road environment through the village to force motorists and bikers to stop their anti-social behaviour rather than relying on an overstretched police force to be present when incidents occur. This, of course, is a much bigger challenge and a much more costly one so undoubtedly will take longer to get results. But we will keep pushing for more permanent solutions.

WVA AGM - is due to be held on Thursday 8th October (not 3rd October as previously reported in error) starting at 7.30pm via Zoom. The Zoom invite will be sent out on 24th September and the AGM paperwork will be available on the Village Association website (www.westcottvillage.com) from the same date.

Council Changes – The white paper on the proposed Unitary authorities will be reviewed by Trustees when it is published and we will review how we respond to this in due course.

As always, you are invited to write to me on issues which concern you, and the WVA will do their best to address them.

Supermarket Deliveries Feedback

Last month I mentioned that, following concerns expressed by Westcott residents, I had written to Tesco, Sainsbury's, Waitrose and Asda to specifically ask them to take action with their van drivers to respect appropriate speeds in these areas – especially in Ashley Road, Watson Road, Bailey Road, Furlong Road, St John's Road, The Burrell, Springfield Road and Westcott Street.



It's fair to say that it was a mixed response. We heard nothing back from Asda. Both Waitrose and Sainsbury's were very helpful and their teams contacted the drivers for our area.

I'm sad to say that Tesco replied by saying that "I'm afraid we cannot

help". I can only encourage folks who are Tesco account holders to email online@tesco.com to raise the issue directly with them. That appears to be the only way that they are prepared to think about taking any action to maintain road safety in our rural village.

Westcott GP Surgery

Over the last few years, many of us have been supporting our Doctor's surgery to secure a new future in the village.

This is a somewhat slow process and from the outside probably shows the wheels of the NHS machine in an enlightening way – and I say that having, for a short while, done the local NHS leadership role that ran the process nearly a decade ago.

Whilst we might see the decision making timetable continually going on, I'm delighted to say that the local NHS commissioning team have confirmed to me that having a new surgery in Westcott is their preferred option.

This is really great news for all Westcott residents, whether you use the surgery or not. It secures a vital support service for us and also gives the Dorking Medical Practice team the chance to bring new services out to us here.

Simply shutting the door won't prevent
burglaries. Double-lock the door every

single time you leave the house.

Modern multi-locking and uPVC doors use a system of hooks and latches to secure the door but these only work if you lift up the handle and then remember to turn and remove the key. Remember – lift, lock and remove.

Is it time to get your carers flu jab?

Carers play an integral role in our village community, ensuring loved ones are safe and well through all circumstances. It's really important that Carers look after themselves and take advantage of the free flu vaccine available to them through the Surrey carers flu prevention voucher.

This year sees the UK's most comprehensive flu prevention programme in history, in order to help protect the NHS. This will see a marked increase in the number of people in Surrey who can get a free flu vaccination.

Surrey carers continue to be eligible for the free flu jab and it is crucial that they are vaccinated as early as possible. To support this, Surrey Heartlands Health and Care Partnership are launching the Surrey Carers Flu Jab Voucher for the fifth year running.



Getting the jab will not only protect you, it will help reduce transmission of flu to the vulnerable people in your care and stop them becoming ill. This year more than ever, all Surrey Carers are encouraged to get a free flu jab. The flu jab is the best way to protect carers and those they care for from flu.

Flu can have serious consequences and vulnerable people can die of it. By taking up the offer of the flu vaccination, carers may help reduce pressure on the NHS through the coming winter months.

Dorking Area Foodbank

October is a time when we traditionally think of harvest and giving thanks for the plentiful supplies that we have, often generated locally from within our own communities.

Through this year, we have had the opportunity to get out and about locally perhaps more than ever. It has been wonderful to see how our local farmers and land owners take care of the green infrastructure of our community too – maintaining hedges, fences, rights of way, as well as seeing how crops are maturing week by week.

It is family tradition that the farmers amongst us never "have a good year" – it follows by definition that some bad years are better than others. (It's also family tradition that I never sympathise with any of them!). I'm told that this year, hay and cereal crops have particularly struggled and that in turn that will push up food prices through the winter.

That position though, especially when many people are already facing the financial challenges of living in a COVID world, really does matter to people in our local community.

One team doing their very best to help out are Dorking Area Foodbank.



In 2019, they distributed 16.8 tonnes of food through vouchers and additional outreach work, feeding 572 local children and 768 adults.

To keep up this work, they regularly update the items that they are in need of on their website dorkingarea. foodbank.org.uk

For example, as I write they are looking for:

- Tinned vegetables
- 500g bags of dried pasta
- Long life fruit juice
- Tinned Vegetarian meals
- Shampoo

The list changes every week, and they are generally grateful for any donations. This harvest time perhaps think how we in Westcott can support our local individuals and families through Dorking Area Foodbank.

At the time I write this, there is still no real hope of when any of these activities will be able to resume. It is a desperately sad situation.


Many organisations have responded going online, bv makina bv performances available via the internet. So it has been possible to watch operas and listen to concerts and recitals from all around the world. The wonderful BBC Radio 3 has re-broadcast lots of classic Prom concerts and other archive performances. But of course it's not the same as attending a live concert.

The Dorking Choral Society, which I sing with, is holding rehearsals via Zoom, with no certainty as to when we will next be able to give a concert. The Leith Hill Music Festival was postponed from April to September and then cancelled, and next year's festival will be a reduced affair with just two concerts

and no competitions. The Dorking Concertgoers Society has planned an excellent programme for the season but has delayed taking any ticket bookings until the situation becomes clearer.

One small improvement for us is that the Dorking Halls has now opened its cinema and their 'encore' event screenings include several musical items. September had performances of Carmen, La Boheme and Rigoletto. October's diary includes The three tenors – voices for eternity, a film celebrating the trio of legendary singers; Turandot from the stunning setting of Sydney harbour; and Michael Ball and Alfie Boe performing songs from musical theatre and the pop world.

DORKING MUSEUM IN OCTOBER

With something of a 'lost summer' for many of us and for many public venues, it seems hardly possible that we are now thinking about autumn and winter activities.



October, of course, is the month of Hallowe'en – scary costumes, 'trick or treat' and carved pumpkins. Whilst these may seem relatively recent (and often

imported) 'traditions', their origins do date back thousands of years. In the 8th century, October 31st became 'All Hallows' Eve', preceding 'All Hallows' Day' ('All Saints' Day'), a day to remember those who had died for their beliefs. But centuries earlier, this was the ancient pagan festival of 'Samhain', marking the end of the harvest season and the beginning of winter, when the Celts believed that ghosts of their dead would visit the mortal world.

Previously, Dorking Museum has been able to enter into the 'spirit' of the event with Spooky Halloween Ghost Walks, coming face to face with some of Dorking's spectral historical inhabitants, and Spooky Cave Tours, with added ghosts and special

stories of the legends and mysteries of the Caves. Sadly, conditions this year mean that our spooks will have to remain in hiding, but we hope to welcome them back next year.

Walking in Dorking: The Museum was pleased to be able to resume its programme of guided walks in and around Dorking last month.



The new pond is settling down, the fish are content, the water plants are thriving and the ornamental grasses which our trustee John and his wife Sharon have planted around the pond are really looking great.



We have been donated flags by all Services which are now flying with pride at the top of the car park. So we are feeling very pleased with



our progression this year despite the setback from the Covid-19 pandemic. We have not been able to hold our usual fundraising events which of course is disappointing but the situation has been unprecedented and we have taken the decision not to hold the annual Christmas at the Woodland event this year BUT we will aim not to disappoint in 2021 with the first event being our Easter Egg Hunt on Sunday 28th March 2022 followed by our 7th Anniversary on 5th June all of which of course ALL are invited to attend.

So for the time being our only event this year will be our annual Remembrance Service which will take place on Wednesday 11th November 2020. The service will take place around the Monument where social distancing is of no issue. All are invited to attend at 10.45 around the Monument.

We look forward to seeing you all back at the woodland whenever you wish to either walk around, sit and have a picnic or come and talk.

ECO CHALLENGE WESTCOTT



LEARNING TO LIVE DIFFERENTLY

Last month the Climate and Ecological Emergency (CEE) Bill was introduced to Parliament as a Private Members Bill. Guided by the current science, this Bill has been written by an alliance of scientists, lawyers academics and campaigners, in the hope of securing a sound strategy to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and restore the natural world, to try to prevent catastrophic climate change.



Nature is our life support system – it provides food, water, medicine, pollination, helps regulate the climate and flood prevention, and boosts our mental health. It is essential for our wellbeing. But we have been living beyond the means of our planet and eroded natural resources, to such an extent that habitats have been destroyed or polluted and wildlife is struggling to survive. Scientists fear that the sixth mass extinction is underway. In the UK glone:

• 41% of all UK's species have declined

since the 70s (hedgehogs have declined by 95%)

• 26% of the UK's mammals are at a very real risk of becoming extinct



- A third of the wild bees and hoverfly species have sustained losses, likely due to pesticides, habitat loss and climate change
- 97% of the UK's wildflower meadows have been lost (State of Nature report 2019)

The CEE Bill requires urgent action to reduce the negative impacts that human activities have had on the health of soil and biodiversity and restore and enhance nature, so that it wildlife and ecosystems can thrive.

When they are healthy, living systems such as forests, peat bogs, saltmarshes and the sea bed, support life and absorb carbon from the atmosphere, which can help tackle the climate emergency too. The Bill also outlines new targets for the UK to reduce its real fair share of carbon emissions, in line
