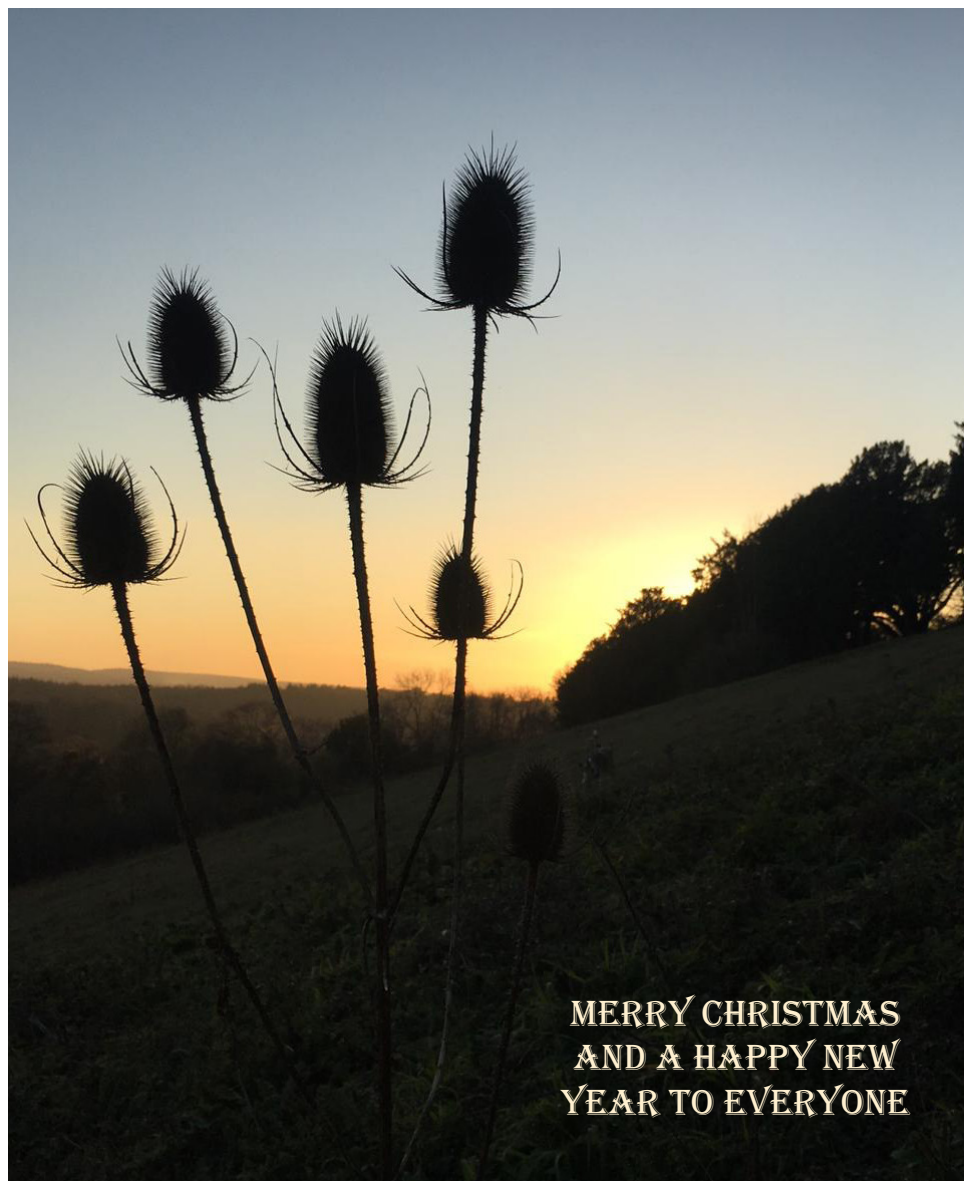

As I write in mid November, in the midst of the second lockdown, I anticipate that Christmas in Westcott will be very different this year as we continue to face coronavirus restrictions. And yet, this could be a very rich Christmas, with new discoveries that will bless us into 2021 and beyond.

Unless there is an extraordinary turnaround, our main Christmas Services will be on Zoom*. We will surely miss seeing one another in person, in our well-attended services in Holy Trinity, with the beauty and joy of our celebrations.

Alongside our restricted Church celebrations, there may well be continuing limits on gatherings of family and friends. And, of course, this year of crisis has brought death, severe illness and economic pain and uncertainty. There will be many sad and concerned households this

Christmas.

Yet, the most essential elements of Christmas are still with us – the celebration of the Christ, Jesus. The astonishing stories of the birth of Jesus accord with the astonishing life he goes on to lead. Read the gospel accounts and you see Jesus in his wonderful, full humanity. He is depicted as such a complete, compelling, unique person, you could not possibly make him up. He had a great zest for life – hill-walking, partying, out on the lake, caring, travelling, eating and drinking, rejecting wealth, emphasizing simplicity. He was a man of complete integrity. In the Bible narrative, he is moved to tears and

anger, he sleeps and is wearied. He is utterly courageous, not in the machismo way of the fighter but in the far more difficult way of moral resolution and bearing of suffering. In the Bible, Jesus' life was one of being fully human, a life formed in times of solitude and prayer. Jesus is our example of how to live.

But there is, of course more. The first followers of Jesus come to recognize that he is "the Christ, the Son of the living God"- He who, in love for all, takes on sin, death and the devil and wins, bringing the power of resurrection. It is in the Christ, Jesus that there is true meaning and purpose, and hope. Only in Jesus "the Christ, the Son of the living God", can there be unlocking of the mysteries of our existence.

I hope and pray amongst all the disappointments, frustrations, pain and anguish in this time of Corona, you will be able to discover afresh the vast richness of Christmas – the birth of the Christ, Jesus. I pray you will truly know him, man and God. Try reading a gospel, Matthew or Luke this Christmas season, taking you beyond the nativity stories to his unique life.

Then, as we go into the New Year, with growing hope of an effective vaccine against Covid 19, you will have discovered a vast richness in Christ Jesus, that will be with you in all times.

It may be that the name "Jesus" has become too familiar in our culture. It's a common name in Hispanic countries (there is even a Jesus who plays for Manchester City!), and many through our country may only know Jesus as a swear word or in vaguely remembered stories. It may be helpful to approach a fresh discovery of the Christ, as Yeshua, the Hebrew/Aramaic name for Jesus.

May you discover afresh this Christmas joy, peace, love, hope... discover afresh the Christ, Jesus... Yeshua.

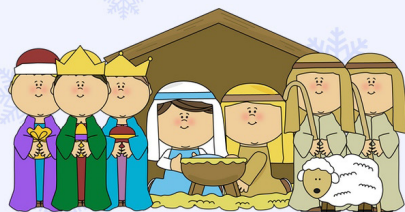

WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP

A new film version of 'Rebecca' has just been released, based on the 1938 novel by Daphne Du Maurier but I don't suppose there are many people who would have watched a stage version by The Westcott Players at the Hut on March 26 1949.

WLHG have quite a number of programmes of productions by the Westcott Players in the 1940/50s era and they list some pretty impressive



names who were heavily involved at that time. Principally Lady Eva Touche from Broomfield (see left) - Eva was prepared to do anything to support the Players, including

scrubbing the steps to the stage. Leslie Howard's wife did the make-up for several years. The Illingworth family living in Broomhills on Logmore Lane were frequent performers and it was in November 1949 that daughter Prunella first trod the boards in 'The Witch' by John Masefield. She is better known today as Prunella Scales.

Another lady who later became a professional actress was Patricia Lawrence, probably best known for

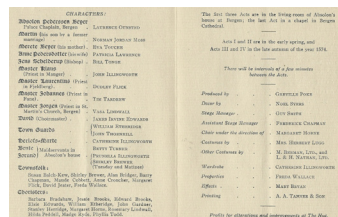
television series drama 'Tenko' but had small parts in many other well-known BBC productions. She also appeared in the films 'A Room with a View' and 'Howards End'. Her husband was Greville Poke, who also acted and produced for the Players. He was an arts administrator and a founding member of the English Stage Company and it was his role in a long drawn out battle with the Lord Chamberlain in the 1960s that led to the 1968 Theatres Bill, which abolished the censorship of plays.

Norman Jordan-Moss, CMG, CB, a formidable senior civil servant. He forged a close relationship with President and Eva Peron whilst spending 6 months in Argentina negotiating a beef deal. In Belgrade he supervised British aid to Yugoslavia, which entailed frequent meetings with Tito, and he spent his last night there celebrating with the secret police colonel who had been tailing him!

The Players adopted professional standards and practices such as ringing a bell and announcing the production would be starting in so many minutes among others. Dare we hope that if and when we get a new 'village hall' on the site of the Hut that we could again enjoy the particular pleasures of amateur plays, musicals and pantomimes.

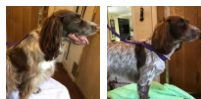

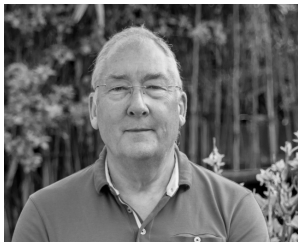

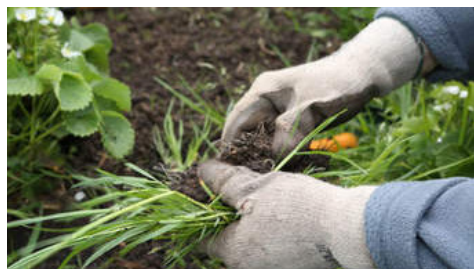

All Saints Pause Day

On Friday, 23rd October, the whole school spent a day reflecting on the meaning of All Saints Day for Christians. It was a day of exploration and creativity, resulting in the children expressing their thoughts, opinions and ideas through discussion and art.

Last year, we changed our school name to incorporate All Saints and our school vision is as follows:

We are rooted in the love of God and others, we believe in ourselves and so, will aspire to grow in every part of our lives. Following the example from All Saints, we choose to respect and encourage one another and to be responsible citizens in our community and our world.

Therefore, we wanted to celebrate our community and the Core Values that we follow. We spent the whole day

exploring the meaning of All Saints Day for Christians. All Saints Day is the day Christians remember and give thanks for every saint. It is celebrated on 1st November and demonstrates that saints are ordinary people who loved God.

Each class chose a saint which they thought represented our Core Values and explored what we, as a school, could learn from them. Our local church in Abinger is named and dedicated to him.

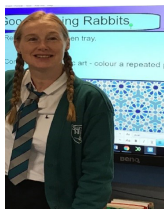
In KS2, the children investigated a range of saints, making links between their deeds and our school Core values. The children channelled their ideas into a colourful array of stained glass windows.

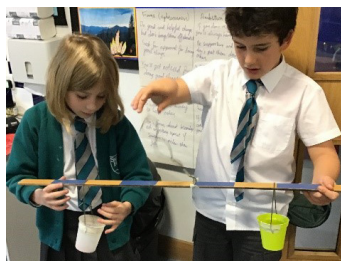

Jump Surrey" has been awarded through central Government to local authorities across the county and will provide eligible households up to £10,000 to improve the energy efficiency of their homes.

In addition to the Government's grant, Surrey County Council is contributing £750,000 to the "Green Jump Surrey" project as top-up funding to cover the full cost of works.

Eligible owner-occupied households can use the funding to install energy efficiency improvements including loft, solid wall, cavity wall and park home insulation, to keep their home warm. Air source heat pumps and solar hot water systems can also be funded in addition to insulation works, to further help save on energy bills and reduce carbon emission.



Private and social housing landlords can receive up to £5,000 to cover two-thirds the cost of installing solid wall insulation. If you are living in a hard-to-heat home and either in receipt of a means tested benefit or have a total

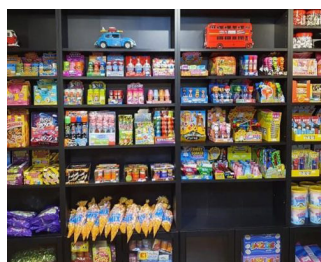
gross annual household income of less than £30,000, you could be eligible for funding.

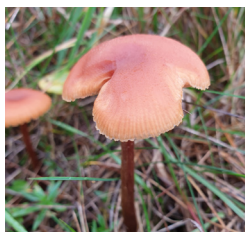

We also had a donation from a local resident Jane Button, a Ginko tree, a species of tree that was around during the dinosaur period and part of the Pine family. Thank you Jane, the Ginko is now in a place of prominence at the woodland.

How sad that the pandemic is creating so much uncertainty about how we will be able to celebrate the festive season this year. Who can we see? Where can we go? What can we do?

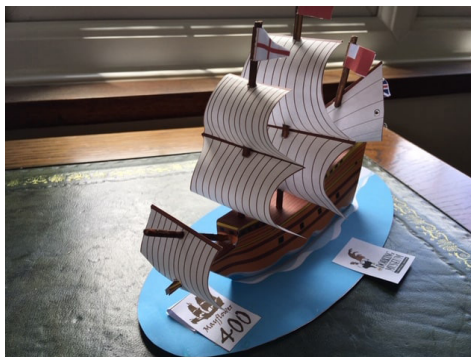
Looking on the bright side, in the middle of the 17th century, Parliament effectively 'banned' Christmas altogether! The Puritans believed that the Catholic celebration was a sinful extravagance fuelled by immorality – their mission was to cleanse the country of decadence. Even mince pies were banned! Abolished in 1644, it was not until the Restoration in 1660 that Christmas could be celebrated again – although pro-Christmas protests took place, and seasonal revelry undoubtedly continued behind closed doors in the interim.

The Museum was making seasonal plans for re-opening when the latest lockdown was announced. So, anything included here is subject to the progress and duration of the lockdown and any subsequent regulation and guidelines. Hopefully, by the time this magazine is published, all will have become clearer (and, hopefully, easier).

A GREENER CHRISTMAS

Christmas 2020 is likely to be different in all sorts of ways, so how about making it a year when we take some time to think about a more sustainable way to be festive? Here are a few ideas - I'm sure you can think of many more...

Presents: 81 million unwanted presents are received each year, and at least one in ten of them end up in landfill. Could we cull our present list? Tricky one that - might cause family mutiny! Or at least find out exactly what people would actually like? And remember that when we spend money, we're casting a vote for the kind of world we want. Which is likely to mean local, fair-trade, homemade, handmade, sustainably sourced, ethical products, rather than mass-produced tat. Have a look at ethicalshop.org, traidcraftshop.co.uk (for Traidcraft, order through Jan Way), ethicalsuperstore.com or look for lovely handmade gifts on etsy.com/uk, zero waste shops like fetchemcupboard.co.uk, or from the countless artisan makers and producers in our area. You could gift 'experiences' or memberships. And homemade, edible presents always go down really well...

Wrapping: 27,000 miles of wrapping paper is used each year in the UK alone. And much of it ends up in landfill. At all costs we should avoid paper with glitter, or that's shiny. (TOP



TIP: if you can scrunch the paper into a ball and it stays scrunched, it can go in the recycling, providing there's no glitter. If it 'unscrunches' itself...it can't.) And then there's sticky tape, which is likely to contaminate the recycling too. I did see some plastic free sellotape in Waitrose the other day, or you can buy paper-based Washi tape, which comes in all kinds of colours and patterns and is apparently 'a thing'. Who knew...

I'm still working through a massive roll of brown paper I bought online a couple of years ago! I stamp stars/snowflakes on it once I've wrapped. You could follow the Japanese (Furoshiki) style of using fabric to wrap - using vintage headscarves from charity shops or ebay.co.uk would be lovely. Use proper ribbon that can be reused over and over (I have a ribbon jar, and I love it)

Tree: If you already have an artificial tree...cherish it, love it, and keep using it for as long as humanly possible. Certainly more sustainable than chucking it out or buying a new one. If you like a real one, try Charlie's Farm in Newdigate - dig it up, roots and all,

and plant it in the garden to use each year, or if you have a cut one, at least look out for the council recycling sites after Christmas.

Food: The equivalent of 5 million Christmas puddings and 2 million turkeys end up in the bin each year - the leftovers that don't get eaten when everyone's fed up with curry/fricassee/pie/risotto etc. This year we're unlikely to be able to feed more than 6 people on Christmas Day anyway so let's think about what size turkey we actually need, and how many variations those 6 people can bear! Buy local if possible - try foodfloat.org. You can get all the veg from them too.

Stockings: it's tricky for kids but can we resist the temptation to fill them with cheap plastic tat, most of which ends up in the bin, and heads swiftly to landfill? It's a challenge but how about bits and bobs you know will be used and/or loved, edible gifts, books etc. Try the ethical shopping sites in the presents section, and why not pop in a bamboo toothbrush - another way to ditch some of the plastic!

Crackers: More often than not covered in shiny un-recyclable paper, filled with plastic tat, and shipped from China - not the planet's friend. Making your own isn't difficult (cardboard loo rolls and wrapping paper basically) and there are lots of tutorials online, or if

that's a step too far, you could buy 'fill your own' crackers through etsy (there are some beautiful ones made of fabric you can reuse each year) or ebay. Or M&S have some this year too...all elements recyclable. And put something in them that you know people will use/enjoy (though I have to admit those mini screwdrivers can be very useful....)

Decorations: 500 tonnes of fairy lights are thrown away each year. Whaaaaat?? They break, fact of life but don't forget they can go in the electrical recycling at the tip. Look out for energy saving LED fairy lights if you need new ones. And if you want something new, how about drying some orange/lemon



slices in the oven (they smell lovely too) and hang them on the tree or round the house. Gather pinecones from the woods, bundle up cinnamon sticks, make gingerbread biscuits and hang them on the tree. Get the kids making paper chains, or popcorn chains (though you might end up with rather fewer than you thought!)

CLANDON WOOD NATURE RESERVE

If you go down to the woods today, Clandon Wood to be exact, you're sure of a big surprise!

I first went to Clandon Wood Nature Reserve and Natural Burial Ground years ago – when it first opened. They had an open day inviting people to experience another way to consider what happens when you die - to think, perhaps slightly out of the box, about what you might want for your own funeral. A seed was sown in my head at that time - there is another way, possibly a more environmentally responsible way, to deal with the inevitable: the disposal of my body.

Time has moved on and now, in these days of obvious global warming, perhaps it is even more important than ever to consider the impact on the environment of how our bodies end their days on this earth. So, having trained as a celebrant to conduct weddings and funerals, I went along to Clandon Wood Nature Reserve and Natural Burial Ground, nestling between the villages of East and West Clandon, and spent some time talking to Simon Ferrar the founder, whose vision for this site was planted after attending his own aunt's funeral many years before. He came away feeling there must be another way.

A middle-aged man with an open face, bright eyes and a cheerful smile,

Simon, took me on a tour of the site. I hopped onto the back of the golf buggy and we headed off across the wild meadowland, which on this autumn day was not perhaps at its best – but as with all things in nature, no matter what the time of year, there is always plenty to see.



Groundsmen who are passionate about the environment manage the land.

Simon, a former builder, explained to me how, after a number of years searching for some land, this parcel came up for sale and he just knew it was the one. The 31 acres are managed carefully by grounds men who are passionate about the environment. There are separate areas across the land consisting of wildflower meadows, native trees, wetland, lakes and new woodland areas.

The place has a magical feel and as we made our way past some pollarded trees near the larger of two ponds, a clutch of brightly coloured pheasants could be seen scratching around in

the tall grass. We mused about how they had sought refuge at the Nature Reserve in order to avoid the shooting season!

Future planting of coppice species of hazel and chestnut will ensure an increase in woodland biodiversity, which in turn, with the changing of the seasons, provides good food sources for butterflies and insects. These of course create a food chain for those further up, namely the birds, owls and mammals that also frequent the space. There is a natural balance, a yin and yang where everything is working together with nature, not against it.

As we continued our tour, Simon pointed out areas used for the interment of ashes, another service that Clandon Wood offers. There has been an increase in demand for this service in more recent years and there are specific areas set aside for the purpose. The ashes are not scattered but in a rather more considered way, buried in biodegradable urns so as not to upset the balance of the environment.

Natural ways to manage the land

Each part of the land is naturally and carefully considered – for example, the grass is mown once a year and made into hay for horses. Beautiful Suffolk sheep frolic about grazing the land over autumn and winter, bringing further benefits to biodiversity, resulting

in an increase in the presence of birds, insects and pollinators.

As we continued wending our way around this little piece of 'heaven', Simon brought my attention to the 'bug hotel'. Initially created in the early days to encourage insects to settle, he told me how the hotel had only been open a few days when a robin took up residence there instead! How clever Mr Robin was, to make his nest within the confines of his very own 'fast food' joint!

Reflective, peaceful spaces

There are also areas set aside for people to sit and reflect on their friends and family who may have already passed – beautiful contemplative spaces dotted around, where birds can be seen and heard flying past and nesting in the trees. The large lake, now well established, contains a hive of biodiversity, with the sound of frogs more recently being heard and migrating birds stopping en route to warmer climes, with coots and other waterfowl having also made their homes here.

CLANDON WOOD NATURE RESERVE (cont.)

As the sky began to darken and rain to gently fall, we stopped to look at some graves. No headstones adorn these places, no statues mark the spot, just a simple wooden or stone plaque but more often than not, nothing. Nothing but the land, just as it was intended to be, as Mother Nature would have it. The most natural thing in the world – to give back to the earth – to nourish the soil. Here, the deceased are buried only 3' 6" under, not 6 feet or more as with a conventional burial. The shallower grave helps with the decomposition of the body, allowing a quicker transition back to the earth.

I stopped and considered this place – the autumn leaves changing in all their different hues, decorating the space with vibrant colours, a celebration of the short lives that they have just lived this past year! Soon, they will have fallen to the ground to once more be absorbed into the earth – offering sustenance back to the land to be renewed again in the spring, and so the circle of life continues.

As the rain became relentless, we moved on again, crisscrossing the land, – whilst the black faces of the Suffolk sheep bleat and move out of our way as they watch us pass. We moved under beech, hornbeam, lime and oak trees, all native species to this land and growing symbiotically with everything around it.

A natural place to mourn and celebrate

Simon has created a place to mourn and celebrate which sits naturally within the land. A dual-purpose, sustainable space, on the one hand a burial site and on the other a nature reserve each purpose complimenting the other perfectly.

Even the glass pavilion which gives panoramic views across the nature reserve, seems somehow to disappear into the landscape. It is as if Simon's presence here has been embraced by the land as a thank you for all his efforts to leave no trace.



When thinking of my own funeral, I cannot think of many places that meet both my need to be at one with nature and also to preserve the beauty in nature that we still have left on this earth. We can try so hard in life to limit the effect we have on our planet, so it seems a shame not to continue this after our deaths.

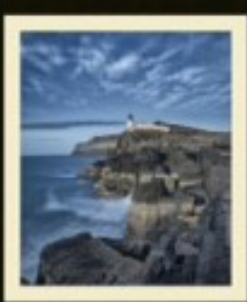

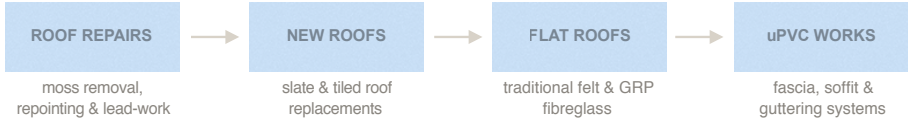

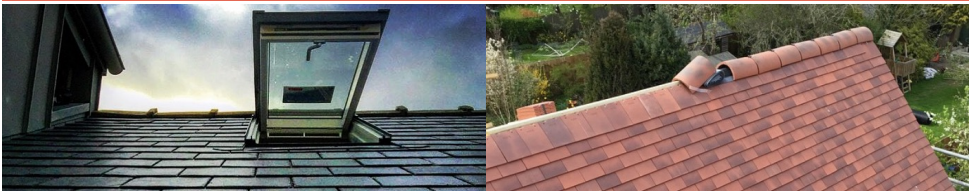
