I know it is very easy to put this magazine to one side and make a mental note to read it later (and sometimes never aet round to it!) but this is a very important form of communication with you, the residents of Westcott, and the WVA would really like to keep you up to date with what is happening in the village so...

PLEASE READ THIS NOW

At our September trustees' committee meeting we reviewed the membership discussion which took place at the AGM in June. The outcome of the committee's discussion is summarised below.

Perceptions of the WVA:

- The Trustees of the WVA are acutely aware that the committee is not representative of the social, geographic and demographic makeup of the village despite having made strenuous efforts to change things;
- They are also aware that some people in the community do not believe the WVA does things for

anyone other than a small, largely affluent section of the village.

 As a result of these views the WVA is often seen as irrelevant to the life of the village and people are unwilling to engage with what it does

What the WVA does:

Over the last four years the WVA has worked hard to address the concerns which almost 80% \circ f residents expressed in the Village Survey of 2013. These included:

- preserving the Green Belt through the monitoring of our Neighbourhood Development Plan
- ensuring newbuild dwellings meet the demand for 2 and 3 bedroom properties with parking spaces
- addressing speeding and noisy vehicles through the village
- addressing parking issues
- maintaining or improving local services
- improving the condition of our footpaths and bridleways especially with regard to dog fouling

A key question is "What should the WVA be doing?"

The committee needs the answers to some of the following questions:

- Is the WVA the right organisation to address village issues or is it time (after 47 years) to form a Parish Council or a



more representative village forum?

- How do we get a broader cross section of residents and particularly younger residents involved in what the village does?
- What do residents want Westcott to look and feel like in 20 years' time – what will we be doing differently?
- How do we ensure that more residents take an active part in decisions which affect the whole village?

These are issues which the Trustees want answers to, and would love to hear from residents about. Please start thinking about what you want in the future and be prepared to express those thoughts in another survey. The WVA exists to represent the whole village and this can only be achieved with ongoing input and feedback from you.

Speed-watch

You may have noticed that a Speedwatch Programme



was active during August at different locations in the village. This was a trial period with a small group of volunteers to identify whether the presence of people in high-viz jackets with a 'speed gun' would have a meaningful impact on vehicles coming through the village.

We are pleased to report that a majority of motorists noticeably slowed down – often expressing their thanks and appreciation of the efforts being made to improve the safety of our roads. Unfortunately, a small minority were somewhat less pleased to see us but over the course of the month, more than 200 warning letters were sent to speeding motorists by Surrey Police.

Given the success we've seen, we are looking to increase the number of volunteers so that we can run more sessions and have an ongoing presence. If you would like to volunteer your time for a minimum of 2 sessions (1-2 hours each) per month, please contact Nick Lund (nlund74@gmail.com).

THE HUT & THE READING ROOM

Update on behalf of the Trustees of The Hut and the Trustees of the Reading Room

I am sorry to say that it now looks unlikely that a new doctors' surgery can be built in the centre of Westcott. The provision of NHS funding is too uncertain to enable either the doctors or the trustees of the Hut or of the Reading Room to carry the financial risks involved. Never say never, but the likelihood is that the surgery will have to remain at Riverbank for so long as lease terms permit.

So what next? The Hut remains closed and derelict; the Reading Room is in better shape (and back open for business) but the structure will eventually need to be replaced. The consultants commissioned by the Reading Room to review all options have delivered their report. Their findings indicate that once the footprint required for a new village hall and the construction costs are deducted from such residential land value as the remainder of the two plots might have to a developer, there will not be much of a surplus to set aside for future maintenance of the new building. Letting fees from clubs, events and parties are never going to provide much of an income. In other words, even a 'new village hall only' scheme has its risks.

What is certain, is that any and all further steps in exploring the options and the costs of applying for outline planning permission, securing the necessary Charity Commission approvals and reaching a fully negotiated deal with whatever developer will offer best value will incur substantial costs. The Hut has no funds at all, so all costs would need to be borne by the Reading Room. Understandably, the Reading Room trustees have concluded that before any further costs are incurred, they need the certainty that both sites are under their control.

The Reading Room trustees have therefore put a proposal to the Hut trustees, the outcome of which would be a Charity Commission-approved merger which would leave the Reading Room trustees in sole control of both sites. Holidays and illnesses have so far prevented the Hut trustees from meeting to consider the Reading Room's proposal. It is also fair to say that the Hut trustees are wishing to explore options for going it alone.

By the time this magazine appears in print, this process will hopefully have reached some sort of conclusion. It is not impossible that after over two years of debate between the two sets of trustees, and the doctors (whose valuable input into the thinking I gratefully acknowledge), the Joint Working Party will have run its course.

Future Mole Valley



- Economy


COVID Update

Afghan refugees in Surrey

Like other areas, Surrey is working hard to support those from Afghanistan that helped keep us safe.

Local agencies across the county are working in partnership several local districts and boroughs have opened their doors to help house individuals and families fleeing to the UK. Surrey County Council is also working closely with District and Boroughs, health providers, the voluntary and charity sector, other local partners and central government to ensure families can be resettled safely.

While the initial need was to find accommodation to house people once they have completed their stay through Managed Quarantine Service hotels, there are wider needs to be considered, including health, social integration and basic supplies.

Many people have been asking how they can help. Due to operational and logistical challenges, as well as COVID control considerations, Surrey County Council are asking that any donations at this point are financial ones, to charities that are best equipped immediately support Afghan refugees. The Community Foundation for Surrey has an emergency fund in place to administer donations locally and information on how to donate can be found on their website www. cfsurrey.org.uk



Alternatively, the Red Cross are already active in managing donations and supporting arrivals from Afghanistan, and wider local support will be needed from foodbanks and other charities, which can be found via Surrey Information

WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP



On 9th May 2017 Julie Wileman gave us a lecture about 'The Town of Dorking'. There are a number of historical buildings, especially the pubs, in Dorking.

From being an agricultural village Dorking became a staging post on Stane Street, the Roman Road running from London to Chichester in Roman times. It appears in the Domesday Book in 1086 as the Manor of Dorchinges held by William the Conqueror and it rendered £18 per year to its overlord. Subsequent Lords of the Manor included the Dukes of Norfolk who lived in Dorking but later moved to Arundel. In medieval times it was a prosperous agricultural market town with milling and brewing businesses, with some lime works and brick making. In the 18th century around 1750 the White Horse Hotel was established as a staging post. It was originally called the 'Cross House' which had belonged to the Knights Hospitaliers from 1278. Many of the pubs in Dorking date back to medieval times.

The church of St Martin was rebuilt in 1866 and 1873 when the lofty spire, 200 ft high, was raised as a memorial to Bishop Samuel Wilberforce, the famous campaigner against slavery. Stane Street passed through the NW corner of the churchyard.

Dorking was well known for its wheat and cattle market held in the main street and an area now occupied by St Martins shopping precinct and car park. Stage coaches using the turn pike from London to Brighton

disappeared when the railways were built in the late 19th century.

We hope to hear more from Julie Wileman about the colourful history of our local town – known as 'the town with a view' on account of its outlook to Ranmore and over the Weald.

The Good Shepherd Trust (GST) is the authority for Surrey Hills All Saints Primary School (School Lane, Westcott, RH4 3QF). The GST, is consulting on a proposed change, designed to ensure the long-term sustainability of Surrey Hills All Saints Primary School.

What is the proposed change?

Due to pressing financial concerns, the GST is proposing to close the Reception/ Key Stage 1 (KS1) site at Abinger, consolidating everything onto the Westcott Site

How can I respond to the consultation?

The consultation will run from Wednesday 8th September 2021 to 12:00PM on Wednesday 6th October 2021. Please visit the Surrey Hills All Saints website, the GST website or use the link at the end of this document. A link will be available on both the school and GST websites. If you require a paper copy of the response form, please request this via admin@goodshepherdtrust.org.uk or phone 01483 910210. It must be returned by 6th October 2021. There will be an informal stakeholders' meeting on Thursday 30th September from 6:00pm-7:00pm at the Westcott site.

Pupil Population

Surrey Hills All Saints is a split-site primary school, formed through an amalgamation of two village schools in 2010. There is capacity for 300 children across both sites. 210 children can be accommodated on the Westcott site and 90 on the Abinger site. Surrey Hills All Saints is not currently achieving its Published Admission Number (PAN) of 30 pupils in Reception and future pupil projections are not favourable. Falling birth rates mean the proportion of school-age children in Surrey and the Mole Valley is declining. In the previous academic year (2020/21), there were 44 pupils in Year 6 and 41 in Year 5. At the Abinger site, there were 9 pupils in Reception, 21 in Year 1 and 19 in Year 2. We have had 13 pupils joining Reception in this new academic year. The total number of pupils on roll 2021/22 is 181.

Funding

As schools are funded on a per pupil basis, there has been a sharp decline in funding in recent years.

Proposal

It is proposed that the school sites should be rationalised. The Westcott site has the space to accommodate up to seven classes of 30 children (Reception through to Year 6 inclusive), therefore the following actions are proposed: since 2012, the number on roll (NOR) has dropped by over 100 pupils since 2017/18.


- Move Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 pupils (43 children) to the Westcott site during the current academic year (date dependent on decision making process and approval by DfE)
- Ensure pupils currently educated at Abinger move into refurbished, ageappropriate accommodation on the Westcott site.
- A capital funding project commences at Westcott to reconfigure and improve outside play areas and internal areas for the whole pupil population.
- A travel plan will be in place to allow parents several options for a safe and efficient morning drop-off and afternoon pickup.

This consultation is open between 12 noon on 8th September and 12 noon on 6th October 2021. If you submit your response after this date, it will not be counted. Registration is at 9.30 in the morning and the day will end at 4.45.

The Dorking Concertgoers has a full season of concerts planned, beginning with a recital by the Dorking-based guitarist Fiona Harrison. Fiona is a brilliant performer on her instrument and her programme is an unusually wide-ranging one, with music dating from the renaissance up to the present time, and embracing many styles from sedate dances to evocative Spanish music and even some jazz!

Looking ahead to November, the Dorking Choral Society has an exciting concert on the theme of The Sea, including Stanford's Songs of the fleet, two movements from Vaughan Williams' Sea Symphony and Elgar's Sea Pictures. The team at Dorking Museum looks forward to welcoming visitors in October. We note that Friday 1st October is officially 'National Smile Day', the message of which is "Do an act of kindness. Help one person smile". We hope that another month of free museum entry will make you smile!

'Darking 1620': The Museum's current special exhibition, postponed from



2020, marks the 400th anniversary of the sailing of The Mayflower. Dorking shoemaker

William Mullins – whose house survives in West Street – was one of six Dorking residents who sailed on the Mayflower, and his daughter, Priscilla, is sometimes known as 'the mother of a nation'. At that time, Dorking – known as 'Darking' – was a relatively modest market town for the surrounding villages and farms, holding regular markets and well

provided with shops, mills and inns.

The impressive new exhibition, 'Darking 1620', weaves the story of the six pilgrims from Dorking who undertook that perilous voyage to the New World with an examination of 17th century life in the town they left behind.

The exhibition focuses on life in Dorking when Mullins and his fellow pilgrims lived in the town, looking at farming and the food that people ate, the kind of domestic buildings that they lived in, and the clothes that they wore, and seeing how those changed when they reached the colony. Through those themes we can learn something of the lives of the shoemaker, and his fellow traveller, the weaver Peter Brown.

Although the exhibition was delayed by a year and the pandemic impacted on its planning and preparation, it also allowed extra time and opportunity for 'behind closed doors' development of its special features. These include male

displays of locally found 17th century shoes and replicas made by local saddler Julia Forsyth of the kinds of materials and tools that Mullins would have used in his trade, and a detailed cross-section model of the Mayflower and its fittings and contents – the hard work of the team at The Dorking Men's Shed, whose magnificent Mayflower planters have already been seen bringing colour to the town through two summers.





GREEN WESTCOTT COMMUNITY GARDEN

When we held our stall at WestFest this year one of the most popular ideas for Green Westcott was a community garden. So this month we thought we would lay out exactly what this is and how we as a community, might set about getting this idea off the ground.

What is a community garden?

It pretty much does what it says on the tin – it is a piece of land managed by the community, to grow flowers, herbs, fruits and vegetables, for the benefit of the community.

How do we go about setting one up in Westcott?

Unfortunately, they were not able to offer us a piece of land to use, but instead suggested contacting our local councillor James Friend, and/or the Westcott Village Association. So we did both! And James Friend and Tim Way (Chair of WVA) were both very helpful in pointing us in another direction which, at the moment, looks very promising!


Creating windows of opportunity





WEST HORSLEY PLACE REVEALED

Earlier this year, June Davey, local historian and volunteer steward at West Horsley Place, shared with u3a members its rich history and stories associated with West Horsley Place.



Horseledge, an Anglo-Saxon village situated near the present house was first owned by Danes until King William handed the estate over to Walter FirzOtha (the family name later changed to De Windsor) after the Norman Conquest. The Manor of West Horsley was acquired by Ralph de Berners in 1271, probably because his wife Christina was the heiress of the previous owner, Hugh de Windsor.

For the next 260 years, the de Berners and Bourchier families held the manor but when John Bourchier defaulted on a debt to the king, Henry VIII took possession of the property who retained ownership until his death in 1547. It was handed down to Sir Anthony Browne and Lady Elizabeth Fitzgerald (The Fair Geraldine) who are said to have welcomed Queen Elizabeth I stayed at there as their guest.

From 1590 to 1642 the Montague family were in residence and Guy Fawkes worked there as a footman. When the house passed to Sir Walter Raleigh's son Carew, he converted the old Tudor single storey manor house and added the red-brick facade and installed the first and second floors along with staircases to make what essentially the house is today. Legend has it that Sir Walter Raleigh's embalmed head was kept within its walls by his devoted wife.

In 2014, Bamber and Christina Gascoigne inherited the property and gifted it to a newly formed trust, The Mary Roxburghe Trust who restored the house and have managed it ever since.

Because the 15th-century manor house is filled with untouched rooms and is surrounded by walled formal gardens and 18th century farm buildings, it has been the setting for many film and TV productions such as The Crown, the Durrell's and Howards End.
