

STILLE NACHT... REMEMBERING **CHILDHOOD** CHRISTMAS IN **GERMANY**

The time leading up to Christmas has always been very special in Germany, particularly during my childhood, when commercialisation had not yet taken part of the mystery away. It was a time of reflection, preparation and anticipation, a gradual buildup to the magic of Christmas Eve. It gathered momentum as the days and weeks passed.

We always had an advent calendar, each little window with surprise picture behind it, until the 24th revealed what we were waiting for, the nativity.

It all started with the 1st of Advent. We sat together in the long dark evenings, lighting the candles one by one on the advent wreath, (nearly every home had one), and we sang carols and started making small decorations for the windows and to hang on the pine branches that we brought into the houses: straw stars and snowflakes or little animals made of wood and coloured paper.

St. Nicholas, der Heilige Nikolaus, proved to be very helpful when he came on the eve of the 6th of December, because he left not only nuts and sweets in our shoes (which we had polished thoroughly and left by the front door) but also material for decorations and presents for family and friends: strands of cotton and wool to embroider bookmarks or small tablecloths, or to stitch initials into a handkerchief, and coloured paper and card to make a small nativity scene. It never occurred to me then that we would not make our presents.

We also prepared a short programme of poetry and music for Christmas Eve

and practised a special piece on the piano or another instrument and a TRANSFORMED, AND learned a Christmas poem by heart. I can still recite auite a number of them today.

> As my father was the organist and choirmaster of the local church, we were much involved in the rehearsals for the annual carol concert and the nativity play, a mini Christmas oratorio with bible readings, solo performances, poetry recitals, choir

and congregational singing. It was the culmination of all our preparation and rehearsals, very magical and solemn. I remember my mother who had a beautiful alto voice singing 'Drei Kōn'ge wandern aus Morgenland' when the three kings arrived to offer their gifts to the child in the manger and the world was transformed and full of wonder.

But that was not all, the magic continued at home. We were banned from entering the living room all day. It had become the Christmas room. We noticed that the Christmas tree which we had chosen and brought back from my uncle's farm some days before had been taken to the special room and my parents were busy in there while we were playing outside in the snow. We nearly always had snow.

When we returned from church we had a simple meal and then we waited impatiently for the arrival of Opa and Oma and Tante Marie, who were very much part of our celebrations. At last they arrived and we heard a little bell and my father played the Christmas song 'Ihr Kinderlein kommet' (Come little children). The door opened and there was the Christmas tree with real candles and the presents underneath, not wrapped in paper but covered by an embroidered cloth. The wonderful Christmas ornaments from the Erzgebirge



(Ore Mountains) where my mother came from, were all displayed and lit by real candles. It all looked overwhelming and we entered this special Christmas world. We sang the old traditional carols, recited our poem and played our piece on the piano. My father or Opa read the Christmas story as told in the Luther Bible. When we were older we also read it in the foreign languages we learned at school, English and Russian, but that was later.

After this we had the Bescherung, the exchanging of presents. My mother lifted the cloth and there were the precious gifts: always books, perhaps some new furniture for the dolls' house, an extension for my brother's model railway, maybe new skates or skis or a new doll or just some new dolls clothes. There was always a Bunter Teller for each of us, a plate with Christmas goodies: nuts, sweets, gingerbread cookies and fruit, normally apples, but one year there was even an orange; what luxury!

Then we would present our homemade gifts, the bookmark, embroidered cloth or knitted oven cloth. My brothers were good at drawing and painting and would give a picture. Everything was gratefully received and admired.


Later, my father made Glühwein (mulled wine) and we tasted my mother's stollen, the Christmas cookies and gingerbread. We were allowed to stay up until we fell asleep.

There was no pressure to wake up early on Christmas morning, no stocking as in England, just playing with the new toys or reading the new book until it was time to go to the Christmas Day service. That was festive again with the choir singing and we had roast goose and red cabbage and dumplings for our Christmas meal. But it was nothing like Christmas Eve!

This is why I choose Stille Nacht, Heilige Nacht (Silent Night) as my special Christmas song.

Now that I am in England, I still celebrate Christmas Eve and its magic and mystery with my family and we exchange our gifts. But on Christmas Day the English family takes over and there are stockings and crackers and parlour games and a really jolly 'birthday' party. I have the best of both worlds!

THE DISTRICT COUNCILLOR WRITES ...



Boundary Commission Review Update Thank you to anyone who has completed the Boundary Commission Review feedback that I mentioned in the November edition.

If you haven't followed the review so far, Mole Valley District Council have decided to move to a system of annual elections across the District and as such from 2023 District Council wards will be made up of three members each and cover around 5,900 electors.

The Local Government Boundary Commission for England has the task of recommending the new wards boundaries and are interested to hear (before 6th December) which roads residents think make up which communities. The consultation can be found here: https://consultation. lgbce.org.uk/node/30046

If you have already had a play with the Electoral Forecast tool on their website you will have worked out that there are a number of potential models that could make this new warding pattern work, including:



• Westcott could merge into the north or west of Dorking,



• Westcott could join t o g e t h e r with all the villages from Mickleham to Ockley.

The review is your chance to have your say on what makes up our community.

As part of the support programme business grant funding is available from Invest4 Grant Funding. Established, growing businesses looking to take the next step can be awarded up to $\pounds170,000$ and awards of up to $\pounds5,000$ can be made to start-up businesses. The type of grant fund offered is known as 'match-funding', where a business has to provide 60% of the required investment to which the Invest4 fund will then 'match-fund' the 40% balance. Housing and Homelessness

The Housing team at Mole Valley continue to work hard to prevent homelessness wherever possible.

Currently the team are managing numbers of households bed and breakfast accommodation at low levels, and most recently in single figures, and this is the aim. The use of self-contained units and the Council's own stock of emergency accommodation are the preferred choices and especially for families with children.

To get rapidly support to people who find themselves in need, members of the public can help the council team by reporting sightings of rough sleepers through Streetlink which is a website which allows the gathering of information and locations of rough sleepers so that our outreach workers can engage swiftly with them. As the temperatures fall, your action could make all the difference to a rough sleeper this winter.

Going Green

The Council has relaunched the Going Green pages of their website to highlight the things residents can do to lead by example.



Recycling helps to save some of the materials that are thrown away. However, manufacturing products and transporting them to where they are sold uses a significant amount of energy, as does collecting them from residents and recycling them into new products. Reducing the amount of waste produced will make a significant positive environmental impact.

There are simple actions that can be

taken to both reduce the amount of waste produced and save money.

• When you are thinking of buying something new, ask yourself if you really genuinely need it.

• For devices which need batteries, switch to rechargeable ones

• Drink tap water from your own bottle rather than buying bottled water (the Refill Mole Valley scheme, which allows you to fill your water bottle up for free within the district).

• Where possible, use your own cup for takeaway coffees rather than a single-use cup

• Take reusable bags when shopping

• Choose products without, or with less packaging

• Shop in Zero-waste stores, such as Eco Be in Dorking

• Buy loose produce where possible, and use reusable fruit & veg bags

• Many products can be bought in small or large packets. Choose the larger ones whenever possible – this is likely to save money as well as producing less packaging waste

• Avoid products with unnecessary 'gift' packaging

Green Jump Surrey

£6.2 million has been made available to help 600 Surrey households save money on their energy bills. The funding for "Green Jump Surrey" has been awarded through central Government to local authorities across the county and will provide



eligible households up to $\pm 10,000$ to improve the energy efficiency of their homes.

In addition to the Government's grant, Surrey County Council is contributing £750,000 to the "Green Jump Surrey" project as top-up funding to cover the full cost of works. Eliaible owneroccupied households can use the funding to install energy efficiency improvements including loft, solid wall, cavity wall and park home insulation, to keep their home warm. Air source heat pumps and solar hot water systems can also be funded in addition to insulation works, to further help save on energy bills and reduce carbon emissions. Private and social housing landlords can receive up to £5,000 to cover two-thirds the cost of installing solid wall insulation.

If you are living in a hard-to-heat home and either in receipt of a means tested benefit or have a total gross annual household income of less than £30,000, you could be eligible for funding. As funding is time-limited, you are urged to contact the team as soon as possible on 0800 783 2503.

The Motor Cycle Problem in Westcott

If you think we have a problem with noisy motor cycles speeding through the village then read on, there were people complaining about them 115 years ago too! This article from the Parish Mag of 2001 shows that the problem was a little different then when Coast Hill was used for competitive hill climb racing by motorcycles with the encouragement of Mr Brooke of the Rookery Estate who owned the surrounding land.

MrCanter, the Westcott Representative, complained to the Rural District Council on Thursday 12th April 1906 and asked the Clerk if permission was given to anyone for the Council's highway to be used for motor cycle trials. 'The road at Coast Hill was used for this purpose on Saturday last and a great nuisance was caused by the dust raised by the excessive speed at which the machines travelled. Some of the bicycles must have been driven about 50 miles per hour.'



Reference to The Motor Cvcle published on 16th April 1906 reveals that the event in auestion was the Southern Motor Club's annual Hill Climb. This took place in good weather, attracted a record entry and was watched by a large crowd. "The actual start took place on a down grade, which gave the competitors a chance of gathering speed before reaching the incline. Observers provided with red flags to signal "road clear" were situated in sight of one another along the course, but the intervals between the competitors were irregular, and at times wearisome

We are also aware that other vehicles ascended and descended the hill at the same time. The police gave valuable assistance. The Surrey policeman, as a factor in the advancement of automobilism, appeared in a new role. He certainly had much to put up with, but he behaved like a man, though at times, when some motor cyclist took advantage of his good nature, he

called out 'Steady, sir! Go steady!'"

The Motor Cycle magazine also described the performance of each of the competitors. For example, "Hulbert was first up the hill, and standing close by the finishing post we had an excellent view of him riding magnificently, and travelling at a good speed. Wells came next on his twin-cylinder Vindec, soaring up the hill as if it were non-existent, and creating a great sensation among the competitors. His machine, contrary to the general Vindec practice, was fitted with accumulator ignition."The



competition for was both 'bicycles' and 'tricars'. The winner in the bicycle section

was Brice, driving a 3Yz h.p Brown. The fastest rider in the Tricar section was J F Buckingham on a 10 h.p. Lagonda but the overall winner, on handicap, was Hickson on a 4 h.p. C.I.E."

Although the event was adjudged a great success by the organisers, it was not only the villagers who were upset. Mr. C J Tracey of Dorking was unhappy for reasons that he spelled out in letters to the Dorking Advertiser and to Motor Cycling News. He claimed that in practice he had scaled the hill at an average time of 35 seconds for the $\frac{1}{2}$ mile, an excellent time given that the fastest run accomplished on the course at the Southern Motor Club meeting

was 42 seconds. On the day, however, competing on his 5hp Kelecon, geared 3 to 1, he was stopped by a steward after the first bend on account of the traffic. He got by but was understandably 'slow on the gear' and after passing the 1 in 8 bend, he was again stopped by an official. He let his machine 'drift over the line' and was given a pass for another run. On his second attempt he met a large car on the worst and steepest corner raising clouds of dust and was stopped again. Mr. Tracev claimed that he was then authorised to make a third attempt, which he completed without incident, only to be informed that this was not a legitimate run and his time was not ratified.

Other references to this event suggested that it was better organised than Mr Tracey claimed insofar the police were thanked for 'managing the keeping of the road, causing little if any inconvenience to traffic'. This was the last official motor cycle 'hill climb' at Coast Hill. The easing of the gradient and less demanding bends, coupled with rapid advances in the construction of motor cycles, prompted the Southern Motor Club to seek a more challenging site for future events. Coast Hill continued to be used as a test of bicycling proficiency where reliance was made on pedal power alone.

DORKING MUSEUM



Dorking Museum offers seasonal greetings to all readers and to the supporters and friends of the Museum. If you are in the town, why not drop into our shop for some Dorking themed cards, books or gifts? Or get away from the season's rushing around and take a leisurely browse around the Museum – there is always plenty to see and to find out about the heritage of our beautiful area.

Please note that the Museum will be closed over the main Christmas/ New Year period, during the weeks commencing 20th and 27th December, reopening on 6th January 2022.



The Museum's current special exhibition, **'Darking 1620'**, marks the 400th anniversary

of the sailing of The Mayflower and weaves the story of the six pilgrims from Dorking who undertook that perilous voyage to the New World with an examination of 17th century life in the town they left behind.

How different Christmas must have seemed to those who arrived in the New World on the Mayflower. Back in England, the Christmas season was marked by 12 days of merriment, with churchgoing, festive decorations and the giving of presents intermingled with widespread revelry, heavy feasting, excessive drinking, licentiousness and other excesses. However, the Puritans believed that the Catholic celebration was a sinful extravagance fuelled by immorality, leading some to conclude that England was no longer a country where the 'godly' could consent to live.

For the Mayflower passengers, there was little celebration of Christmas

in 1620. After searching the coast for a suitable place to settle, they landed at what became Plymouth Harbor on December 22nd. Although conditions on the Mayflower were cramped and squalid and its passengers weakened and in poor health, it was too late in the year to establish dwellings on land, so most of the settlers remained on board. The advance party reportedly spent Christmas Day building their village common house, which was to house many of the Pilgrims.

Although the settlement was better established the following year, the puritan ethic remained strong. Returning from the forest with a work party, Governor William Bradford of Plymouth Colony found some of those who chose to take Christmas Day off rather than work 'gaming and revelling' in the streets, which went against their strict religious beliefs, and they were severely reprimanded.



Merry Christmas!



With Christmas fast approaching it would be easy to get caught up in the consumerism that seems to have completely

overtaken the true meaning of this time of year. This year more than any other, with the UK having just hosted COP26, maybe it's time for us to think a little harder about how we can reduce our impact on the environment over the Christmas period.

So what how much of our Christmas food gets thrown away? 

When Charles I and the Royalists were defeated in 1646, Parliament ordered that the feasts of Christmas, Easter and Whitsun be abolished; it wasn't until Charles II was restored to the throne that he reversed the legislation that prohibited religious festivals.

Not so long ago, Christmas was just a working day. Shops remained open in the morning and people tended to celebrate in the afternoon and evening. It was not uncommon for couples to marry on Christmas Day in the 1800s because they didn't get paid when they didn't work which most could ill afford.

Christmas shopping is hardly a modern phenomenon - Prince Albert's enthusiastic importation of German Christmas traditions meant that shops would vie with each other to put on a magnificent show of their Christmas fare. In his book Surrey Christmas, John Hudson describes how Christmas was heralded by large displays of meat and poultry in shops and piles of pudding and dessert fruit in grocery windows. Dinner traditionally consisted of roast beef and plum pudding, and it was not unusual for a vacant chair to be left at table in memory of departed parents.

Surrey historian Matthew Alexander describes how the poor of the parish were not forgotten and would receive ingredients to make pancakes and pudding, and even clothing.

Young Victoria enjoyed many Christmases at Kensington Palace; in herjournal she describes how the Dining Room was prepared for Christmas Day: ''There were two large round tables

on which were placed two trees hung with baubles and sugar ornaments. All the presents being placed around the tree". According to historic documents, the food and drink served to Queen Victoria and her family on Christmas Day in 1899 included soup, fish courses, poultry, roast beef and pork, and a dessert of mince pies, plum pudding and orange marmalade.

Queen Charlotte first introduced the Christmas Tree to Britain in the 18th century but the fir tree that we know today can be traced back to Prince Albert in the 1840s. Images of Queen Victoria and her family gathered around the Christmas tree became so popular with the public, decorated trees appeared in many homes.



Now, plastic lawn decorations and flashing electric lights adorn many modern homes, but Surrey has a long history of Christmas decorations. In the early 1800s, Reigate's Christmas lights decorations were already being displayed in mansions and cottages. Dorking Town band and carol singers heralded the season by playing and singing in front of the homes of principal inhabitants.

The Dorking u3a speaker for December, Siobhan Clarke, has worked for the Historic Royal Palaces and authored many historical books. In *A Royal Christmas*, she explores Christmas at court from the middle ages to the present day and describes how royals have influenced our own celebrations.
