We are delighted to be able to provide matched funds to support these local initiatives and are actively looking for other local projects to consider. Get in touch with your ideas – we're keen to explore them!



If you have read the minutes of the last WVA Committee Meeting then you will know that succession-planning has been on the agenda. At the end of this year, I will have been Chairman for 5 years and during that time have initiated a number of changes to move the Association forward and change village perceptions of the organisation.

I have enjoyed the last 5 years and found it very rewarding but the future of the village lies with the younger generation and the changes we will need to make should rest in their hands with a new Chairman who can continue with drive and determination.

I will continue to involve myself in Village affairs and feel very strongly that we need at least to consider moving to become a Parish Council. How the new Mickleham, Westcott, & Oakwood Ward operates (see below) and what happens if Surrey County Council makes a decision on potentially moving to become a Unitary Authority will have significant implications for the District's Resident

Associations, not just Westcott's, and we should be planning ahead to at least be ready for the possible changes we would need to make.

I will lead a project to look into this and hope that others will join me to gather information and present the pros and cons of the idea to the village, so that you as residents can ultimately decide on the matter in a referendum. As we have seen nationally, making wellinformed choices is the key to future success.

The Boundary Commission has now published its decision on the new ward boundaries and, as expected, has made no changes from its draft proposals other than to rename the Leith Hill ward Mickleham.

Westcott, and Oakwood Ward. Three Councillors will represent this ward and the renaming at least gives some scope for Councillors to 'adopt' one of the areas to represent. How things operate in practice will be decided after elections are held in May 2023.

The latest news on the Local Plan can be found on the MVDC website under Future Mole Valley; the inspector has challenged the necessity to release the Westcott site (Mill Way) and the two sites on the west side of Dorking from the Green Belt. We await her final decisions but you can read the WVA's response on the Westcott Village web site under Planning.

organisations in the village to seek their input to putting forward Village Projects which can be initiated using CIL (Community Infrastructure Levy) monies. We are liaising with Mole Valley to ensure that we use the new system of fund allocation to our advantage. We asked for projects to be put forward by the end of September but we are always pleased to consider new projects as they arise.

### 150 and Out (well almost)

My records might not be completely correct, but I think this is my 150th edition of "District Councillor Writes" – don't worry I haven't concocted a quiz on the previous 149 for you.

The Local Government Boundary Commission for England has now announced that, subject to review by Parliament, Westcott will merge in with ten other local communities to join up democratic representation from the edge of Leatherhead to the West Sussex border from May next year and so there won't be that many more of these village specific articles to follow.

From May 2023 onwards, village residents will be electing a new councillor every year to the ward of Mickleham, Westcott & Okewood.

### The Need For Affordable Housing

Over the last three and a half years, Mole Valley District Council has been able to advertise 13 affordable homes for rent in Westcott.

With 993 dwellings in the village and a further 25 with planning permission, it is clear that the turnover of properties for affordable rent through the council is remarkably low.

This may or may not benchmark well with other village communities or be offset by "affordable" sales but what it does mean is that if you are a young family with a connection to the village that gets you a priority for such homes, then even so you are going to have a long wait for something suitable to come up.

That in turn has a knock on effect on who lives in our village, who uses our services and who supports our community – our GP surgery, our pub, our shops, our school.

If you think that you know of an opportunity to create more affordable homes for rent or own in our village, then please do let me know. I'd be happy to talk them through.

## Keeping Up Neighbourhood Appearances

I recently had the opportunity to take our new Clarion Housing Neighbourhood Officer around the village and to highlight a number of things that need to be fixed to either tidy up or to help resident safety. Thank you to everyone who had emailed me with their requests leading up to the visit.



The tree adjacent to the village green has now gone and the Council have thankfully repaired the grounds.



### Responsible and Safe Riding

Forestry England are keen to get the message out to our bike riding community that it is often unsafe to ride off the approved trackways in our local woods. Riding on unofficial bike trails may not be safe and could result in serious injury to riders or to other visitors. There may also be nearby foster work or m a c h i n e r y



creating further hazards and riding may damage sensitive areas of the forest, harming wildlife or historical features.

You can help protect our forests for everyone by only cycling in stone-surfaced forest roads, formal waymarked cycle trail and bridleways. To find great bike trails local visit forestryengland.uk/cycling

### THE DISTRICT COUNCILLOR WRITES... (cont.)

Some older people are especially at risk, either because scammers target them or because their circumstances make them vulnerable, for example if they are bereaved, lonely or living with dementia. The financial and health impacts can be devastating.

- Almost 5 million older people (65+) believe they have been targeted by scammers.
- People defrauded in their own homes are 2.5 times more likely to go into residential care within a year.
- People have lost an estimated £43 million to pension scammers since April 2014.



Age UK Surrey has been granted funding over two years to prevent hundreds of older people from becoming victims and to support those who have already been scammed so that they feel safer and less likely to be scammed again.

The charity aims to:

#### Tips for saving energy at home

Following the energy price cap announced by Ofgem, energy bills are set to increase significantly this month. Every household will be offered a £400 energy grant to help this winter, but this won't cover the extra cost. However, the Energy Saving Trust have some ways you can reduce your energy usage:

•Save £105 per year by turning down your thermostat down by 1 degree if it is



safe for you to do so

- Save up to £100 a year if you have a water meter by fitting a water efficient shower head (contact your provider as some provide for free)
- Save up to £67 a year if you have a water meter by reducing showers by one minute
- Save £65 a year by draught proofing your chimney when not in use
- Save £60 a year by drying clothes on racks/outside rather than in the tumble dryer
- Save £55 a year by switching off standby

- Save £55 a year by replacing old bulbs with LEDs
- Save £45 a year by draught proofing windows and doors
- Save £28 a year by washing at 30 degrees and do one less wash a week
- Save £20 a year by turning off lights when not needed.

### MUSIC IN DORKING

This month marks the 150th anniversary of the birth of Ralph Vaughan Williams. He was one of England's finest composers, noted for his many choral works and nine symphonies. He had close connections to Dorking, spending most of his childhood at nearby Leith Hill Place, later living in Dorking itself, and being for nearly fifty years the first conductor of the Leith Hill Music Festival. Fittingly, his statue now stands directly outside the Dorking Halls.

The occasion will be marked in a concert given by the English Arts Chorale and Orchestra, conducted by Leslie Olive, which will feature Vaughan Williams' first two symphonies. These are the Sea symphony, a highly dramatic piece with chorus, and the London symphony, a portrait of a city Vaughan Williams came to know well.

The Leith Hill Festival will also celebrate with a 'Come and Sing' – a day devoted to the music of RVW. Under the direction of the festival's conductor, Jonathan Willcocks, participants will be able to rehearse three of his choral works – the Fantasia on Christmas Carols, Five English Folksongs, and Toward the Unknown Region - finishing with an informal concert performance of the three pieces. This will be an excellent opportunity to explore these works under the inspired leadership of a renowned and enthusiastic choral conductor. The cost of £25 includes copies of the music and the day begins with registration at 9.45am.

The Dorking Concertgoers begin their new concert season with a visit from the Vienna Mozart Trio, a group comprising piano, violin and cello. They are noted especially for their performances of the Viennese classics, and their programme includes two trios by Mozart and one by Mendelssohn. The Concertgoers will pay their own tribute to Vaughan Williams in their next concert, a piano duet recital in November, when two RVW works will be included.

The Dorking Chamber Orchestra's concert will begin with the overture to Mozart's opera Don Giovanni, followed by Haydn's cello concerto no.2 with soloist Filippo Ramaciotti, a young student from the Yehudi Menuhin school. The concert will finish with Gounod's first symphony.

There are also two screenings at the Dorking Halls from the Royal Opera House – these are Verdi's Aida (12th) and Puccini's La bohème (20th).

### The Rise and Demise of Attlee's Seed Company in Dorking



Attlee's Seed
Company was
founded in 1788
by Corn Merchant
John Attlee who
was the great

grandfather of Clement Attlee. As many people may remember Clement Attlee was a member of the War Cabinet with Winston Churchill during WWII and subsequently became Prime Minister at the election in 1945.

The business was a family affair and the premises were in the High Street until 1839 when Richard Attlee, John's eldest son, leased the Parsonage Mill site in Station Road from Denbies Estate. The business was rebranded as J&W Attlee in 1860 and it began to expand, offering more goods and supply services, including fertilizer with their horse drawn wagons. In 1921 Attlee's purchased the Parsonage Mill for £1250. The firm withstood the



depression years and two world wars and continued to prosper.

In 1973 William Lillico & Son, a similar firm which was established in Kent, purchased the business because there was no Attlee family member to take over, but it continued under the name Attlee's Country Store. For some years the firm has supplied, in addition to agricultural seed, the grain needed to feed horses and other animals and miscellaneous other items for pets and horses.

During the mill's lifetime since 1788 much has happened in the Dorking agricultural scene. The population of Dorking in the early 1800's was about 3000, of which 1800 were on 'poor relief'. The Duke of Norfolk owned most of the surrounding land and rented it to small tenant farmers and sold some estates to wealthy Londoners. Back then about 16 stage and mail coaches passed along the Dorking - Holmwood turnpike every day. The time to London from Horsham was some 3½ hours (38 miles) but subject to many accidents such as broken axles.

At the turn of the century (1800) there was an ongoing war with France who were trying to deny trade with England and Napoleon Bonaparte was at war with other states in Europe. However, Napoleon's fleet was defeated by Admiral Nelson and the British Navy, firstly at the Battle of The Nile in

August 1798 and again at the Battle of Trafalgar in October 1805, and this relieved the pressure on English ports in danger of attack. In England, life was very difficult and cold; the Thames froze in winter, and farming suffered poor conditions during the war years leading up to the Battle of Waterloo in 1815 when France was defeated and Napoleon was exiled to St Helena. The English population celebrated with a candle in every window. It was estimated that one sixth of the adult population had served in the war.

The homecoming soldiers and sailors swelled the masses of the unemployed and little was done by the landowners and government to relieve this problem - a rural family earned 9 shillings per week and casual workers earned 7 pennies a day. On 22nd Nov 1830 there was a meeting of agricultural workers in the main street outside the Red Lion (long since demolished) in Dorking, the meeting place for many public functions. The magistrates failed to give promises about wages and riots ensued which

were suppressed by the cavalry called by the magistrates. Similar riots took place in Guildford.

The harvest of 1879 was the worst of the century and there was a general movement towards the towns to find work. In Dorking on 1st March 1926 the market stalls were moved from the main street to a site behind the north side shops because congestion in the main street had become intolerable

as the market was getting too crowded and included cattle pens. Attlee's Country Store continues to evolve and keep pace with change and present day needs. Let us wish it well in the 21st century.

There is no meeting planned for October but details for the November meeting will be announced in due course. As always the WLHG committee welcomes ideas for future talks.

# Surrey's biggest ever pumpkin raises funds for good causes

During 2020, residents of Westcott may have spotted a huge pumpkin growing in a front garden in Parsonage Lane. This year, at his allotment in Dorking, Matt Peskett has more than doubled the size of his 'lockdown' pumpkin with a new giant weighing in at approximately 750lbs / 340kg - as much as three baby elephants!



A committee member at Westcott Gardeners' Club and the Chairman of Dorking Allotment Holders' Association, Matt has been growing giant pumpkins for around six years. Whilst most plants struggled with the extreme heat this summer, the very warm nights made for perfect giant pumpkin growing conditions.

All being well, the pumpkin will be taken to RHS Hyde Hall's Heaviest Pumpkin Competition in Essex on October 1st. Thereafter it will appear at the Mole Valley Pumpkin and Squash Show at Dorking Christian Centre on October 15th before ending its days as part of the Tulleys Farm Shocktober Fest in Crawley (for Halloween).

#### **Fundraising**

In exchange for the monster pumpkin, Tulleys Farm have agreed to make donations to Dorking's Community organisation 'Mid Fridge Surrey Community Fridges (MSCF)' and to Perennial GRBS. MSCF Surrey exists to reduce food waste and make sure that surplus food is made available to anyone who can use it. As one of the largest Community Fridge organisations in the UK the volunteer-run organisation makes around 7.5 tonnes of surplus food available every week.



Matt's great grandfather - George Cook, a former Head Gardener on the Tilgate Estate in Crawley, was cared for in his old age by GRBS. He ended his years in 1997 as England's oldest man at the age of 108 - in a GRBS run care home here in Westcott.

- 9. Ensure that any new artwork is acceptable to the editor and it is received from in a timely basis

Watering the plants and saplings plus making sure our pond was topped up had to be a priority during the hot dry weeks of Summer, so we were relieved to have some rain in the latter part of August. 

#### Climate crisis and cost of living crisis

The climate crisis and the cost-ofliving crisis are inextricably linked. The climate crisis is a threat multiplier – it makes existing problems far worse. Extreme weather, such as drought and flooding, affects food production, leading to food shortages and higher prices. These disproportionately affect those on low incomes, leading to increased inequality.



UK households are the worst hit by rising energy costs in Western Europe due to the UK's heavy reliance on gas to produce electricity and to heat buildings. (The Guardian 01.09.22) A situation exacerbated by the lack of sufficient insulation in homes, meaning higher energy use and bigger costs. This dependence upon fossil fuels is driving up bills and accelerating climate impacts worldwide.

#### **Energy solutions**

Drilling for new oil and gas in the North Sea will do little to help reduce our energy bills in the short term, as oil and gas fields take several years to develop. Besides, it is not guaranteed that North Sea oil and gas will end up in the UK, much is exported by producers to sell on the global market. Fracking, similarly, could take years to significantly increase gas production and is unproven in the UK. The process of fracking requires huge amounts of water and has long been linked with serious environmental concernsmethane leaks; potential groundwater contamination; and earth tremors – as well as negatively impacting local communities.

Increasing emissions from burning more fossil fuels will only serve to worsen the climate crisis, and thus increase risks to those most vulnerable and marginalised in our societies. This year we have experienced temperatures topping 40oC in the UK, with the three-day heatwave in July causing around 948 excess deaths. Countries of the global South are increasingly impacted by drought, famine and

flooding, most recently Pakistan where 'monster monsoon' floods have washed away 45% of cropland and affected 33 million people.

# Cradhurst Recreation Ground Westco



#### We need your views

With July's heatwaves a distant memory, and England's weather reverting to 'normal' (rain, rain, rain...), some parts of the Cradhurst recreation ground are beginning to get soggy again. Is there something we could do about this?

The Westcott Village Association in conjunction with the Westcott 100 Club have started thinking about the challenge of improving access through the Cradhurst rec in all weathers particularly for users of wheelchairs and buggies.



This sketch shows a possible path layout – the exact route needs to be determined. The idea is to connect the existing entrances with a path (made from sustainable but hard-wearing materials) going around the main playing area.
