ON BUILDING BLOCKS

One brilliant thing about our children is that they give me the excuse to play with a certain Danish plastic brick-based construction toy. Sometimes I even let them join in. I love the creative side of watching them create crazy things, but there

is something deeply satisfying about seeing them open a new model, unfold a pristine instruction booklet, and work their way through it step by step to create a car/house/animal etc.

If only all of life was as simple as following a step-by-step

instruction booklet. I often find myself longing for the simplicity of a brick-based construction kit. Because life is messy and complicated in all sorts of ways. Not least in when it comes to the realm of community and relationships.





Building meaningful community cannot be done with a kit, but takes time and, most importantly, trust. Britain, despite the tumultuous decade we have gone through, remains in general a high trust

society with a high level of confidence in its institutions (a recent Gallup survey bore this out). But trust takes time to build and is all too easily broken – especially through misunderstanding and misinterpretation which reinforce n e g a t i v e

expectations.

Some questions for myself (you can ask them to yourself as well if you are in a pondering sort of mood): How can I put down building blocks of trust in my community, workplace and home? Who are the people that I have come to trust and what was it about them and what they did which led me to trust them? Who might I be misunderstanding or misreading which is getting in the way of trust and relationship and what can I do about it?

It matters, of course, who is doing the building. My 8-year-old would approach a construction kit in a very different way to my six month old (who would mainly try and consume the smaller pieces). One of my favourite verses in the Bible is Psalm 127.1 which says: 'Unless the Lord builds the house, the builders labour in vain.' As a Christian this principle reminds me of my limitations and short sightedness as I do my best to be a flawed but well-intentioned trust builder. All my experience cries out that when I trust myself things go wrong, and when I attempt to trust God - well that is where the beauty and hope ends up shining through despite my limitations.

Psalm 127.1 can be found written on the floor of Central Lobby in the Houses of Parliament. As a friend of mine who worked there observed, 'The Victorian architects quite literally built into the floor at the heart of our democracy a reminder that unless God is at work, we labour in vain.'

I respect the fact that many of you



may think that the idea of God should be kept well away from parliament (this is definitely the stuff of a good pub conversation at the Prince of Wales if anyone is up for it) but I hope the principle that we do what we can to build society and recognise our own limitations has the ring of truth for those of all faiths and none.

Thanks for all that you do to make Westcott the high trust community that it is – keep putting those bricks down.





The man who caught 1000 criminals. Talk by Dr Ian Goodall.

This is the story of how Alec Jeffreys, a young biologist who was born in January 1950, developed the technique of genetic finger printing to be able to identify the relationship of one person with another. Sir Alec Jeffreys graduated from Merton College, Oxford in 1971 with a 1st class degree in Biochemistry. After Oxford he moved to Amsterdam University and then in 1977 to Leicester where in 1984 he devised a way of showing variations in DNA. He developed a process of isolating mitochondria DNA which is passed from mother to child. The technique was called 'genetic fingerprinting'.



The method was first put to use in 1985 to confirm the identity of a boy from Ghana with his family in England. The technique was then used in a police forensic test to identify the murderer of two girls in November 1983 and July 1986. The prime subject was Richard

Buckland who was in the vicinity in both cases but denied being responsible. The police took samples of all the men in the area (some 5000) but without success when these were tested to find a match with samples taken from the two girls.

The breakthrough came when somebody in a pub overheard a man boasting that he had evaded the test by sending a friend to give a sample. This was reported to the police who then took a sample from him. As a result Colin Pitchfork was the first person convicted on the basis of DNA fingerprinting and was arrested for the murders of Lynda Mann and Dawn Ashworth on 19th September 1987. This exonerated Richard Buckland, who had been the prime suspect. The story behind this investigation is told in the Joseph Wamborough 1989 book - The Blooding - the true story of the Narborough village murders.

Sir Alec Jeffreys became known worldwide for developing techniques for genetic finger printing and DNA profiling in forensic science to assist police detective work and resolve paternity and immigration disputes. In 1992 these methods were used to identify and confirm the identity of Josef Mengele who died in 1979 by comparison with DNA from his mother and son. He was the German doctor who carried out experiments on human beings in Auschwitz during

WWII and later escaped to South America.


In July 2018 the Russians used DNA analysis to find out if the remains of Tsar Nicholas II and his wife and family of 4 girls and a son were authentic. The family were shot dead by Bolsheviks on the night of 16th July 1918 and buried in a mass grave near Ekaterinburg. This brought to an end three centuries of the Romanov dynasty. On 19th July 1993 the Romanov family were disinterred from the mass grave and the bodies were identified using DNA analysis. Comparison between the mitochondria DNA of the grand nephew Alexandra and our own Prince Philip was positive. Prince Philip was related to the Romanov family by his maternal grandmother Princess Victoria of Hesse and the Rhine.

who was the sister of Alexandra Feodarovna, the last Tsarina of Russia, who was married to Tsar Nicholas II of the Romanov dynasty. This made Prince Philip, whose parents were Greek and Danish, a distant relative of the Romanovs.

THE STORY OF UKRAINIAN REFUGEES



Three Years of Conflict: Ukrainians in the UK



The Russian invasion of Ukraine in February 2022 forced millions of Ukrainians to

seek safety abroad, including in the UK - just like my family and three others who found refuge in Westcott.

My name is Mariia, and I have been living in Westcott for almost three years. There are three other Ukrainian families here who, like me, arrived shortly after the war started. We consider ourselves lucky to be part of such a supportive community. The warmth and kindness we've received have made all the difference as we navigate these challenging times.



They say, "Time flies," and it really does! When we first arrived, we could never have imagined that the war would last over three years. The first few weeks, even the first few months, every Ukrainian was 100% sure that

a few more days and we would be going back, but it no longer seems that way.

As we mark the third anniversary of the invasion, it's important to recognise not only the



ongoing conflict but also the personal battles that Ukrainian refugees face each day. I believe the key word for all Ukrainians since their arrival has been "Adjust" - adjust to a new country, adjust to a new culture, adjust to new people, adjust to new jobs, and the list goes on. Numerous Ukrainian refugees in the UK are still struggling to find jobs that match their qualifications and experience. Having lived through this myself, I deeply relate to the hurdles they face.

Despite these challenges, Ukrainian refugees are incredibly resilient. They are eager to integrate, learn the language, and adapt to the UK job market. A great number are willing to start from scratch, taking lower-paying jobs with hopes of working their way up.

As an employment advisor, I've come across numerous stories of skilled professionals unable to work in their fields. Quite a few Ukrainian refugees,

despite their qualifications, find themselves working in low-skilled jobs. It's heart-wrenching to see talented people like biologists, accountants, entrepreneurs, and even doctors stuck in roles far below their abilities.

This situation leaves a significant portion of Ukrainian refugees in a state of limbo. They are building new lives in the UK but remain closely tied to the conflict back home. The lack of stability and uncertainty about their futures creates emotional and psychological stress, as they don't know what tomorrow holds.

Ukrainians try to support each other, and one example of this was a wonderful community event that I was privileged to host alongside the amazing Ukrainian Support Team

of Mole Valley District Council. It was a special gathering where the community came together to enjoy inspiring performances and connect with one another.

The UK government and the British public have provided significant support, from financial aid to housing, education, and employment resources. But integration requires more than just financial assistance; it requires time and continuous effort.

Meanwhile we truly hope that 2025 will bring the victory we so desperately wish for!





Surrey County Council Rights of Way Improvement Plan Final Consultation – closes 9th February 2025



Following extensive public surveys and consultations last vear Surrey County Council have published draft Rights of Way Improvement

Plan for the period 2025 to 2035 and are now asking for feedback before it is finalised. The WVA submitted a response to their initial consultation in March 2024 which can be read on our website https://westcottvillage.com/wp-content/uploads/2024/04/SCC-ROWIP-consultation-WVA-response-310324-Final.pdf and we will submit a further response to this final public consultation before the 9th February deadline.

The Rights of Way Improvement Plan sets out how SCC intends to improve the existing network of footpaths, bridleways and Byways in Surrey and is based around four themes;

- Public Rights of Way are for Everyone
- Maintaining and Protecting the Network
- Future Surrey

• Communications and Partnerships
There are objectives and actions set
out under each theme and while
none are specific to a particular
location nearly all have relevance
to Westcott and we believe are very
positive. This final consultation survey
asks how strongly you agree with the
objectives set out under each of the
four themes and there is a box at the
end for other comments.

The draft Plan is an easy but lengthy read and the final survey takes about 15 minutes to complete. The survey is at https://www.surreysays.co.uk/environment-and-infrastructure/rowip-24/ and is open for public consultation until the 9th February 2025. Please participate if you can as we believe enthusiastic support to the consultation in sufficient numbers from our community will help convince Surrey County Council to prioritise investment.

Milton Court Planning Application – MVDC Development Committee

The WVA were given a threeminute slot to speak at the MVDC Development Committee considering the planning application to develop 86 homes at Milton Court on the 8th January. At the time of writing this article the outcome of the meeting is not known but the key points



James Leaver delivered included our objection to the planning application due to a very real concern about the congestion this development and the 144 homes at Sondes Place Farm will place on the A25 into Dorking at peak times. There is currently only a weak commitment required of the developer to contribute to a feasibility study to improve traffic management.

He also included our disappointment that the cycling and walking infrastructure improvements only focus on the east of the development towards Dorking, with no consideration to improvements to the west which would benefit the many pupils from Dorking who attend our village school.

Westcott Neighbourhood Development Plan



The work to update the Westcott Neighbourhood Development Plan (WNDP) is underway with the three working groups, Data Collection (led by Dr Chris Smewing), Policy (led by lan Dunsford) and Communications (led by Jo Astor) getting off the around. The whole process expected to take 12 to 18 months involve discussion and and will debate at the Westcott Village Forum meetings, as well as being widely consulted on throughout the village with household surveys, formal studies and information gathering.

A presentation is being held for local parents at Surrey Hills All Saints School to explain the WNDP and the process we will go through to review it. This presentation is before the Celebration Assembly on Friday 7th February.

DORKING MUSEUM



Dorking Museum tells the story of Dorking and the surrounding villages from the age of the dinosaurs through to the modern day. Visitors can follow that story through fossils and archaeological discoveries, the adventure of the Mayflower and the Dorking pilgrims, the smells of a medieval marketplace, the grandeur of the areat estates, two world wars, sporting achievement, the women's suffrage movement, the music of Vaughan Williams and 10cc, the elegance of Wedgwood china, the discovery of synthetic penicillin and so much more. There is so much to discover, and displays are regularly refreshed and new exhibits added.

Temporary exhibitions follow other local themes, the latest of which is Building between the vines – the story of the Denbies LEGO house:



Amazing as it may seem, a fullsize house was built of LEGO on the Denbies Wine Estate in 2009 as part of a BBC television series entitled James May Toy Stories, in which the presenter took some of the country's best-loved children's toys and built large scale models from them. The total project took a few late summer weeks, but, following completion, a housewarming party, a toast with Denbies wine, and an overnight stay in the house by May on a rainy September night, the house itself remained in situ for only four days.



The two-storey house took almost 2,000 volunteers five weeks to build using over 3.3 million bricks and setting a world record for the largest LEGO house. It included furniture, furnishings, kitchen appliances, even a shower, sink and flushing loo on the top floor. Even a LEGO cat was created. Due to its sheer size and weight, relocation to a permanent site was impractical, so the house at Denbies was demolished, with the bricks collected up and donated to charity.

The exhibition tells how and why it was built. A collection of specially designed Lego models of buildings and objects with a Dorking

Invasion repelled at Claremont Gardens

One Sunday afternoon this winter when the rain stopped, I headed for Claremont Gardens in Esher for a breath of fresh air. Heading up the path above the amphitheatre, raucous chattering high in the trees caught my attention. With careful study, I identified the cause of the disturbance. It came from a group of trees bare of leaves but copiously provided with swags of mistletoe laden with berries.



Mistle Thrush

The noise came from a Mistle Thrush who clearly considered those berries its personal larder for the winter and from a raiding party of Fieldfares who had spotted the bounty. The Mistle Thrush moved vigorously about the trees, chattering angrily and making much aggressive display of its white underwings. After more than ten minutes, the Fieldfares reluctantly flew off. The Mistle Thrush then perched on the topmost spot and carolled its

victory.

The Mistle Thrush is resident, breeding and raising its young here. It was named for its fondness for the berries of the mistletoe, the hemiparasitic plant that attaches to its host tree from which to extract water and nutrients. Mistle Thrushes nevertheless enjoy a wide range of berries in autumn and winter; those in my garden defend the female holly bushes from other berry lovers.

Fieldfares breed mainly in Scandinavia, migrating south and west to find food and less cold winters. The party at Claremont were indeed foreign invaders seeking food growing here. They usually switch back to feeding on invertebrates earlier than our native thrushes, perhaps because the berry stocks are well defended by the locals?

Jon Mears

How did a likely lad from up North wind up being director of the Westcott Village Hub Community Interest Company aka Jon and Mum's? This journey is as winding as Jon's tastes in music are telling. His younger muses were rather melancholic, Chris de Burgh (Lady in Red), Simon and Garfunkel (Bridge Over Troubled Waters) and Dire Straits (Brothers in Arms).

He struck out on his own at fifteen after the tragic loss of his brother and through his Northern grit and determination eventually got to University studying environmental management technology. By now his mood music had changed to heavy rock, going to live concerts to hear Rage Against the Machine whose songs included Killing in the Name, inspired by the beating of Rodney King in Los Angelos. This was an angrier Jon, by his own admission working hard and playing hard, not really dealing with his emotions. This was to be the pattern of his life for the next thirty years.

Then on 30th January 2020, The World Health Organisation declared the Covid outbreak as a pandemic. The country locked down and as life dramatically changed for all of us, Jon took decisive steps to radically alter his lifestyle. He wanted a healthier way to live, physically and psychologically.

The timing of the pandemic presented the opportunity. By then he was selling street food and responded to an email from the Church and became a volunteer feeding local people who needed help. Having recently moved into the area, this was also a way to get to know people. He and his Mum started with veg boxes, and brownies. That desire to create a healthier place for himself coalesced into building a healthier space for others. Just wanting to help grew into wanting to bring people together in a place where there was no obligation to buy anything, where people didn't feel rushed, to have a safe place.

There was no master plan, the original small strip, expanded into building present and grew organically, multiplying from groceries to sustainable products and the café. In 2023 Jon and Mum was registered as the Westcott Village Hub Community Interest Company. He emphasized the enterprise was not for profit and he didn't want to compete with the village stores. His ethos is to stimulate other community initiatives and to be a conduit where people can be signposted to get the help they need. It's remarkable, he says that the coincidence of someone being in Jon and Mum's having a guery and someone present being just the right person to assist. You ask does anyone know a reliable electrician and there's

Jon surprised himself when he and a friend started exchanging musical choices during the pandemic. They gave themselves a theme and one was to find songs from the ten most populous countries. He discovered different styles which he had no idea existed and which opened him up more diverse genres.

He is living a different version of himself and whilst not espousing a conventional religious belief, has a spiritual dimension to his life. He is kinder, more patient and tries to be tolerant and without judgment. The music he listens to is more soulful, reflecting his sense of gratitude that he really is doing the best he can. His choice of Matt Emery is an interesting one. Matt is a local Surrey-based and self-taught musician, who like another favourite (Einaudi) Ludovico has created classical soundscapes. Matt's Empire and Ludovico's Summer Portraits are hauntingly beautiful.

But the record that Jon would save from the waves is Manchester Orchestra's I know how to speak. The lyrics are as important to him as the music:

I know how to speak
And I know where I'm going
I wanted to seek
But I got distracted

The past, about pain
It's timeless and honest
So let go of your shame
It's a dead, dampening blanket

It's a facade
Go back and look at your training
There's nobody else like you
I think I finally explained it
So I continue to move

He can't help everyone and doesn't have all the answers, relying on the wisdom of others, but he is pouring everything he has learnt into the hub. He and his Mum have created a place of warmth and welcome where people can just sit, meet, talk, buy things if they want to and ask for comfort if they need it and feel safe. He is philosophical about its future and does have moments when he thinks it all might be taken away or he has missed someone who needs help.

Music has been hugely influential and paralleled key points in his life. The early melancholy morphed into the heavy metal when he was detached from his emotions and living a less stable life. Auto-slave's Show me how to live was a transitional piece leading into the calm of classical soundscapes and he is now at peace with himself.

Beneath our feet



'Grounding', the practice of connecting to the Earth, provides many positive effects on the human

body, through contact with the natural electrical direct current (DC) flowing across the Earth's crust. Medical studies are revealing that through grounding - practices such as lying or walking barefoot on the grass - the human body enters a profound healing state which, among other benefits, can help reduce pain, stress, and inflammation and improve mental well-being.

This is but one of the life-giving properties that derive from the ground beneath our feet. Indeed, all life above ground is, in one way or another, dependent upon the precious thin top layer that blankets the Earth - soil. Soil is the basis of almost 99% of our food and so the quality of the food we eat is intimately linked with the quality of the soil. Soil also plays a significant role in climate regulation as it acts as a filter for water and can help in flood management by slowing and holding onto rainfall. It can also store a huge amount of carbon – more than all the world's trees.

The Sustainable Food Trust describes soil as a collective stomach of all the plants on the planet. Soils are living ecosystems containing a multitude of plant roots,

microorganisms, creatures and fungal networks. Much like we depend upon gut bacteria to help digest our food, so soil organisms play a central role in breaking down organic matter



into absorbable nutrients, which plants can then take up through the large surface area of their root systems.

So it follows that how we treat the soil matters - not just for our health but for the health of all organisms, plants, animals and ecosystems which are affected, directly or indirectly, by the quality of the soil.



Sadly, most of the UK's soils are currently classed as 'degraded' or 'very degraded', with population pressures and practices associated with intensive agriculture causing increased damage to the soil: Tilling disrupts soil structure, accelerating surface run-off and soil erosion; pesticides damage microbial soil life, disrupting soil ecosystem functions; monocrops reduce soil biodiversity; and overgrazing strips the ground of plant cover leaving it

exposed to erosion and compaction by wind and rain.



Restoring healthy soil is a key element in tackling the climate a n d biodiversity crises and

improving public health. Fortunately, there are many ways in which we can work with natural processes to help restore and improve our soils. Just like humans, the soil needs a balanced diet and a nurturing environment. By feeding the soil, with the addition of natural mulches in the form of compost or wood chips, we can also help to protect the soil and improve its structure thus increasing its capacity for storage of water, air and carbon. Nurturing the soil may simply mean using fewer chemicals and practicing no-dig gardening to allow the soil to return to its natural cycles. Cover cropping reduces soil erosion by ensuring there are no areas of exposed soil and helps capture nutrients, while practicing crop rotation improves soil health, optimizes nutrients and reduces pests and diseases.

These simple acts of reciprocity, in feeding and nurturing the soil that feeds us, helps to put us back into right relationship with the land we live

in, so enhancing our wellbeing, while allowing the Earth to restore vital natural processes for diverse life to thrive.

Ways to Feed & Nurture Your Soil

These are some of the practices we use at Westcott Community Garden: We are pesticide free, using the nodig technique – it makes life easier and allows soil life to flourish! See Charles Dowding's website for more information.

Creating our own compost from a mixture of green, (kitchen peelings, garden clippings, manure), and brown material, (small twigs, shredded cardboard, dried leaves,) and using to top up flower and vegetable beds. Mulching plants and trees with wood chippings to save on water use and improve soil structure over time.

Practicing crop rotation to mimic diversity and help balance nutrients and reduce pests and diseases.

We also need to:

Use cover crops to act as a protective shield for the soil in between food crops, protecting it from heavy rain and smothering weeds.
