# SPIRITUAL COMMUNITIES AMID GEOPOLITICAL CHAOS

In the sixth century the Roman Empire was rapidly disintegrating. There was constant war throughout the provinces which once represented the economic and military

domination of Rome. Ordinary people, as is so often the case in chaotic times, paid the price as their lives were turned upsideconflict, down by famine and invasion. Amidst this uncertainty a young man named Benedict left his native Nursia in Umbria to attend school in Rome. He was repulsed by

many of the practices there as he observed how the strong preyed on the weak and rejected the heart of Christianity. So he upped sticks and left. Not to a comfortable place in the suburbs but to live off-grid in prayerful solitude in a cave, 30 miles east of Rome. Others were drawn to his life of simplicity and holiness and eventually, with reluctance, he established twelve monastic communities in the area.

Benedict wrote a simple set of instructions for how they were to live together and love one another amidst the uncertainties and dangers of the age. He sought to write 'nothing harsh, nothing burdensome' – people had enough troubles without heaping unrealistic expectations on them. He instructed those who came not to 'be daunted immediately by fear and run away from the road that leads to salvation.' Through the communities which sprung up from this movement, much that is good

precious and preserved at a time of chaos – not least many works of literature. philosophy and art. Perhaps even more significant however was the preservation of Jesus' outrageous claim that rule purely by might is not right, and that the meek will indeed inherit the earth. A conviction

remained that lives of prayer, worship and dependence on God make the ultimate difference, rather than a pragmatic dependence on whichever local war chief is currently on top. Generations of imperfect but loving communities welcoming outsiders to encounter God's grace left their mark on the world. Whatever your own beliefs, our culture and world view still owes much to those who courageously took a stand as

communities of prayer and hope in times of great darkness and fear.

I would love to tell you the even more compelling story of our own nation how in the seventh century a young man called Aidan boldly went out from the Christian community on the island of Iona in Scotland to speak life and hope to the violent Anglo-Saxon peoples who had come over the sea and taken the Kingdom of Northumbria. How through patient love he introduced them to God's love and sowed the seeds which would slowly turn the tide on a culture of violence and power as the centuries went by. Or the story of the community set up at Finkenwalde by German Pastor Dietrich Bonhoeffer to equip Christian Pastors to actively resist the evils of Nazism through

action - but also through prayer, contemplation of Scripture, and living in a loving community built around the teachings of Jesus. Bonhoeffer knew the potential cost of taking a stand - he was assassinated on the orders of Hitler in the final stages of the war. I would love to tell vou of these communities and more, but I am already pushing my word count. So for those who would like to be involved in meaningful community here in Westcott, I will simply leave you with some of Bonhoeffer's words of wisdom: "The person who loves their dream of community will destroy community, but the person who loves those around them will create community."



#### **New Deputy Head**







#### **Wonderful Warblers**

Sunny mornings are now scored by birds flexing their vocal prowess as March marks the start of the dawn chorus. Over the coming months, birds will sing to stake out territory and attract a mate. Our residents will soon be accompanied by early arriving summer visitors, ready to supplement their song.

Warblers are a group of birds which can often be difficult to distinguish on sight. They're mostly brown or olive colour in their plumage, equipped with sharp, slim beaks to aid their insect-heavy diets. These songbirds are easiest to tell apart by listening out for their springtime tunes.

Due to changing climate, small numbers of warblers are

beginning to spend winter in the UK. Most warblers, however, complete a migration from their warmer overwintering grounds in Africa. In preparation for their journey, they feed extensively and can even double in weight!

In March, listen out for the Chiffchaff's onomatopoeic "chiff-chaff, chiff-chaff" song from the treetops and

the Blackcap's scratchy trills from the scrub. Toward the end of the month, the cascading melody of the Willow Warbler will join the symphony.

# William Mullins and the Mayflower Expedition

The Mayflower set sail for America on 16th September 1620 with about 100 passengers and 30 crew members after several false starts involving the leaking hull of her companion ship (the Speedwell) for which they had to return to port for repairs. On board were the family of William Mullins - a prosperous shoe and boot maker from Dorking - with his wife Alice and children Joseph (15) and Priscilla (17) and his servant/apprentice Robert Carter. He had left behind two of his family from his first marriage, Sarah (22) and William (late 20's) who remained in Dorking.



The smaller ship Speedwell, which was intended to accompany the Mayflower, had come from Rotterdam to Southampton with a group of English Puritans or Separatists who had left Scrooby in Nottinghamshire some 12 years before to escape the strict enforcement of religious laws

enacted during James I reign during 1608-9. Southampton had established trading links with Virginia and Norfolk which was where they were headed. The two ships set sail on 15th August but the Speedwell started leaking and they had to stop in Dartmouth for repairs. The Dartmouth locals were suspicious of the pilarims and obliged them to move up the river. They set off again down the English Channel but 300 miles off Lands End the Speedwell leaked again and the ships returned to Plymouth. Here the Speedwell was declared unfit to sail across the Atlantic.

Six weeks had passed, wasting valuable money and supplies. Some passenaers returned Holland, some abandoned the venture and a few joined the Mayflower. After some 64 days sailing, they spotted land at Cape Cod Hook and arrived at their destination, Plymouth Bay Harbour in Massachusets, in the harsh winter on 19th November 1620.

William Mullins was a signatory to the Mayflower Compact which was a venture financed by the Merchant Adventurers and he had 9 shares of stock in the venture. Mullins was well established in Dorking where he is first recorded in October 1595 when he was fined 2 pence apparently for not attending the manorial court session of that year. He was elected 'tithingman' for the Eastborough

neighbourhood. On 20th December 1612 he was named in the will of Jane Hammonds, appointing him as overseer of her estate. On 28th December 1612 Mullins bought a 'holding' from John Jetter in Dorking with 1½ acres of land between West Street and Back Street (now Church Street) for £122. He was detained on 29th August 1616 by the Lordship of the Privy Council, probably associated with the religious controversies of that time, but nothing came of it. In May 1619 Mullins sold his Dorkina Mansion holdings to Ephraim Bothall for £280, apparently in preparation for his voyage on the Mayflower ship.



There were two interesting characters among the Mayflower passengers. One was Stephen Hopkins who joined them in Southampton – the only man who had been in America before – having been shipwrecked in Bermuda in 1609. He and his wife Elizabeth joined the Mayflower in Southampton. She was one of 18 women of whom 3 were 6 months pregnant. She gave birth during the voyage and they named the boy Oceanus. On arrival in New England Stephen Hopkins was another of

the 41 signatures on the Mayflower Compact. He became assistant to the Governor of the Plymouth Colony until 1636. His years of experience in Jamestown made him familiar with the hunting techniques and lifestyle of the American Indians which was very useful to the Pilgrim's leaders. In fact their first formal meeting with the Indian leaders of the Wampanoaa tribe was at Hopkin's house. He took part in visits to the Indian leader Mussasoit. In the later 1630s he came up against the Plymouth authorities because he set up a tavern and allowed excessive drinking. He died in 1644.

Only Priscilla Mullins survived their first winter and spring and continued to live in Plymouth. William Mullins died on 21st February 1621 followed by his wife and son soon afterwards.



The first concert of this year's Leith Hill Music Festival takes place in March. This is a performance of Handel's Messiah given by a large choir of festival singers with the baroque orchestra Canzona. It will be the first concert with the new festival conductor Neil Ferris, who has been leading the singers through a series of lively and inspiring rehearsals. This will be an exciting and dramatic performance of Handel's great masterpiece. Two further festival concerts will follow in April.

The Dorking Philharmonia has a programme of Russian music, beginning with Borodin's evocative tone poem In the steppes of central Asia. Louis-Victor Bak will then be the soloist in Rachmaninov's ever-popular second piano concerto and the concert will finish with Tchaikovsky's brilliant Symphony no.4.

The Dorking Concertgoers present the world-famous Brodsky string quartet in the third of a three-concert series that began in February. Beginning with an arrangement of a Bach violin sonata, they will play Debussy's beautifully atmospheric string quartet and Schubert's moving Death and the Maiden, its title inspired by one of Schubert's finest songs.

The Surrey Philharmonic Orchestra, playing in Ashtead, has a very attractive programme, beginning with Mendelssohn's rarely-heard overture *Son and Stranger*. Gerard Flotats is the cello soloist in Tchaikovsky's *Rococo Variations* and a lovely *Romanze* by Richard Strauss. There are also two pieces by Delius, and the concert finishes with Saint-Saens' second symphony.

There are several screenings at the Dorking Halls this month: Tchaikovsky's *Swan Lake* and *Prokofiev's Romeo and Juliet* from the Royal Ballet, and Andrew Lloyd Webber's *Jesus Christ Superstar*, filmed during its UK tour.

#### DORKING MUSEUM



The Museum features fascinating displays telling the story of Dorking from the age of the dinosaur to the modern day, special temporary exhibitions and regular family activities at the Museum and Dorking Library. Added to that, spring brings the resumption of our programmes of guided walks in the town and tours of the South Street Caves – start planning now.

## Building between the vines – the story of the Denbies LEGO house:



The Museum's current temporary exhibition tells the story of how and why a full-size house

was built of LEGO on the Denbies Wine Estate in 2009. It was the subject of one programme of a BBC television series entitled James May Toy Stories in which the presenter built large scale models from some of the country's best-loved children's toys. 2009 marked the 60th anniversary of the first LEGO bricks being produced!

The two-storey house took almost 2,000 volunteers to build over a five-week period, using over 3.3 million bricks and setting a world record for the largest LEGO house. It included furniture, furnishings, kitchen appliances, and even a shower, sink and flushing loo on the top floor – and a LEGO cat! Following completion, a housewarming

party was held, and a toast with Denbies wine – served in specially designed LEGO goblets – was enjoyed by contributors to the series and guests including Oz Clark, Tiff Needell and Jane Asher. After the party, James May stayed in the house for just one rainy night. The house itself remained in situ at Denbies for only four days. Due to its sheer size and weight, relocation to a permanent site was impractical, so it was demolished, with the bricks collected up and donated to charity.

#### **Nancy Lund**

The fixed points in Nancy's life are husband Nick, her kids Ellie and Max, her brother and sister and her therapy dog Shadow. These represent safe ports in her rather wiggly route of lived experiences with her only discovering her navigational compass when getting a late diagnosis of Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) which explained some of the turbulance she has weathered.

The disruption began when her parents split up when she was very young, but she recalls her Dad singing often and a household of eclectic musical tastes combining Led Zeppelin and AC/DC with classical and folk music. Steeleye Span's Weaver and the Factory Maid was a favourite. Her early schooling was not happy. Told off for chatting during story hour, being slapped by a teacher, probably for inattention, were likely as a result of symptoms of her undiagnosed ADHD. She fared little better in secondary school with her ambition of becoming a nurse quashed by career advice that she was 'too stupid'. She left at 15 without any qualifications.

She was drawn to drama and gravitated towards London's Covent Garden where she became a busker's bottler. In the past, a busker would have an assistant who passed round a hat for coins and held a bottle containing

a fly in the other hand. Keeping the fly in the bottle with the thumb of that hand proved there was no pinching of the busker's money. Nancy found the musical talent of David Bowie and his tranforming persona Ziggy Stardust coincided with a break from what would now be recognised as a coercive and controlling relationship with the busker and her own reinvention of herself.

Her sister, who worked for BA, provided a ticket to Venezuela which broke the busker's stanglehold and she moved to Twickernham, taking driving jobs for a graphic designer. Another BA ticket, this time to Australia, resulted in her discovering religion and being born again to a Pentecostal Church Community. On her return to the UK she spent the next seven years as a missionary, including a stint working in Hamburg's red light district. What was absent in her life was music, with the church forbidding access to any media. Bucking against a marriage her pastor was steering her towards and her mission to Rwanda she luckily escaped both the marriage and the geneocide. Nancy found herself questioning her religion and leaving the church altogether.

Feeling cut off and lost, a restorative walk in the Peak District resulted in her meeting Simon. A marriage, two children and a messy divorce followed, cramming in GCSEs, an A level and a degree in Psychology along the way.

died Her Dad in 2018 and involvement her in his funeral arrangements led her to training as a celebrant and you will find her as Nancy Lund in the UK Society of Celibrants' register. Her style of working with the bereaved is to organically surface the pain of loss, finding the right tone and timbre for the service and draw on her drama and therapy skills.

Covid struck in 2020 and Nancy, Nick Ellie and Max were at home with Shadow, (a dog trained to provide comfort and support and used by Nancy in her mental health work with children). The family gave lectures to each other and Nancy correographed a dance for her children, videoing the performance to the music of *Blinding* 

lights by The Weekend. Despite the unfolding tragedy of Covid deaths, this was a magical time for Nancy and a cherished time of connection with her kids.

Entering her 50s and losing several friends to cancer pulled Nancy up short and caused her to ask herself: how much time do I have left? The incredibly brave answer was to train as a paramedic and she will qualify in January 2026. As a mature student she was offered screening for learning differences through which she was diagnosed with ADHD. The disjointed pieces of inattention, restlessness and 27 different jobs fell into place with a relieved understanding of why. She is loving the training, sponging up the learning and feeling she has come full circle with her earlier nursing ambitions. This is me from The Greatest Showman says it all:

'I am brave, I am bruised
I am who I'm meant to be, this is me
Look out 'cause here I come
And I'm marching on to the beat I drum
I'm not scared to be seen
I make no apologies, this is me'

With the book *Papillion* in her back pocket and a blanket as her luxury item I wish this wonderful, resilient, resourceful woman well in her new career.

#### Killing Two Birds with One Stone

Plastic pollution now blights our planet from the highest mountain to the deepest ocean trench. Last years Big Plastics Count estimated that 1.7billion pieces of plastic are being thrown away by UK households EACH WEEK! But it would be wrong to lay the blame at the doorstep of individual householders.

On the contrary, single-use disposable plastic was a deliberate strategy pushed from the plastics industry to maximise profits – they'd found that the problem with plastic products was that they were too durable, so you'd only need to buy one of a plastic item and it would last forever! Hence the idea of 'throw-away' plastic was born and gradually clever marketing and cheap pricing drove items that had previously been reusable towards more 'convenient' disposable plastic versions.

There are certainly items for which plastic has an important material use, such as for pacemakers for example, but using such a durable material for a single-use or disposable product, such as packaging, is problematic, and indeed would appear to make little sense – apart from the fact that it is an artificially cheap material – due in part to it being a byproduct of the subsidised fossil fuel industry. 99% of all

plastics are made from fossil fuels and plastic packaging accounts for nearly 40% of plastic usage.



What I hadn't really appreciated, when I first started to write this article, was the extent to which reducing plastic production is critically linked with tackling the climate crisis. Throughout their lifecycle plastics contribute to climate heating, via greenhouse gas emissions associated with the extraction of fossil fuel, manufacturing of the plastic and disposal of plastic waste. In 2019 5% of global emissions come from plastic production.

Moreover, as the world is transitioning to clean energy, fossil fuel companies are increasingly turning their attention to plastic production. ExxonMobil was estimated to be the biggest single-use plastic waste polluter worldwide in 2021. The plastic industry is becoming the fastest-growing source of global industrial greenhouse gases. If this continues, as much as 19% of world

greenhouse emissions could come from the plastics lifecycle by 2040.

Countries around the world acknowledge the need for a global treaty to reduce the amount of plastics being created, in order to protect our health, the health of the earth and to tackle the climate crisis. The fifth round of negotiations for a Global Plastics Treaty in December last year ended without an agreement. The talks were literally swamped by fossil fuel and petrochemical industry lobbyists who, alongside oil-producing countries, worked to weaken the treaty, pushing waste management and recycling 'solutions', rather than tackling the issue at source, ie cutting plastic production.

The idea of recycling is often pushed by the plastics industry as a method of dealing with the problem of throw-away plastic pollution, without endangering disposable plastic production, effectively allowing the problem to continue. Plastic recycling is not a satisfactory solution for plastic pollution for several reasons, including the fact that it is complex due to the numerous different types of plastic with differing chemical additives and recycled plastics contain chemicals hazardous to health. In fact much of our plastic waste is burned – releasing toxic fumes, often unfairly impacting deprived neighbourhoods.

In addition to the above, microplastics are released during the recycling process, causing environmental harm through air and water contamination. Microplastics – which result from the breaking down of plastic waste get everywhere and can be found in our food, water and are even finding their way into our brains, in rapidly increasing amounts! Research released in February found that data showed an increasing trend in microplastic contamination of brains from 1997 to 2024, with the equivalent of the weight of a plastic spoon of tiny plastic particles found in the brains of people who had died in 2024.

Reducing the use of fossil fuels goes hand in hand with reducing plastic pollution. Far from being a problem of human behaviour, this is a systemic problem, so rather than look to piecemeal downstream remedies which just keep plastics circulating in ever smaller pieces, the solution is to go upstream and turn down the tap of plastic production. Tackling the issue of fossil fuel subsidies at a policy level is one of the keys to addressing the artificially 'cheap' price of fossil fuels and therefore plastics too. There are also ways we can help.
