WHAT IF?

I wonder if you've ever prayed. Even if you don't believe in any deity, I imagine you might have uttered an OMG ('Oh my god') or a 'God help us' at some point in your life. Maybe you've tried praying and given up if you found it boring or thought it wasn't

achieving anything. \bigcirc r perhaps, moment of a desperation, you've found yourself calling out to God as a last resort. Yet whether or not you have prayed, I'd hazard a quess that someone somewhere has prayed for you.

Recent statistics from the Pew Research

Center* revealed that people in the UK are less likely to pray every day than those living anywhere else – or at least, in the 102 countries surveyed.





According to their figures, fewer than 10% of us Brits pray daily,

though who can say if people answered the question with hand on heart, or if there were others (like me) who recognise the value of daily prayer but couldn't honestly say they always do it? Statistics may not tell the whole story.

Prayer can, of course, take many

forms. I grew up with the "hands together and eyes closed" variety – helpful for eliminating distractions but certainly not the only way. Since childhood, I've come to recognise that prayer can be a few words offered up silently amidst a conversation, hands open to release a heavy burden, the beating of fists in moments of despair or anger.

Prayer can be listening. It can be beautiful words read or spoken, the simplest sentence, or a cry of the heart when there are no words. I believe God hears, even welcomes, it all. And the Bible includes countless examples of people praying to express every emotion under the sun: joy, wonder, gratitude, fear, grief, confusion, doubt and more.

Although I don't profess understand prayer, I'm quite sure it is worthwhile. In his poem Morte d'Arthur, Tennyson writes: "More things are wrought by prayer than this world dreams of". And a wise person once suggested to me that we'll never know what might have happened if people hadn't prayed. Somehow, I believe, God chooses to use prayer as a means to change the world for the better. That change might be for a person or situation I pray for, or it might be a change in me - or even both. I find that prayer restores my perspective, enables me to refocus on what matters most. It helps to recalibrate my life, lightens the load, provides clarity and inspiration. I need reminding that it isn't all about my efforts to achieve. improve or put the world to rights. Prayer encourages me to reach out beyond myself and my limited vision to a God who sees the whole picture, and can do far more than I could ever ask or imagine.



If you've been to the village Hub recently, you might have noticed a wooden box on the wall by the main door. It's there for anyone who'd value prayer for a person or situation they're concerned about. Any requests are treated confidentially and prayed for by a few people from our village church. So if you've got something on your mind and you're open to the possibility that prayer might make a difference, why not ask someone else to pray... or even try it yourself?

UPDATE FROM ST JOHN'S COMMUNITY CENTRE

There's a real sense of momentum at St John's Community Centre. With new leadership and exciting developments underway, it's a good time to catch up with Simon Mabley (new Centre Manager) and Jon Mears (Co-Director of the Community Interest Company behind Westcott Village Hub).

"There's а going on," Simon says, "thanks to generous, bighearted people who share their time and skills people who love the building, community garden and village and want them to thrive."



That spirit of community is central to everything at St John's. "The Village Hub started during the pandemic as a way to get fruit and veg to people," Jon explains. "It became a community store, then a café hosting the community fridge, with the later addition of a refill station — and now it also supports local micro-businesses selling local crafts."

Officially operating from October 2024, the Westcott Village Hub is now a Community Interest Company (CIC). Its' aims include running a café and community shop, supporting the Community Garden and Fridge, helping other groups grow, maintaining the building, and creating paid and volunteer roles.

"We've been in contact close with Mole Valley Planners" Simon explains. "and we're grateful to Councillor Magesh and the WVA for their support with that in particular."

The Hub is constantly evolving and this summer, the café served over

150 free children's meals and welcomed 400+ visitors to the Community Fridge. "The café and shop are our core, but their use might adapt depending on what the community needs," Jon adds. "We'd love to be open for parents on their way back from the morning school run — it's just about funding."

Meanwhile, there's a lot happening in the community garden, and the chapel space is also still very active, with regular activities like Midweek Communion, Cookie club and Yoga, as well as being a great space to hire. "Its such a great facility", says Simon, "which is all down to the incredible work of previous managers Tim Way and Tony Astor."

Simon sees how naturally everything connects. "People wander between spaces — the garden produces surplus for the café, families stop in and discover the Cookie Club. It's all organically community-led."

Support from the 100 Club and Surrey County Councillor Hazel Watson (who funded the coffee machine and refurbished kitchen), have also been invaluable.

Beyond café life, the Hub team also offers practical support — staff are trained in 'Advice First Aid' to help signpost people to services. Ultimately, St John's is shaped by the people who use it. "It's not about a building," says Jon, "but about vision, energy, and working together."

Keep your eyes peeled for the UK's smallest bird

Weighing in at an average of just 6g – that's the equivalent of about six paperclips – Goldcrests are the UK's smallest birds. But what they lack in size, they definitely make up for in colour, with the striking flash of golden feathers on their head. These dainty birds spend most of their time flitting around the branches of trees, looking for insects, and are particularly at home amongst conifers and in mixed woodland. You could spot them in parks and gardens with large trees too. Remember to listen out for their high-pitched 'tsee-tsee' call.

There are Goldcrests in the UK all year round, but autumn and winter are particularly good times to catch a glimpse of them, as their numbers are boosted by birds arriving from Scandinavia and Russia. In the past, people found it so hard to believe that tiny Goldcrests could fly across the North Sea that they thought these mini migrants must hitch a ride on the back of Woodcocks, which reach the UK at about the same time. As a result, they become known as 'Woodcock pilots'! Nowadays, thanks to ringing studies, we know that these amazing little birds can, and do, make the journey unaided. A truly impressive feat.

WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP



England's Pleasant Land

The summer months is the time when villages all over the kingdom hold their annual fetes and fairs. We here in Westcott had, a few weeks ago, our very successful Westfest and Abinger had their Medieval Fair. Although Westfest is just 10 years old the village has had a great variety of fairs on the village green over the last two centuries but perhaps none were as ambitious as the one held in July 1938, not actually in the village but at Milton Court.


At that point WW2 was some time off, Milton Court was still a private residence and the Dorking and Leith Hill District Preservation Society (Westcott History Group was not formed until 1999) were looking for a site to hold a great pageant. Although 'For Sale' signs had recently appeared, the owner, Lady Mallaby-Deeley, agreed to make Milton Court available and the

ambitious project went ahead under the title 'England's Pleasant Land'. The script was written by E M Forster of Abinger Hammer, Ralph Vaughan Williams was the musical director and Tom Harrison from Holmbury St Mary was the producer. The cast comprised local people playing the principal characters as well as providing the crowd scenes of Saxons, Normans etc. that featured in a storyline recalling the history of rural England over a period of nearly a thousand years.

The play is set in the countryside 'close to a village and to a manor house'. The action opens in Norman times showing the settling of the land at Domesday, but the main activity takes place much later the estate land is enclosed and peasants revolt. Eventually the the Squire gets his comeuppance when 20th century death duties eventually overturn the old order and the play concludes as the scene

> becomes filled with hoardings, bungalows, charabancs, petrol pumps and litter. In this way the pageant sought to rally public support to help 'preserve and enhance the charm and rural character of the Dorking district for the public benefit, and to prevent development which would injure its amenities.'

The preservation of the countryside was of particular concern to E M Forster and to Ralph Vaughan Williams, both of whom had been associated with the Abinger Pageant in 1934 with a similar theme. In that instance the Woodman, as narrator, urged his audience to consider their responsibilities; 'Houses, houses, houses! Are these man's final triumph? Or is there another England, green and eternal which will outlast them? ...

This land is yours, and you can make it what you will.'

The threat to the local countryside is now far greater than it was in July 1938, The Green Belt is under attack and housing developments will creep Dorking ever closer to our village. We have no obvious champion, comparable to those in the late 1930s, to rally support for the retention of traditional countryside values.

The Dorking and Leith Hill District Preservation Society was founded in 1929 in response to threats to the countryside in the wake of the breakup of large estates that saw building on many beauty spots all over England in the years between the wars. The Society gave local people a voice on matters affecting their environment and in its early days it drew attention to and campaigned against the reduction of open spaces and the threat from inappropriate development to much-loved local features. It now exists as the Dorking Society and we, Westcott Local History Group, work closely with them in many common interests.

Nicki Rowling

In past times Nicki would have been the wise woman of Wescott dispensing healing through her knowledge of herbs. Her present persona is also restorative, teaching somatic yoga and giving people new skills through willow weaving. Nicki's adult life is be bookended by visits to an Indian Ashram. The first, when aged twentythree, followed an invitation by Brian to join him in what was a life expanding experience. The last, a month or so ago, still with Brian, where they created their own programme of meditation and yoga. Nicki chose the fusion music of composer Nitin Sawhaney to epitomise the integration of mind, body and spirt. His album Human is hypnotic and atmospheric.

Living in Westcott since the age of eight or nine, Nicki remembers the family buying a sofa and her racing round it to Mozart's 40th symphony. Her Dad's classical preferences were augmented by her Mum's more popular tastes such as Neil Diamond, whose famous tracks include Sweet Caroline, Beautiful Noise and the lovely soundtrack to the film Jonathan Livingston Seagull.

It was that first ashram experience that opened her mind to different cultures, ways of thinking and, more importantly, ways of being. She reflects that living in the moment opens her up to the vibrancy of colour, vitality of nature and vigour of sound. What brings her joy are dancing, riding her bike, relaxing in a hot bath and music. Her go to recording is Madame Butterfly by Malcolm Mclaren.

A key concept in the form of the yoga she practices is pandiculation - that is the contraction and relaxation of muscles regulating tension. Nicki is the conduit that releases dysfunctional muscular holding patterns that sustain chronic pain.

She and Brian also teach willow weaving. She loves every aspect of the cycle of cutting the willow which they grow at home, preparing it for the classes by soaking and grading and, depending on the thickness and size, creating a recipe for novice weavers to complete their baskets, trugs or lazy Susans. Her approach to learning a new skill is asking "what if it was easy" as a way to re-think and find alternatives to overcome initially being daunted by something new and unfamiliar. Willow weaving she says is not exactly peaceful as the rods wrap around the side stakes. As a counter Nicki chose the meditative music of Fast Forest, Prana features five wonderful tracks offering relaxing, somewhat melancholic journey that in the words of one reviewer 'opens up new worlds and

ideas, all through the expression of music, which transcends language barriers.'

She mused that modern life, full as it is of the vileness of some types of computer communication, the voracious appetite of profiteering capitalism and the sapping of vitality in conflict is speeding us towards chaos. Her flip side is a world of connectedness and empathy, making a difference, living by the kindnesses of small things. A verse in her choice of Style Council's You're the best thing sums up this philosophy.

I might be a king and steal my people's things

But I don't go for that power crazy way All that I could rule I don't check for fools All that I need is to be left to live my way.

Nicki and Brian's belief in sustainable living prompted them to open Surrey's first vegetarian restaurant, Frog Island, in Abinger. Catering had been in the family. Her Mum and Dad ran the Oak Cottage tea room in Shere (now Kinghams restaurant) and she had worked in a pizzeria in Farnham. The vegetarian venture lasted three years until the children came along. Her teaching approach was honed through her home schooling of Jaz and Kieran. "I followed the children" she says. Kieran was interest in formula one racing so we looked at the

countries where the races took place, utilised maths to discuss size, weight, dimensions of the cars. Not deliberately flouting convention, (and not having liked formal school much herself) she wanted to offer an alternative but also gave her kids the option of returning to mainstream school. They chose not to. Playing, reading and listening to music were all part of the curriculum. The James Family Band and Sting were favourites and perhaps Sting's album Journey and the Labyrinth was a presentiment of where Nicki's interests are taking her next into the realms of sacred aeometry.

A visit to the stunningly beautiful Cathedral allowed to experience the labyrinth. If you haven't heard of this, the Cathedral guide says "Neither magic sign nor physical phenomenon, the only energies found there are those that inhabit the men and women who walk through it – ready to let themselves be 'touched' by the grace of the moment. Its purpose? To lead intelligently to authentic meditation - lived both in body and mind. Those who choose to walk can open themselves, step by step, to what is beyond them."

Nicki has reached a stage of acceptance, hearing as well as listening and believing in being responsible for the choices she makes, rather than blaming someone else

Westcott Neighbourhood Development Plan (WNDP)



Thank you to the Village Forum members who attended the recent Westcott Village Forum meeting on 4th September. The results of the Community Survey and Surrey Community Action Housing Needs Survey were shared. Copies of these presentations can be viewed on the WNDP pages of the Westcott Village website or by using this link https://westcottvillage.com/wp-content/uploads/2025/09/WNDP-Forum-Meeting-4-04-Sep-2025-for-publication-v3.0.pdf

There was some super feedback and lovely words shared on

respondents' vision for the future of Westcott, as shown in the word cloud. The survey results also showed how much people value Westcott Garage, the Village Hub, Nisa Local and Westcott Food & Wine, Traffic congestion, speeding on the A25 and parking were all raised as issues and was also clear how much respondents value Surrey Hills All Saint Primary School, the village green, Cradhurst Recreation Ground, the Village Hall, Holy Trinity Church and the Cricket Ground/Sports Club. Living in a vibrant, thriving community is clearly much appreciated.

In addition to seeing the survey results, the Forum members were given a chance to review and comment on the draft policies for the updated Westcott Neighbourhood Development Plan (WNDP). There is still a lot of work to do on the plan and several stages of drafting and consultation to go through before it is ultimately ready to be put to a public referendum

where everyone in the Neighbourhood Area (the village and the immediate surrounds) will be given an opportunity to vote on whether they wish the plan to be adopted. The target for the referendum is May 2026 to coincide with when the Polling Stations will be open for the local elections.

Mole Valley launches a Community Governance Review.

A reminder that Mole Valley has launched a Community Governance Review to understand how local communities across the district are represented and whether changes are needed. They have launched a 12-week consultation and want to hear from residents, community groups, business owners and other neighbourhood groups. This stage consultation poses a number of auestions to draw out views on whether new Parish Councils should be created where they do not currently exist, such as in Westcott or whether existing Parish Councils should be merged or altered in some way. It also considers whether no changes are required and things should be left as they are.



The WVA welcomes this review as we are concerned that if Westcott remains unparished it could be more difficult to ensure our voice is heard on local matters that are important to our community in the future. The WVA is in favour of a new Parish Council being set up to represent Westcott and replace the WVA. A Parish Council has statutory powers and responsibilities that the WVA as a Residents' Association does not.

Parish Councils are democratically elected and this change will require people within the village to put themselves forward for election as Parish Councillors. This first stage consultation by MVDC runs until 5pm on 17 October 2025. To find out more and take part please use this link to the Mole Valley website https://www.molevalley.gov.uk/cgr

To the Last Man – the Dorking Home Guard:



autumn exhibition The Museum's opens on 16th October and tells the story of the men of Dorking and the villages who stepped forward to enlist in the 'People's Army' - later, the Home Guard - in 1940 to defend the nation. Facing what looked like a hopeless situation, at the time, poorly armed and equipped and often having worked a full day, then stayed alert, facing a very real threat and expecting to hold invaders at bay for a short time. They went from a poorly armed and equipped group of parttime volunteers to a trained fighting force protecting the local community and freeing up regular troops for front-line duty. The exhibition display includes uniforms, weaponry, medals, incident reports, photographs and other items of the period.

A Place of Safety: There is still an opportunity to see our popular summer exhibition before it closes on 11th October. It tells the stories of the various groups of refugees who have found refuge in the town over the

past two and a half centuries and their experiences – including those fleeing the French Revolution, the Kaiser's army, Nazi oppression, the Blitz and now, war and persecution in the Middle East. It features the work of the Dorking Refugee Committee and Ralph Vaughan Williams. Displays include a Dorking Nursery Scrapbook from the 1940s and dolls made by the WI in the 1970s of notable French emigres who found refuge at Juniper Hall.


Finally there are three opera screenings at the Dorking Halls – from the Royal

The Cost of Energy

2025 has seen the hottest spring and summer on record, with the Met Office declaring that another summer as hot or hotter is now 70 times more likely due to the climate crisis largely caused by greenhouse gas emissions from burning fossil fuels for energy. As we move into the autumn months,

thoughts turn to keeping our homes warm during the winter. The cost of electricity bills continues to be an issue of concern to the majority of the population, with prices three times higher than before the global energy crisis (triggered in 2022 by Russia cutting natural gas supplies to Europe due to their opposition to the Russian invasion of Ukraine).



Spoiler alert.... it is not due to 'green levies' or net zero policies. The continued high cost of our energy bills is largely due to the UK's continued reliance on gas-fired power stations to produce electricity. The UK operates a system whereby it ranks electricity generating technologies from the cheapest to the most expensive and calls upon them, in order of cost, to meet demand.

What is the reason for continued high electricity prices?

The last generator switched on to meet demand is gas in this example. Therefore the price of electricity sold in this trading period is set by the price of this gas generator.

The steps show there is no standard price for each fuel type. Different generators can bid different prices that are accepted in 'merit order' from lowest to highest.




