LIVING YOUR (BEST?) LIFE

One of the phrases that slightly irks me currently is the questions as to whether someone is 'living your best life.' I know it is well intended - we all aet one life, and we should reflect on whether we are making the best use of the tie given to us - but

can you hear the haunting pressure which lies behind the question? Are you living your best life – your one shot at true happiness the only life which will truly fulfil you? An idea which is turbocharaed by Instagram and TikTok for some, or a desire to keep up

with the Joneses for others.

To live life with this sort of selfabsorbed pressure hanging over you is a surefire way of finding disappointment. I hate to be the one to break it to anyone who believes otherwise, but life does not always go as planned. In fact, most/all of us are living lives which are not what we thought our 'best life' would be.

A group of us recently returned from the Westcott Church Weekend Away (it was excellent thanks for askina). Along with marvellous grub we had a couple of insightful talks from our

quest speakers.

In one of them we heard about the story of Daniel - he of Lion's Den fame. Daniel is a fascinatina character because we learn right at the start of his story that his life has not gone to plan. Daniel, welleducated and of a priestly class, was probably lined up for

a successful career in God's temple in Jerusalem, but then disaster strikes. His land is overtaken, his culture is lost, and he is forced into exile in a foreign land. He is not living his best life, and yet... Daniel's life in exile is marked by a willingness to trust God and to live fully and intentionally in the place and situations he finds himself in

He serves his foreign rulers with distinction, gains a reputation for administrative competence and integrity, and yet never compromises on what he believes to be morally right as he seeks to be faithful to God. Daniel never gets anywhere near to living some imagined ideal of his best life - but he does live his life to the full. There is an important distinction between the two. Jesus never says, 'I have come that people may be comfortable, content and selffulfilled,' but he does say that 'I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full' (John 10.10). Fullness comes not from living an imagined ideal, but by being fully present in the here and now - a fully alive human being made in the image of God!

November is often the month when we set aside time to remember as the winter evenings close in. We remember the ways in which life often does not entirely go to plan and reflect on how we are to live in response. Whether you join us to remember a loved one who is no longer with us at our service of remembering, or on Remembrance Sunday as we recall the horror of war and the price paid by those who went before us which paved the way to the freedoms we now enjoy, church is a space to reflect on what it means to live life as you find it - and to learn to live it to the full.

The DLHG continues its popular programme of both live and Zoom talks on a fascinating range of topics. These are free to members, but non-members are welcome. Upcoming dates include:

- The Battle of Rorke's Drift (Zulu War 1879) and the Dorking connection: Live talk by Ian Castle: the famous engagement with dogged determination shown by the defenders in the face of overwhelming odds the subject of the 1964 film 'Zulu'. Amongst the heroes was Colour Sergeant Frank Bourne, one of very few survivors, who later led a quiet life in Dorking until his death 80 years ago: Monday 3rd November at Crossways Community Baptist Church, Junction Road, Dorking RH4 3HB, 7.15 for 7.30pm, £2 at the door for non-members.
- Clandon and the Onslows: Zoom talk by Martin Ellis of Surrey National Trust. The Onslow family bought Clandon Park in 1641. Three members of the family were Speakers in the House of Commons and more recently, Sir Cranley Onslow was chair of the 1922 Committee. Owls, hooting and a hunting

the As nights draw in, Tawny Owls call out to claim their patch. Around now, younger owls are noisily making themselves hoping known, to muscle in and set up their own territory. But if other owls are close by, there's often a standoff

in the darkness, it's hoots before dawn. Listen out as the rival calls reverberate through the woodlands, mature parks and gardens throughout England, Scotland and Wales. The famous 'too-wit, too-woo' is actually a duet – the female making a 'toot-wit' (or more like a 'kerweeek') first note and the male answering with a long, drawn-out "too woooooo".

There are Short-eared Owls in the UK all year round, but now is a great time to see them as more join us from Scandinavia, Russia and Iceland to escape the freezing conditions further north. In winter the best places to spot them are during the day at our wetlands and coastal marshes, flying low over the landscape on the hunt for rodents. You often see more than one owl surveying the same area, slowly and silently scanning the long grass or marsh, ready to swoop down at deadly speed to catch their supper.


Murder on Westcott Heath August 1901

On a peaceful Sunday morning in August 1901 Mr Alfred Heaver was walkina across Westcott Heath accompanied by his wife, making his way to Holy Trinity Church at about 11 o'clock from his house. Holcombe Cottage (now comprising Pippacre, Middle House and Menawathen) when he was shot in the back by an assailant. They were making their way towards the church when a man leapt out of the bushes. He had a revolver in his hand, a shot was fired and Mr Heaver fell. The would-be murderer, not content with his dastardly act, approached the wounded man, levelled the revolver close to Mr Heaver's head and emptied the contents of the second chamber as he lay prostrate on the around.

The terrible tragedy had been witnessed by a garden lad named Arthur Grace, who ran down the hill and informed Mr Dixon who was making his way to the church. He then proceeded to summon Dr Royston Fairbank from the village. The noise of the shooting had also attracted others to the spot. The first to arrive was William Burrell and as he approached the prostrate Mr Heaver he saw the stranger running up the hill. He set off in pursuit but before he could overtake him, the man shot himself. This culminating act of tragedy took place about forty yards from where Mr Heaver lav. Meanwhile others had arrived and gave Mr Heaver what relief it was possible to render. Two members of the Imperial Yeomanry carried him back to Holcombe Cottage. There was not much to denote the extent of his injuries except for a streak of blood which flowed from the back of his head, but Mr Heaver was clearly in a most serious condition. Mr Heaver was a successful business man and was engaged in large building operations in Balham.

Until some time later the assailant remained where he had fallen, bleeding from the large wound in his head while his breathing indicated his end would not be long delayed. The man was taken in Mr Dixon's cart to an outhouse at the Crown Inn where he died at one o'clock. In the black bag the man carried were letters and papers which established his identity as James Young of Battersea, and Mr Heaver's brotherin-law. He was shabbily dressed in blue serge trousers, a black cloth coat and a bowler hat. He had been seen earlier coming over Milton Heath from the direction of Dorking so it is possible that he had come down by train.

The inquest on James Young was held at the Crown Inn. Ernest Young, a painter and decorator who lived at Clapham, identified the body as that of his father who was about 63 years of age. In response to questioning from the coroner, he said that his father was separated from his mother. He was not aware that his father had a revolver but knew that twelve years previously he had been charged with shooting a

man who had seduced his sister, but added that he had been acquitted when the trial took place at the Old Bailey. There had been animosity between his father and Mr Heaver because of financial assistance Mr Heaver had provided to his mother and sister. In addition to evidence from Arthur Grace, Joseph Hall (a miller), said that he saw Mr and Mrs Heaver coming from their house to the church and when he heard screaming he hurried to the scene, where he saw the deceased raise a revolver to his head and shoot himself. There were others who reached the scene of the crime and saw the assailant running away before shooting himself.

The items in the bag found on the deceased included 4s 9d in money and a large number of library tickets from the City of London and Battersea Free Libraries. The coroner observed that the books which he favoured were of a high character and not at all 'in the nature of penny horribles and trashy nature'. It evident that the was act was premeditated as the bag also held a revolver, cocked with four chambers loaded and a fearful looking butcher's knife. It was quite new and had been ground to a point and sharpened. The coroner noted that there were several letters in the bag signed by himself, including one to his wife. Dr Fairbank drew the jury's attention to the fact that the bullets of the cartridges used had been modified by boring a hole


in the apex to make them spread when fired and make a much more serious wound. Following the coroner's summing up the jury returned a verdict that the deceased had died from injuries inflicted by himself and that from the evidence he was suffering from hallucinations.

For the first few days, Mr Heaver, who retained consciousness throughout, made good progress but on the Wednesday he became weaker. Three eminent physicians from London attended and X-rays located the two bullets in his neck and back. On Thursday his condition became critical and late in the afternoon he passed away. A second inquest was held at the Reading Room and the coroner's jury heard similar evidence to that given a few days before but with more detail about the relationship between the two men. The jury unanimously reached a verdict of wilful murder against James Young. A large number of village people were at the graveside. At the hour of the interment the shops in the village were closed and nearly all the private houses had their blinds drawn.

Alfred Heaver born 10th February 1841 and died 8th August 1901 aged 60 years.





HOT WATER BOTTLE SAFETY



Hot Water Bottle Safety

This is a tip from the NHS. For a cozy and safe autumn, the NHS and safety experts recommend checking your hot water bottle for age and damage. Before the first use in Autumn and to avoid burns and leaks from degraded rubber, follow these steps before you start using your hot water bottle for the season.



- Check the expiration date. Hot water bottles should be replaced every two years, even if they look fine.
- Find the "daisy wheel". A date stamp, often shaped like a flower, is usually found on the neck or body of the bottle.
 - The central number is the manufacturing year (e.g., '22' for 2022).
 - The twelve segments represent the months. Filled segments indicate the month it was made.
- Inspect for wear and tear. Look for cracks, splits, discolouration, or brittle areas. Do not use the bottle if you notice any damage.
- Check for leaks. Fill the bottle with cool water, insert the stopper tightly, and turn it upside down to see if any water leaks out.
- In addition, never using boiling water, and always use a protective cover.

DORKING MUSEUM



To the Last Man – the Dorking Home Guard:

The Museum's autumn exhibition tells the story of the men of Dorking and the villages who stepped forward to enlist in the 'People's Army' – later, the Home Guard – in 1940 to defend the nation. Five hundred men living in the town and immediate neighbourhood offered their services – many without any military experience, often in full-time work – and many also volunteered



for other home front organisations. The 7th (Dorking) Battalion, Surrey Home Guard was commanded by Major Geoffrey Lane (see left).

The Dorking area was clearly identified as being of key strategic importance – for an invading force, the route to London from the coast ran through the Mole Gap and the town was also the operational headquarters for the Southern Railway, responsible for transport of troops and supplies across the south of England. The Home Guard was called upon to establish strongholds, secure sites to ensure public safety and guard aircraft crash sites.

Facing what looked like a hopeless situation, at the time, poorly armed and equipped and often having worked a full day, then staying alert, facing a very real threat and expecting to hold invaders at bay for a short time. They went from a poorly armed and equipped group of part-time volunteers to a trained fighting force protecting the local community and freeing up regular troops for front-line duty.

The feared invasion never came, so their skills were never fully tested. The Dorking Battalion gave a public demonstration of weapons and defensive techniques on the Nower before being stood down at the



Spiky Wanderers of the Night



Sporting around five to seven thousand dark brown spines made of keratin, with a lighter brown furry face and belly,

Erinaceus europaeus - the hedgehog - holds a place dear in our hearts, despite their prickly appearance! These nocturnal creatures, measuring around 20-30cm in length, spend much of their lives alone, except during the mating season. Travelling up to a mile each night, they are a welcome visitor to the garden - being partial to eating slugs and snails, as well as caterpillars, beetles, worms, they are a great help with pest control! You will likely be able to hear them snuffling around in the garden, if they are present, as they hunt out insects, fruit, berries, fungi and maybe occasionally a small vertebrates, such as a froa.

May is mating season. This is the only time the male and female come together. The female will give birth to around 4-5 hoglets after a four-week gestation. She cares for the hoglets alone, leaving the nest to forage and returning to feed her young until they are old enough to accompany her, to learn for themselves. Mature females may mate for a second time during the year, but this can leave these later hoglets short on time to put on enough weight to see them through winter

hibernation.

During the colder winter months from November to March hedgehogs hibernate in nests made from leaves and grass to conserve energy, often under hedges, sheds or in brushwood piles. As November is bonfire season, please do check bonfires for hedgehogs and other creatures before lighting! It is

preferable to relocate piles for burning to a fresh bonfire site.



Symbol of protection and resourcefulness

A clever trait is the ability to roll up into a tight ball of protective spikes, to defend themselves from danger. Many cultures therefore have seen hedgehogs as symbolizing protection, with their ball of spikes warding off danger and demonstrating the power of setting physical and emotional boundaries to protect oneself when feeling threatened.

Hedgehogs are also seen as a symbol of resourcefulness. They have adapted to live in urban settings and are now more common in urban than rural areas. Hedgehogs are opportunistic feeders with a varied diet and their heightened sense of sound and smell is well adapted to nocturnal foraging.

Feeding after dark means that they largely avoid human contact. Hedgehogs play a valuable role in ecosystems, through their insect control, their foraging behaviour which helps aerate soil and through contributing to biodiversity through seed dispersal via droppings and carrying them on their spines.

Yet, once a common sight, the British wild hedgehog, is now classed as 'vulnerable' to extinction in the UK. In the 1950s there were over 30 million of these endearing mammals in Britain, yet today they number fewer than 900,000. Populations in urban areas have declined by a third since 2000 and, even more alarmingly, in rural areas by a half.

Reasons for decline

As their name would suggest, hedgerows can provide a particularly favourable habitat for hedgehogs. Disastrously for hedgehogs, modern agricultural practices, which favour monocultures and use of huge machinery, have led to the loss of 50% of British hedgerows over the past



75 years. Additionally, industrialised agriculture frequently relies on repeated widespread applications of insecticides and herbicides on crop fields which has led to the degradation of soils and waters, destroying wildlife habitat and compromising nature's ability to support abundant life throughout the seasons.

Overly manicured parks and tidy, fenced gardens also represent a hostile environment for wildlife and our spiny friends, diminishing food sources, giving little opportunity for safe shelter and hindering their ability to move about to look for food and a mate. Although questions have been raised about the role of predation by other animals, such as badgers, this is not seen as a significant factor in hedgehog decline. These animals have co-existed for millennia, it is only now when human land management practices are having a detrimental impact on natural resources and a diminishing supply of common prey that threatens their natural balance.

Our changing climate poses further risks to hedgehogs. This year's hot, dry summer made it harder for them to dig for worms and other insects in the hard, compacted soil, with the lack of puddles to drink from, leading to the risk of dehydration. The severe decline in hedgehog populations has led to the UK's first National Hedgehog Conservation Strategy being published



at the start of 2025. This identifies the main threats to hedgehogs and suggests strategies of how to reduce them. After habitat loss and road collisions, unintended consequences from human intervention is listed as the number three threat. Well intentioned human actions to 'help' hedgehogs, can unwittingly cause harm.

Ways to help

Overall, the very best way that we can help hedgehogs is to stop harmful practices and to work with nature to recreate native habitats which support insects, their natural food sources and provide shelter.

- Don't use slug pellets these can poison hedgehogs too
- Don't use pesticides or harmful chemicals in your garden
- Encourage a plentiful supply of the hedgehog's natural food by creating micro-habitats that are perfect for invertebrates: stick piles; mounds of fallen leaves; compost heaps; and areas of long grass
- Create a pile with hawthorn twigs and deciduous leaves, particularly apple and cherry, suitable for hibernation
- In dry weather place a shallow saucer



of water on the ground to provide a drink. If you have a pond ensure that there is a shallow slope or plank to access as means of escape

We can also help hedgehogs with their nighttime wanderings by creating 'Hedgehog Highways'. This involves making a small opening - a 13cm x 13cm square is sufficient - in fence or by digging out a small tunnel underneath a wall or fence, lines to allow passage between gardens and beyond. Or, even better... replace fences with a native hedgerow! It is also helpful for building up a picture of hedgehog populations to log sightings. At present there are few hedgehog sightings logged in our area, so if you do see one please log it via one of the websites listed below. Or, if you prefer, let us know and we'll log it for you: info@greenwestcott.org.

If anyone reading this has an interest or knowledge to share on hedgehogs (or other species) and would like to get involved with specific projects please do get in touch. We are hoping to host a series of wildlife habitat workshops next year and welcome any help with this.
