IF YOU CAN WAIT AND NOT BE TIRED BY WAITING.....

Well a Happy New Year to you all. No, I haven't lost the plot (well not entirely anyway). November 30th is the first day of Advent which in the beginning of the Christian Liturgical Year. The Christian calendar doesn't begin with the excitement of the baby in a manger, nor the contemplation of Lent, nor indeed the shocking drama of Easter. It begins with a season of waiting.

Advent comes, apparently, from the Latin adventus which means 'arrival' or 'coming'. It focuses on a people desperately waiting for salvation to break through their despair. On a world longing for light to shine in the darkness. On a seemingly uncertain hope which people can cling onto when everything around them seems to be falling apart.

Now I appreciate this may not sound particularly festive – but that is sort of the point. It is not the happily ever after that makes the Rom-Com, nor the final victory of the hero against the odds which makes the

Action-Movie, it is the journey of the characters along the way which give meaning to the conclusion.

It would be easy to take a cheap shot here about mince pies appearing in the supermarket in September, but Christmas is a shared celebration in our culture for people of all walks of life, and I don't think it is the role of Christians like me to police how and what people celebrate. Also, we hosted Westfestivity at the Church in mid-November and it was a wonderful and joyous thing - so I could rightly be accused of hypocrisy. However, I do want to stake a claim, or perhaps make a plea, that amidst a culture of instant gratification and easily achieved dopamine hits we strive not to lose the art of waiting and anticipation.

I love Christmas – both the general festivities with all the trimmings and the Christian celebration of the outrageous claim that the creator of the world loves you and I enough to enter into the mess, pain, grief and shame of humanity to walk in our shoes. That you and I are worth enough for him to want to save us by stepping into the despair and darkness of the world to offer a glimmer of light. A flicker of flame.

As I anticipate the Christmas celebration in a world which is still waiting for salvation in the face of war, disaster, broken relationships, and countless ills, you will find me waiting on that seemingly uncertain hope that this brokenness isn't the inevitable conclusion of the human story.

WESTCOTT FELLOWSHIP COTTAGE TRUST

The Westcott Fellowship Cottage Trust is a charity established about 100 years ago using an initial endowment of £1000 from a Westcott resident called Mrs Alice Brooke. The purpose of the Trust was to provide an improved standard of housing for those in need - and this is still at the core of the Trust's objectives today. Currently the Trust owns sixteen properties in Westcott which are let to Beneficiaries with strong Westcott connections.

One of the sixteen, a three bedroom house on Parsonage Lane, will be vacant from the end of November. The property is in excellent condition and the Trust hope to make it available to occupy by a new Beneficiary quickly. Please note that Trust properties are offered with a 'Licence to Occupy' on terms set by the Trust. It is not a lease. The house comprises a living room, separate kitchen, three bedrooms and a bathroom, together with generous storage space and a front and rear garden. Given its size, the house is most suited to family occupation. It does not have step free access.

The Trust is now open for applications from prospective Beneficiaries of this house. Application forms can be requested in writing from the Trustees either by email to applications@westcottfellowship.org.uk or in writing to the Westcott Fellowship Cottage Trust, c/o St. Johns Free Church, Furlong Road, Westcott, RH4 3PP. Please include your full name/s, contact address and telephone number with your enquiry. Instructions for completing and returning the application form will be provided to Applicants by return, with more detail on the property – such as room dimensions - if required. All requests for an application form will remain confidential between Trustees and the Applicant.

Please note that the following criteria will be among those used by Trustees in assessing all applications:

- that an Applicant will have a strong association with Westcott and are preferably already living in the village
- the comfort and suitability of the Applicant's present accommodation
- the Applicant's current financial situation
- that the best use is made of the accommodation being offered by the Trust There is no 'waiting list preference' and all applications received by the deadline will be assessed. Applicants then shortlisted will be interviewed by the Trustees preferably at their current accommodation. The deadline for submitting a completed written application form is strictly 12 noon on 17th December 2025. If you wish to be considered as a potential Beneficiary, please contact the Trust

without delay.

Under the Mistletoe

Mistletoe – it's a semi-parasitic plant, meaning it grows on a host tree and feasts on its water and nutrients. Not so romantic, eh? While it's visible all year round, it gets its berries through October to May. Look up through the winter when the host trees have lost their leaves and you're most likely to see it in orchards, parks and gardens.

Good places to see Mistletoe include Wales, the West Midlands and the South of England. It is much rarer in eastern and northern England, and Scotland. While being poisonous to humans Mistletoe berries are an important food source for the birds below.

Mistle thrush: This bird is so named because of its strong preference for mistletoe berries. It helps spread the seeds by eating the berries and the seed often sticks to its beak or passes through its gut.

Blackcap: These birds, including migratory ones that now overwinter in the UK, are very effective at spreading mistletoe seeds. They eat the fleshy part of the berry and then wipe the sticky seed onto a branch, making it very efficient at germination.

Fieldfare and Redwing: These winter visitors are also thrush species that eat mistletoe berries, arriving in the UK from October.

WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP



The Great Chestnut Gathering

The enormous quantity of acorns and chestnuts that have fallen this year is due to a natural phenomenon called a "mast year," where the trees produce a huge number of fruits in a cycle that occurs every four to ten years. This year's bumper crop is likely the result of ideal weather conditions, leading to a massive yield. The previous mast year was 2020.




It has been the practice until recent vears for school children to collect conkers, the beautiful nuts which fall in large numbers from horse-chestnut trees every autumn. When threaded on to a string they provided the means to do battle to a similarly threaded conker of another child. But what possible use could conkers have been to the Ministry of Munitions during WW1? An announcement in The Times of 26th July 1917 provided a clue, but no solution; 'Chestnut seeds, not the green husks, are required by the Government for the Ministry of Munitions. The nuts will replace cereals which have been necessary for the production of an article of great importance in the prosecution of the

War.' In the light of some scepticism on the part of the children's parents greater justification for the conker gathering exercise was provided by the further statement that; 'For every ton of chestnuts, half a ton of grain can be released for human consumption.'

This was helpful but still did not explain exactly why the horse chestnuts were required. The Government was understandably reluctant to reveal the motive behind its scheme and so when a auestion was asked in the House of Commons the unhelpful answer given was simply that they were required for 'certain purposes'. It was not until over seventy years later that further references in The Times clarified what those certain purposes were. Dorking resident Edwin Sykes wrote to the Letters page noting that he had found a reference to the harvesting of chestnuts in the Log Book of Powell Corderoy School in Dorking but unfortunately nobody ever seems to have explained how, if at all, these potential munitions were used.

This resulted in many more examples of the widespread collection of chestnuts and several explanations for their intended use; the chestnuts were to be treated in some way to make a high-energy food for the poor horses which pulled the guns in all the mud, or they were to be calcined for use in the respirators issued to high-ranking officers. In fact, the real answer proved


to be that the Director of Propellant Supplies hoped to use the chestnuts to produce acetone, a key ingredient in the manufacture of cordite, the superior smokeless powder that provided a much more effective means to propel bullets and shells than traditional gunpowder.

Over 250 million shells were used by the British Army and the Royal Navy during the First World War. In 1914 the acetone needed to make the cordite with which they would be propelled was produced almost entirely by the distillation of wood, and the British demand was mainly met by imports from the United States. British manufacturing capacity was limited to small and antiquated plants and although a modern factory had opened in the Forest of Dean in 1913 its capacity was limited. At the outbreak of war the stock of acetone available for military use stood at only 3,200 tons, and it was evident that planned production could not meet the rapidly growing demand. A potential disaster was averted only when Chaim Weizmann, a Jewish professor working at Manchester University discovered how acetone could be extracted from maize. Later. when the German submarine offensive in the Atlantic was threatening to cut off supplies of North American maize, he perfected a method whereby chestnuts could be substituted for maize as an acceptable alternative source.

Following successful factory experiments

at the Synthetic Products Company's plant at King's Lynn, the Ministry of Munitions commenced the task of organizing the collection and transport of the 1917 horse chestnut 'harvest'. In practice the supply far exceeded the capacity of the Norfolk factory and although 3,000 tons of chestnuts arrived, contemporary reports refer to piles of rotting horse chestnuts being abandoned at railway stations across the country. The Dorking Advertiser encouraged the local conker collection by offering a £5 prize for the school or other organisation (such as the boy scouts) amassing the greatest amount. It was initially reported that Westcott and the Dorking British School were running neck and neck but when the final tallies were reported Mickleham carried the day with the with 2 tons 12 cwt, comfortably exceeding Westcott's not inconsiderable total of 1 ton 5 cwt. By the following autumn the end of the war was in sight, shipping in the Atlantic was no longer at risk and the chestnut gathering exercise was not repeated.

The horse chestnut mystery is now solved but there is a fascinating rider to the story. In November 1917 Arthur Balfour, the Foreign Secretary in Lloyd George's wartime government published the Balfour Declaration promising Zionists a national home in Palestine. 'His Majesty's Government view with favour the establishment in Palestine of a national home for the Jewish people, and will use their best endeavours to facilitate

the achievement of that object, it being clearly understood that nothing shall be done which may prejudice the civil and religious rights of existing non-Jewish communities in Palestine, or the rights and political status enjoyed by Jews in any other country.' These laudable objectives have proved to be disastrously incompatible with one another, but the declaration was a major step towards the objectives towards which prominent Zionists were working at that time.

7ionists Prof. One of those was Weizmann, Professor of Chemistry at Manchester University and Edwin Sykes notes that following correspondence in The Times he received a letter from a lady who wrote: 'My late husband told me that in 1917 Britain became short of TNT and Lloyd George sent for C.P. Scott, the Editor of the Manchester Guardian to seek advice about means of manufacturing such an important chemical. He knew we had no hope of winning the war, lacking TNT. Scott

approached my husband's cousin who was working as a research student and, together with the professor, found that TNT could be obtained from chestnuts. That year there was a large crop, and your schoolboys were therefore part of the saving force of Britain in the Great War. Weizmann was offered any title he fancied but refused, saying all he wanted was Israel for the Jews.'

Thirty-one years later, after the end of another World War, the British administration of Palestine came to an end; the new state of Israel was proclaimed, and on 10th February 1949 its citizens elected as their first President Chaim Weizmann, the man who had prompted the great chestnut gathering in the autumn of 1917.

CHRISTMAS ISLAND DISCS



Odette Forbes

You might have seen the Big Yellow Doa Bus around Westcott. That's driven by our castaway's husband, Tony. Odette's part of the business is dog grooming. Christmas in the Fobes household, like many of us, has its family traditions. Starting with the purchase of a real tree which occupies a corner in the dining room, Odette carefully unwraps her precious Christmas decorations inherited from her parents and grandparents, which includes the same fairy who has presided over festivities for more than sixty years. She is a bit battered says Odette, but Christmas would not be the same without her. Another joy is sharing a much loved video of Bill, Odette's son, who as a baby featured in the Salzburg Coca-Cola Christmas truck parade. The video with the soundtrack of A Beautiful Time by Tamee Harrison shows Bill dressed as a miniature Santa being held by a very authentic looking Santa Claus in the city's main square.

The first real Christmas Odette can remember was at the age of four and being mesmerized by the figures in the crib associating this with Away in a Manger. At school there were nativity plays and Odette, desperate to be Mary, was always destined to be an onlooking angel. She recalls being thrilled when in her final year of primary school she was chosen to do the opening reading for the carol service and recalls In dulci

jubilo (Good Christian Men Rejoice) and Adeste Fidelis (O Come All Ye Faithful) being belted out by herself and the rest of the school. Odette also remembers watching TV Christmas shows with her parents and seeing Bing Crosby in an amazing and unlikely duet with David Bowie. Bing sings Little Drummer Boy and David counterpoints with Peace on Earth. Its worth a listen.

Odette's career path followed first in the footsteps of her mum and then her dad. Having decided university was not for her she signed up for nurse training at The Middlesex Hospital in central London, thinking to assuage maternal disappointment after dropping out of her English degree course. Wearing the old fashioned nurses' pin striped uniform and starched apron, but not the frilly cap, she recalls her first Christmas Day working with the senior consultant carvina turkey and a nurse choir sinaina Silent Night. It was very moving to be able to give the patients some Christmas magic.

Having decided nursing was not for her she went back to her original plan of following in her father's footsteps in journalism with plans to progress into PR. She enrolled at the Pitman college in London to get her 100 word per minute shorthand and 120 words per minute typing and then took up a place at journalism college in St Leonards, East Sussex to gain her National Council for the Training of Journalists (NCTJ)

professional qualifications. Working for a local newspaper in Watford she covered the usual stories of 100th birthdays and Golden Wedding Anniversaries as well as court cases and local angles of national stories at the time such as the tragic Hillsborough Football disaster and the sinking of the Marchioness in the Thames.

She met Tony, her husband, in 2007, and their house in West Kensington become known as the home for waifs and strays as Christmases were more likely to rock to Waltzing Matilda as they took in the young Aussies and Kiwis working in the local pub to join their Christmas lunch. Having moved into PR Odette worked for several big High Street names including Safeway, Mothercare, Brook Street and Burger King with her last job as Head of Media Relations Nestle. Then came a big change. After the death of her father and hitting a birthday milestone she quit her job, thinking there's more to life than demanding PR schedules, constant travel and a difficult boss.

What to do? Whilst at Nestle she had led an initiative for workplaces to allow employees to bring their dog to work and had herself experienced great difficulty in finding a groomer to prep the dogs for their photo shoot for the launch. Abandoning the very short lived idea of managing a pet cemetery, she decided she would rather work with living dogs and enrolled at Merrist Wood College to obtain City and Guilds

Qualifications. She is now a dog groomer extraordinaire. The French connection is apt because she was named after Odette Sansom, the Resistance heroine. after her parents had seen a film about her starring Anna Neagle. Like her namesake, our Odette has resilience, stamina, is patient, flexible, and creative, able to deal with all the different canine personalities in a calm unflustered manner. And she loves it, having seen many dogs from their beginnings as puppies to making their endings as comfortable as possible. Often she and the dogs sing along together as they go through their 90 minute routine of wash, dry, cut and trim finishing with a photo of a beautifully coiffured dog sporting a ribbon tucked through their collar.

So as Christmas season approaches, the family will settle down to watching a favourite film, White Christmas and of course The Holiday and listening to A Fairy Tale of New York and Last Christmas, munching their advent calendar treats, cheese for her, chocolate for Bill and pork scratchings for Tony! There'll be a Christmas Day drink with neighbours in the pub and an afternoon walk for their dogs, Timber and Ronnie. Very traditionally Christmas ends on 12th Night, Epiphany, when the tree comes down and the fairy is carefully packed away.

There is still a lot of work to do, including a review by a government appointed planning inspector, before the plan is finalised and then put to another public consultation this time run by Mole Valley District Council. Ultimately the

final document is put to a public referendum where all those on the electoral role in the Neighbourhood Area (the village and the immediate surrounds) will be given an opportunity to formally vote on whether they wish the plan to be adopted. The target for holding the referendum is May 2026, to coincide with the Polling Stations being open for the local government elections.

DORKING MUSEUM



The team at Dorking Museum offers warmest seasonal greetings to all readers and to the supporters and friends of the Museum. If you are in the town, why not drop into our shop for some Dorking themed cards, books or gifts? Or simply to take a leisurely browse around the Museum. Please note that the Museum will be closed over the main Christmas/New Year period (check website for dates).

To the Last Man – the Dorking Home Guard: The Museum's autumn exhibition tells the story of the men of Dorking and the villages who responded to the call by Anthony Eden, Secretary of State for War, to enlist in the 'People's Army' – later, the Home Guard - in 1940 to defend the nation. Five hundred men living in the town and immediate neighbourhood offered their services - many without any military experience, often in fulltime work, and many volunteering for other home front organisations.

The 7th (Dorking) Battalion, Surrey Home Guard, commanded by Major



Headquarters at the Old Fire Station

Geoffrey Lane, a veteran of the Boer War and First World War, was initially headquartered at the Old Fire Station on West Street (later at the Drill Hall). A defensive line of concrete pill boxes and anti-tank obstacles stretched across the south, especially in the Dorking area, protecting the Mole Gap route towards London and the operational headquarters of the Southern Railway, responsible for transport of troops and supplies across the south of England. The Home Guard was called upon to establish strongholds, secure sites to ensure public safety and guard aircraft crash sites.

They faced what looked like a hopeless situation, at the time, poorly armed and equipped, often having worked a full day, then staying alert, facing a very real threat and expected to hold invaders at bay for a short time. Local units were trained for hand-to-hand fighting and told to take no prisoners.



In December 1940, Brockham village featured in War Office propaganda photos designed to reassure the public that the defence of the nation

was in the hands of well-equipped men. They went from a poorly armed and equipped group of part-time volunteers to a trained fighting force protecting the local community and freeing up regular troops for front-line duty.



The feared invasion never came, so their skills were never fully tested. The Dorking Battalion gave a public demonstration of weapons and defensive techniques on the Nower before being stood down at the end of 1944, having proved its value throughout the war. The exhibition display includes uniforms, weaponry, medals, incident reports, photographs and other items of the period.

WESTCOTT VILLAGE HALL UPDATE



You may well have heard this already, but on behalf of the Trustees of Westcott Village Hall we are very pleased to report that at a meeting held on 5th November 2025, MVDC's Development Management Committee passed a 'Resolution to Grant' planning permission for the demolition of the Hut (to be replaced with 9 small houses) and for the rebuilding of Westcott Village Hall. So we are almost there, but not quite.

The decision, as is normal, is subject to conditions, one of which is an agreement being reached between MVDC and Westcott Village Hall Trust CIO, ensuring that the proceeds of sale of the Hut site can only be applied in rebuilding the hall at Institute Road. This reflects the permission granted by the Charity Commission back in 2022, when the two former separate charities were merged. Our immediate goal is to get this agreement formally documented.

The Trustees want to acknowledge and express thanks to MVDC's Planning Officers, who recommended approval of the application to the Development Management Committee. We are also grateful to the many residents of the village who wrote to the planners expressing support for the application and for the presentation made at the meeting by Nick Lund on behalf of Westcott Village Association, outlining the benefits which the redevelopment of both sites will deliver to the entire village.

Just in time for Christmas, we are a very important step closer to two significant improvements to the centre of our village and we look forward to pushing this project onto the next stage in the New Year. We will continue to provide project updates to the community in the village magazine and on our website.

Oh Christmas Tree

For centuries around people the world have been decoratina homes and temples with boughs and branches from evergreen trees as a symbol of endurance and



ongoing life. At a time of year when winter has stripped many branches bare, bringing evergreens inside reminds us of the hope of the spring to come, when greenery will return to the outside world. As Christmas approaches many of us will be hanging up wreaths and bringing in trees as a key part of the festivities.

It is estimated that around 6-8 million real Christmas trees are bought in the UK each year. It takes around 10-12 years for a Christmas Tree to grow 6ft and during that time it will have been absorbing carbon and providing a home to wildlife - albeit this depends upon growing conditions and pesticide use. The Soil Association recommends looking for trees that are Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) certified, ideally organic and locally grown. Choosing a potted tree with roots means that there will be less dropping of needles and, if looked after carefully outside during the

summer, it can be brought in year after year.

Bringing a Christmas tree into your home has many positive wellbeing and health benefits. It is a focal point for festivities and gathering round. Decorating the tree with others is a tradition that strengthens connection and creates lasting memories, boosting emotional wellbeing. A

Christmas real tree provokes the beauty and tranquillity of nature. its presence can bring a sense of calm, amid what can often be a busy time of year,



with its gentle aroma acting as a natural stress reliever.

Fresh trees also release phytoncides
- compounds which possess
antibacterial and antifungal
properties. These protect trees from
harmful microbes and pests and have



benefits for human health too. If you are unable to, or prefer not to, have a real Christmas tree, there are plenty of creative alternatives using greenery and natural or

everyday objects, to add a festive touch to your home.

At a time of year when much time is spent indoors, due to cold weather and dark evenings, elements of

indoor greenery can help maintain a connection to nature that is good for mental and physical wellbeing. When Christmas is over, the beauty of natural decorations is that they can be

recycled or repurposed easily. If possible, cut up your tree and other natural



decorations to add to a compost heap or use as a mulch to suppress weeds. Fir tree needles make a great mulch for acid-loving plants such as blueberries. Alternatively, you can recycle your tree at Dorking Community Recycling Centres.

Here are some startling Christmas statistics for festive trivia:

Only 1% of all the purchases made for Christmas will remain in use six months afterwards. It is estimated that Brits waste £700 million on unwanted gifts. Choose wisely!

An estimated 6 million rolls of Sellotape are purchased each December – this causes a problem with recycling as it is non-recyclable. Opt for brown paper tape instead which is recyclable and can be torn by hand – available from Westcott Village Hub.

Around 40 million Christmas crackers are pulled and discarded on Christmas Day and 99% of people throw their cracker gifts in the bin at the end of the day. Simple home made crackers made with old wrapping paper or scrap paper with an edible treat inside are a great alternative.

Brits consume around 370 million mince pies over the Christmas period – please remember to recycle the aluminium cases they come in, in your areen bin.

Approximately 42 million dishes worth of Christmas food are thrown away in the UK each year, including 2 million kg of cheese. Use your food caddy to discard any inedible leftovers and vegetable peelings (unless you compost them at home). One caddy of food waste can produce enough electricity to power a fridge for eight hours, or a television for two hours.


