

#### **FASHIONABLY OUT OF DATE**

Ever nostalgically kept an item of clothing at the back of the wardrobe only for it to come unexpectedly back into fashion? I've even heard a rumour that flared jeans made a comeback recently so well done to

you if you kept hold of a pair from the 70s - you are bang on trend. Or perhaps you have heard of the 100 vear rule baby for names? That names formally associated with older folks become fashionable again once they hit the

great-grandparent stage (all four of our children's names fall into this category I believe).





Part of the challenge of writing these magazine articles is that I have to pen them a month before the magazine comes out. What references will

> hopelessly appear out of date by the time you read them? What local, national international situations will be on people's minds that I have entirely failed to comment on, due to the fact that they have yet to happen as I sit at my keyboard.

Thankfully some ideas never ao entirely out of date - even if they drift in and out of fashion in the academic worlds popular and as the decades drift by. There are themes I can return to like a broken record (incidentally, a great example of what should be an out of date idiom if it were not for the retro return of vinyl) believing them to have a relevance for the lives of the people of Westcott, and indeed in the strange wide world beyond the village boundaries.

So, let me begin 2026 with themes I refuse to leave behind:
I believe that you are a being of

eternal significance. I believe you (and I) muck things up – relationships, projects, nature, you name it. I believe in a God who created a complex evolving cosmos so that He could have a relationship with those creatures He created in His image that dwell therein. I believe this God is complex - beyond the absolute comprehensions of the greatest human minds and the most advanced AI - but He chooses to make himself known in ways finite minds can grasp and grapple with. Most probably the latter. But I will keep seeking, all too imperfectly, to live and speak them out regardless – as this Jesus has transformed my life, and I believe He is the one who offers the hope the world is seeking. So I'll begin 2026, as indeed I will end it, fashionably out of date.





#### Feast your eyes on Fieldfares

The Fieldfare is a winter visitor to the UK and is a member of the Thrush family. This is the largest thrush seen in the UK and is distinguished from others by its grey head and yellow bill. Like Redwings, these birds are also seeking food and shelter in a warmer climate, flying in from Finland, Norway, Sweden, Russia and Eastern Europe to spend the winter here. They have a fast-paced 'chack, chack, chack' call which is likened to chuckling. Should cold weather persist and berries dwindle, Fieldfares may be tempted into gardens with pieces of apple and other fruit.


## Westcott Rifle Range and the Rifle Range Halt

In June 1915 the South Eastern and Chatham Railway Company completed the construction of a small station almost midway between Dorking and Gomshall. It had two 400 feet platforms, 9 to 12 feet wide with ramps and fenced approaches, and was located just west of the tunnel serving the footpath leading from Coomb Farm to Ranmore. It was partially destroyed by fire in 1928 and never rebuilt. There is no sign of its existence today, nor did its existence have any effect on the development of Westcott. It was too far from the village and in any event the railway stop was exclusively for use by soldiers and was known as the Westcott Rifle Range Halt.

A range had existed in the locality since at least November 1889, when the Rt Hon George Cubitt (later the first Lord Ashcombe) signed an agreement with Captain Harman Young, Officer Commanding 'G' Company 2nd Volunteer Battalion (Queens) Royal West Surrey Regiment, permitting targets to be set up in part of a field on the Denbies Estate near Landbarn Farm, with firing points established at a distance of 100, 200 and 300 yards.

The plan accompanying the agreement indicated the location, and the detail (less the 100 yards

marker) was subsequently included on the 1891 edition of the Ordnance Survey 25 inch map.




Extract from 1891 OS 25 inch map showing rifle range

The agreement restricted shooting to just one day between the 1st November and 1st March, and on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays from 2pm until sunset, plus one whole day that shall be mutually agreed upon, between 1st April and 30th October. The agreed rent for this use was one shilling per year. In 1909 the agreement was amended to apply to the new Surrey Territorial Force Association but a few years later, following increased use before and during the Great War and the introduction of more powerful weaponry, the Landbarn range was



abandoned. It was replaced, in 1916, by a much larger 'War Office' range occupying almost 50 acres. This was constructed a few hundred yards to the west, much closer to the new Rifle Range Halt. The butts were built against the scarp slope of the North Downs and supported at least nine targets, as illustrated on the previous page.

In the post war years the range, and the nearby Halt, continued to be used. In April 1922, for example, the Dorking Advertiser reported that 300 officers and men of the East Surreys 5th Battalion spent a day firing at the Westcott Range. These were territorials but with the approach of the Second World War the range was also used by regular troops, and during the war by the Home Guard.

After the war national servicemen and cadets practised at the Westcott Range and in July 1948 the War Office sianificant extension, proposed a embracing much of Ranmore Common, to create a military training area of nearly 900 acres. The local Planning Officer objected on the arounds that the land formed part of the North Downs Preservation Scheme and the proposal was withdrawn, as was an amended scheme submitted a year later that involved 320 acres. Although isolated, the noise generated by the range evidently travelled across the Holmesdale Valley, especially when machine gun training was introduced in October 1954. Mr J Moody of Stowe Cottage in Balchins Lane, Westcott, protested to the local authority, but the Clerk to Dorking Council was able to reply that the matter was out of his hands; "The rifle range is in War Department occupation and is outside town planning control".

New butts and a range warden's workshop were constructed between 1956 and 1959 and these were accompanied by the introduction of new byelaws requiring a sufficiency of warning signals and specifically 'Firing in Progress' notices to give adequate warning when the area was closed to the public. However, the use of the new facilities was short lived. Problems arose when the 'stop butt', cut into the side of the hill, started to slip, and then the concrete and brick

mantlet crumbled so badly that a 'low shot' bullet actually went through and caused a slight injury to one of the target markers. In the light of this evidence, the cessation of National Service, being aware that there was a public footpath nearby, and that for long range events it was necessary to fire across the railway line, the War Office decided that the range was no longer required. It closed in June 1962 and cattle from Coomb Farm were permitted to return to grazing from which they had been displaced 50 years earlier. The butts are still in place but much of the brickwork has collapsed.

In addition to military use, the range was used by the Westcott Rifle Club and from 1954 until 1958 (less 1956 when the range was closed for repair) it was the venue for teams from other Surrey Rifle Clubs who competed for the Westcott Cup. That competition continues to be held each year, organised by the Surrey Rifle Association, but the venue is now the National Rifle Association ranges at Bisley.

Jeff's dog's name might give a clue to our castaway's former profession. Called Enzo he shares this with the Italian motor racing ace, Enzo Ferrari. As a shortened form of Vincenzo, meaning conquering or victorious, this is actually rather apt as Jeff was a highly successful racing car driver. Jeff won many of the races that he competed in and was often placed on the podium.

His proudest win was with former formula one world champion Denny Hulme when, at Silverstone in 1986, they came first in the Tourist Trophy, Britain's oldest automobile race. Jeff has a lovely story about their triumph. The winners were announced as Denny, then Jeff, but the former champion graciously conceded that his teammate deserved the accolade as he had done most of the driving. Jeff commented that theirs were the last names added to the original trophy's base which then had run out of space.

Born and brought up in Epsom, Jeff's early competitive spirit found an outlet in swimming. He remembers paying the old sixpence as entry into Epsom swimming pool and he excelled in the medley, consisting of the four disciplines of breaststroke, butterfly, backstroke and freestyle. He also trained at Cystal Palace

and competed in championship races. Clearly racing was in his blood as was his love of cars. His grandfather ran a taxi service, memorably taking punters up to the Derby, whilst father Ray established Allam's of Epsom in 1952. Young Jeff recalls his Dad's first workshop where he carried out repairs in an unused undertaker's shed at the back of their garden. Jeff crawled under the fence to get into a magical kingdom of spanners, wrenches, car parts and the heady aroma of engine oil. He was hooked.

Progressing from go-karting club racing he turned professional in 1980. Determination and confidence in his natural ability he said driving came easily. Interestingly he observes that effective racing relies not on aggressive driving but on being at one with the car, letting it run smoothly. Liking driving to Motown and Reggae, the louder the music the faster the car. Regularly hitting 165 miles per hour, the 200 mph Le Mans was just about his limit. Racing all over Europe, Japan, Australia and New Zealand he said it was just great being paid for his hobby, he would have done it for nothing.

Jeff's approach to his disc choices befits his character. He is a man of the moment and selected music that he likes rather than songs that have a particular memory. If he hears one

of these on the radio he would turn it up to listen rather than put on a CD. His picks reflect the glory days of the 1980s and 90s, resonating with his victorious racing years.

All-time favourite and the one he would save is The Chain by Fleetwood Mac, famously associated with the introduction to the BBC's F1 broadcast. He chose Kate Bush's Running up the Hill as he loves her voice and several other picks were from concerts he went to: Flvis Costello's A Good Year for the Roses and M People's Moving On Up. Its only Rock and Roll by the Rolling Stones was from a gig he wanted to go to but didn't make. Perhaps Meatloaf's Bat out of Hell and Tina Turner's Simply the Best do have echoes that mirror his racing career, whilst Pulp's Disco 2000, and Bryan Ferry's Love is the Drug reveal the simpatico side of his temperament.

Jeff drove saloon cars known as tin tops as they had a roof, not like the more open Formula One cars. Achieving not a little fame, Jeff warrants an entry in Wikipedia. A colleague mischievously added that Jeff collected fridge magnets and as a consequence he was sent or was given over 50 from all parts of the world.

partner Maddie's insistence that a cat flap fitted to the back door had been satisfied. By then he had retired from professional motor racing and was managing several garages in Dorking, Leatherhead and Epsom. He sold the remaining of his garages last year.

After his racing career he became the driving standards advisor for the British Touring Car Championships which had become "too much crashing and bashing". Order having been restored he retired from this role in 2021. Enjoyment now is walking his beloved dog and his competitive spirit is exercised through his enthusiasm for padel. Sunday afternoons watching the motor racing allow him to reflect on his 50 years in the business. He has many mementos but keeps only one in view, a black and white photograph of his British Touring Car which was so far out in front it's the only one in the picture.

He has time for reading now he is equipped with new glasses. The book he would take with him to his desert island is the 1980 to 2000 Touring Car Book to recall the great times of racing. and his luxury item, a pair of binoculars.

#### **Dorking's Dinosaur Legacy:**



The Museum's first new exhibition for 2026 opens on Thursday 22nd January and celebrates Dorking's contribution to the developing understanding of the wild life that roamed the area 125 million years ago. At that time, the Dorking area was part of a vast tropical river delta with swamps, sand flats and lagoons that extended across much of what is now South-East England and the Isle of Wight. Extreme seasons and changing conditions resulted in the evolution of amazing species and the Wealden clay has yielded much of the dinosaurs that evidence evolved

A discovery by fossil enthusiast Bill Walker in a quarry near Ockley in 1983 provided evidence of a previously unknown dinosaur species and led to the recognition of a new aroup of specialised fish-eating dinosaurs. The creature was given the scientific name Baryonyx walkeri in honour of its finder and provided the key to understanding more fragmentary remains of similar dinosaurs that were being unearthed on other continents.

The almost complete fossilised skeleton found by Walker – and dubbed 'Claws' by the media at the time – Is now on display at the Natural History Museum. Four decades on from the discovery, two new Baryonyx cousins have been found in the cliffs of the Isle of Wight, and maybe other unknown species are still down there in the clay.

Historians believe that the idea of New Year's resolutions, in one form or another, dates back more than 4,000 years. They say the Babylonians, one of the first cultures to actually celebrate the changing of the year, made promises to pay debts or return borrowed objects.

In Spain the tradition is to eat one grape at each stroke of midnight to bring good luck throughout the year.

It's traditional to eat *toshikoshi soba* in Japan, a dish with buckwheat noodles served hot or cold. The long noodles symbolize longevity, and the buckwheat plant represents resilience.

In Turkey, pomegranates are symbols of abundance. and those who want a good year will smash the fruit on their doorstep. The more pieces and the farther they go, the better the year will be. For a little extra luck, sprinkle a little salt in front of the door to bring peace.





Vasilopita or other cake is eaten for dessert in Greece, and it has a coin baked into it. Whoever finds the coin will have good luck for the next year.

In Scandinavian countries, they do something similar with rice pudding, served either at New Year's or Christmas. One portion will have a peeled almond in it, and whoever finds it in their bowl is assured of luck in the new year and might even win a prize.



#### Time is Ticking



I recently read a book called *Raising Hare* by Chloe Dalton. This book was one woman's account of her experience of raising a leveret that she found near her home. Her journey through this process was extraordinary as she aimed not to domesticate the leveret, but to raise it to reintegrate it into the wild once it was old enough to do so.

Through this process she was able to observe things about this animal, previously unseen or witnessed by humans and debunk some of the misinformation about this amazing animal. Previous information about hares and their habits was severely lacking and most was inaccurate. Over a number of years, she witnessed the secret life of hares and their behaviour.

One thing she noticed was the way that hares, like many of us, are creatures of habit. Following patterns of when they eat, sleep and forage for food. The hare would leave the

house at set times during the day and return like clockwork. I'm sure many of us have noticed birds visiting our gardens at certain times each day and how badgers will do the same and follow certain specific tracks on their nocturnal nightly wanderings.

This got me thinking about how we, as humans, also have routines. We leave the house in the morning for work at the same time each day, we eat and drink at regular moments throughout the day and generally go to bed around the same time. With the changing of the clocks in autumn, I wondered about how many species of wildlife had continued to follow their routines of leaving their burrows, sets and lairs, to go about their daily routines and how, when something changes in their world, there is an impact.

contribute to mortality rates outnumbering reproduction rates and, therefore, making populations vulnerable. One million animals are killed each year in the UK due to roadkill. The top 5 species affected and recorded in a study by Goodwin (2024) shows general roadkill rates as the following, between 2013 – 2024.

- 1. Badger 16,529
- 2. Pheasant 11,715
- 3. Fox 10.837
- 4. Hedgehog 8,554
- 5. Rabbit 7,201

There is also an increase in deer strikes by 14 times in the weeks following the clocks changing noted in a study by Cunningham et al (2022). Our wildlife is vulnerable to human activity causing habitat loss and to the consequences of climate change.

Our actions continue to challenge our wildlife and how they move amongst us. One study by Raymond et al (2021) showed by that in 1951 there were 4.2 million vehicles on the UK's roads. By the end of 2016 this had increased to 37.3 million. Coupled with this, the overall length of the road network increased from 184,000 to 246,500 miles over the same period. Not only does the road network expansion take land from the wildlife, but it cuts across territorial areas isolating creatures off from mating partners and essential food sources.

#### **Human vulnerability**

The impacts on human life are also affected by these subtle changes to our routines, with one study showing an increase in car collisions by 11% on the roads following the changing of the clocks (Roberts, 2024). We share our planet with the other creatures who live on it. As we sit at the top of the food chain it makes no sense to ignore the impact we are having, not only by reducing the land available to wildlife, but the other periodic changes we impose which impact them further. We need to recognise that all actions have consequences, not only for ourselves but for the other beings that inhabit our planet.

The damage we are doing to the planet not only impacts ourselves but the delicate ecosystems that are essential to our survival. Biodiversity - the variability among living organisms from all sources underpins all life on Earth. Biodiversity loss is occurring at an alarming rate, with recent estimates showing that species extinctions are currently 10 to 100 times higher than the natural baseline. This is largely due to human activities like deforestation, habitat fragmentation, and climate change, and yet we continue to act as if these delicate systems are secondary to our advancement. We rely, for our own existence, on the balance of



We are all part of nature and to ignore this, is to do so at our peril.
